On August 20, 2020 Governor Whitmer signed House Bill 5913 into law as Public Act 149. Section 98a states that in order to receive state aid for 2020-2021, districts must provide for instruction under an extended COVID-19 Learning Plan (“Plan”) that has been approved by an intermediate district or authorizing body. The Plan does not replace the District’s/PSA’s COVID-19 Preparedness and Response Plan, it is an additional plan that includes new assurances and sections on educational goals, instructional delivery, grading, and equitable access. PA 149 does not apply to districts that operate as a cyber school.

ADDENDUM TO PROVIDING SUPPORT TO STUDENTS - The following changes were made to the COVID-19 support plan based on the vaccine being offered, test positivity rate under 5%, and changes to the CDC guidelines. Changes or additions to the original plan and addendum #1 and #2 are highlighted in yellow

Students will have the option to select online or face to face instruction. Teachers are responsible for providing both types of instruction for children assigned to their classrooms. **The Instructional Plan** slide deck will help provide a framework to assist this process. **We will slowly begin to increase the capacity of our K-8 classrooms. We have now set the class size limits to approximately 75% of fire code capacity. We are offering our special education and 504 virtual students the opportunity to return to school first. If space is available more students may be added as long as safety, cohorting, and social distancing are possible.**

9-12 - Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday (7:50-2:45)

- ❑ Utilizing a hybrid format with two days face to face and three days online. Cohorts A/B will be created.
- ❑ **With changes to the CDC guidelines and the vaccines that are currently available to our staff, we will increase classroom capacity and move our most at-risk students into a model where they are receiving instructions 4-4.5 days per week. We will begin with our special education and 504 students. We will then offer more face to face instruction for our seniors and freshman at risk of losing credit. Then we will continue to add students in a way that remains safe AND meets the academic, social, and emotional needs of our students.**
- ❑ Wednesday will be a virtual learning day for all students unless they require additional support. Arrangements will be made for students to attend these sessions.
- ❑ The student schedule will resemble a block schedule allowing for deeper dives into learning, so students are not spread thin with seven classes each day.
- ❑ Instruction will be based in Google Classroom so moving between phases is easier.
- ❑ Career Center students are expected to attend face to face instruction at the career center five days a week. During a student's online days, afternoon bussing will be available to get the student to the career center, so bussing will be provided five days a week.
