#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Preston called the meeting to order with a reminder that the mission of the Board and Lawrence County Schools is *Every Child College and Career Ready; A Community Involved and Informed.* He led *The Pledge to the United States Flag.* 

#### 2. APPROVE AGENDA

Approval to amend the agenda to include additional items, <u>3.A. Horizon Award Presentation</u> and <u>5.D.2.k. Annual contract for legal services with board attorney</u>, passed with a motion by Mr. James See and a second by Ms. Garnett Skaggs by a vote of 5 to 0.

#### 3. STUDENT/STAFF PRESENTATIONS/RECOGNITIONS

Dr. Fletcher led a moment of silence in memory and respect for Charles Russel Osborne, who had served Lawrence County Schools and students in the past as a janitor at Louisa West Elementary.

#### 3.A. Horizon Award Presentation: Dr. Jeff Hawkins, KVEC Director (added to agenda)

Dr. Jeff Hawkins, Director of Kentucky Valley Educational Cooperative (KEVC), presented Superintendent Fletcher with KVEC's Horizon Leadership Award. He stated that after Lawrence County joined KVEC, it quickly became one of their lighthouse districts, and they appreciate Dr. Fletcher serving as KVEC Chair for this current school year. "We have 22 school

districts from Ashland down to Bell County. He led the organization extremely well during what was a turbulent year, and we want to recognize him in front of you." Dr. Hawkins read the inscription on the Horizon Leadership Award prior to presenting it to Dr. Fletcher. "For Pioneering efforts as Chairman of the Kentucky Valley Educational Cooperative Board of Directors and for leading educational innovation, maintaining a commitment to all learners, and creating a lasting legacy of educational excellence built on an indelible contribution that will continue to transform schools, minds and hearts across the Commonwealth." Dr. Fletcher stated that it was an honor to be nominated by the 21 other districts and it was great to work with other superintendents. He reaffirmed that it was a turbulent year "...but I saw a group that wanted to work together for the betterment of kids. It was a great honor to take part and to be the Chair of KVEC, one of the leading cooperatives not only in the state but in the nation."

## 4. COMMUNICATION

## 4.A. Superintendent's Update

#### 4.A.1. Personalized Learning for Teachers (Conference & Micro-credentials)

In an effort to make professional development more focused on individual needs, the district is organizing a conference for and by Lawrence County teachers and staff as one of the 18-19 Flexible Professional Development Days. Teachers will be able to choose sessions throughout the day that match their Individual Professional Growth Plans.

#### **4.A.2. Personalized Learning for Students**

Personalizing learning for students will be strategically implemented in Lawrence County Schools over the next three years. Dr. Fletcher thanked Chief Academic Officer Cassandra Webb for her research over the past six months and for her facilitating Central Office work and sessions with principals on personalized learning. Drawing from information from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, the district's model of implementation will focus on four pillars: learner profiles, personal learning paths, competency-based progressions, and flexible learning paths. "Our goal is to build such a relationship with students that we know how to direct them to achieve their goals."

## 4.A.3. Vision Statement for Board Review for Special Board Meeting

A draft vision statement with a focus on personalized learning will be discussed at the upcoming special end-of-year board meeting. Discussion will center on how the vision for personalized learning fits into our district's vision. Dr. Fletcher thanked Dr. Webb for her research and leadership on this project. "She's done a great job facilitating the work of our group."

#### 4.A.4. Special Board Meeting Date- June 27 @ 5:00 PM

As is customary, an end of the fiscal year special meeting will be held to close out the year and to conduct the annual superintendent evaluation. The special meeting is set for 5:00 p.m. on June 27 at Lawrence County High School.

## 4.A.5. Annual Principal Calendar Development

An interactive electronic calendar with due dates and monthly information is being developed to assist principals and Central Office staff. Dr. Fletcher stated that the idea was brought to him by Dr. Webb, Mrs. Colvin, and Mrs. Hall in order to streamline communication and processes. It will essentially become a roadmap for the school year.

## 4.A.6. Local Planning Committee Update

Feedback from KDE on the Facilities Plan is currently being addressed, and the plan will be submitted again to KDE. Dr. Fletcher noted that the process has taken much longer than anyone had thought.

#### 4.A.7. KASA/KASS Conference for July 25-27

Dr. Fletcher stated his appreciation for the board's support in his participation in both the Kentucky Association of School Administrators (KASA) and the Kentucky Association of School Superintendents (KASS). He will be attending conferences July 25-27.

Noting that he is completing the final two weeks of his first four-year contract with the board, Dr. Fletcher stated that he is taking a vacation before beginning his second term.

Dr. Fletcher stated that there were increases but also areas to work on. Classroom Tier 1 instruction must improve. RtI must address the individual needs of students. Building relationships, setting goals, and communicating the goals to parents need improvement; and progress monitoring needs improvement - reacting to the data more quickly. "The big push moving forward will be on building relationships with students." Dr. Fletcher stated that he anticipates that with the upcoming new Accountability System, we will receive "a lot of raw data for students". Other discussion centered on the current assessment platforms being used in the district to obtain data, measures of proficiency, and how assessments correlate to students being on grade level.
