The following presentation outlines the after school clubs available at Linwood. Clubs are from 3:15-4:15 on Tuesdays/Wednesdays.


Each club will have a slide with information about the club and the day it meets.


There will be a Google Form at the end to apply for membership into clubs. *If you are interested in Student Congress, please use the Google Form on the Student Congress slide.




Open to 5th and 6th Grade Orchestra Members motivated to learn some more advanced music and skills.








Linwood School Anti-Bullying Pledge


