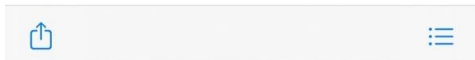


Softball Schedule

This holiday is supposed to celebrate Jesus but so many people have perverted the holiday to which all the people don't really celebrate Jesus, they just throw a party for fun.

Kings Cake



King Cake involves a pastry, a small plastic baby (which represents Jesus), and a party. The King Cake is baked with a small plastic baby hidden inside, the person who gets the slice with the baby in it has to host the next party.

The King Cake is thought to have started in France, where the original King Cake was named after the three kings of the Bible that visited the baby Jesus on the 12th night of Christmas, January 6th.

In France, the cake is made of puff pastry and frangipane (almond cream). It's still an incredibly popular dessert there, served throughout the month of January, closely associated with the religious feast of the Epiphany. A local bakery in France can sell up to 1,500 cakes in the month of January alone!

By the time the tradition came to New Orleans from French immigrants in the 18th century, it had morphed into an enriched brioche bread cake.

Bakeries in New Orleans started selling them for Carnival season, which began at the end of January 6th and went through Ash Wednesday (six weeks before Easter and the beginning of Lent). By the 20th century the tradition took off and king cakes were all over New Orleans.

What do Mardi Gras Colors Represent?

The Mardi Gras colors are purple, gold and green but what do they mean? The Symbolism of Colors gave these colors meaning in 1892. Purple represents justice, green represents faith, and gold represents power.

The exact origin of the official Mardi Gras colors has been lost to history, but tradition holds that visiting Grand Duke Alexei Alexandrovich of Russia was given the honor of choosing the colors in 1872 when he toured the United States. New Orleans was struggling to get back on its feet after the Civil War, so city officials saw an opportunity to capitalize on the Grand Duke's visit by entertaining the visiting royal while attracting crowds to the city. Even if the Grand Duke did actually choose the official Mardi Gras colors, it is doubtful that any special meaning was initially assigned to the colors. More than likely, the colors were picked because they created a visually appealing combination. In any case, the colors' meanings were not formally revealed until 20 years after the Grand Duke's visit with the 1892 "Symbolism of Colors" parade theme.

Purple - Justice

Purple, which symbolizes justice in the Mardi Gras color scheme, is also a highly symbolic color in Catholicism. Not only does it represent Christ's passion and suffering before his crucifixion, it alludes to his royal position in the kingdom of heaven. Purple is the liturgical color for the Lenten season and appears on priests' vestments and church banners throughout Lent.

Green - Faith

Green is considered a holy color in many religious traditions. In Catholicism, green is the liturgical color for the time between Epiphany and the beginning of Lent and symbolizes renewal and the belief that the faithful will be rewarded with everlasting life through Christ.

Gold - Power

Aside from its obvious monetary connotation, gold has special meaning within the Catholic church. Gold is reserved for high holy days such as Easter and Christmas because of its celebratory brightness and as a reminder of God's presence.

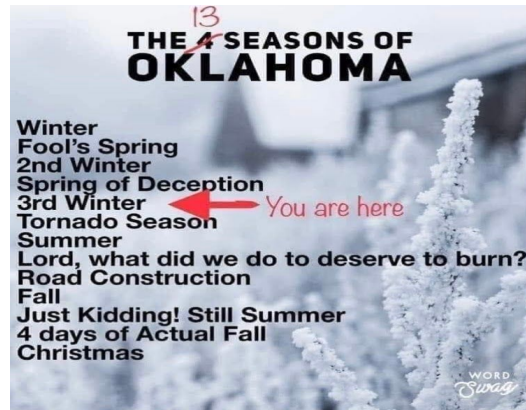
Jazz in New Orleans

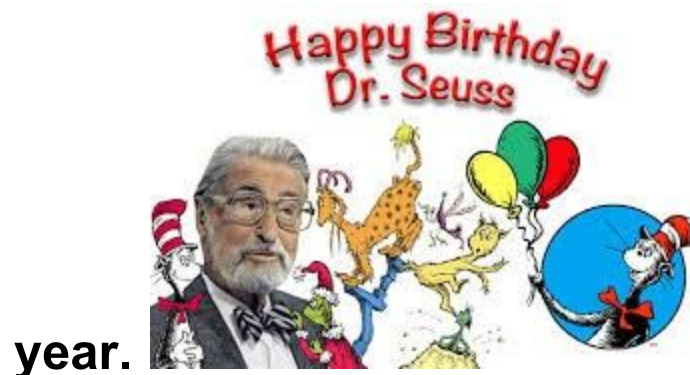

foods before Lent begins. Today, Mardi Gras season in New Orleans is a time of merry-making and festivity.

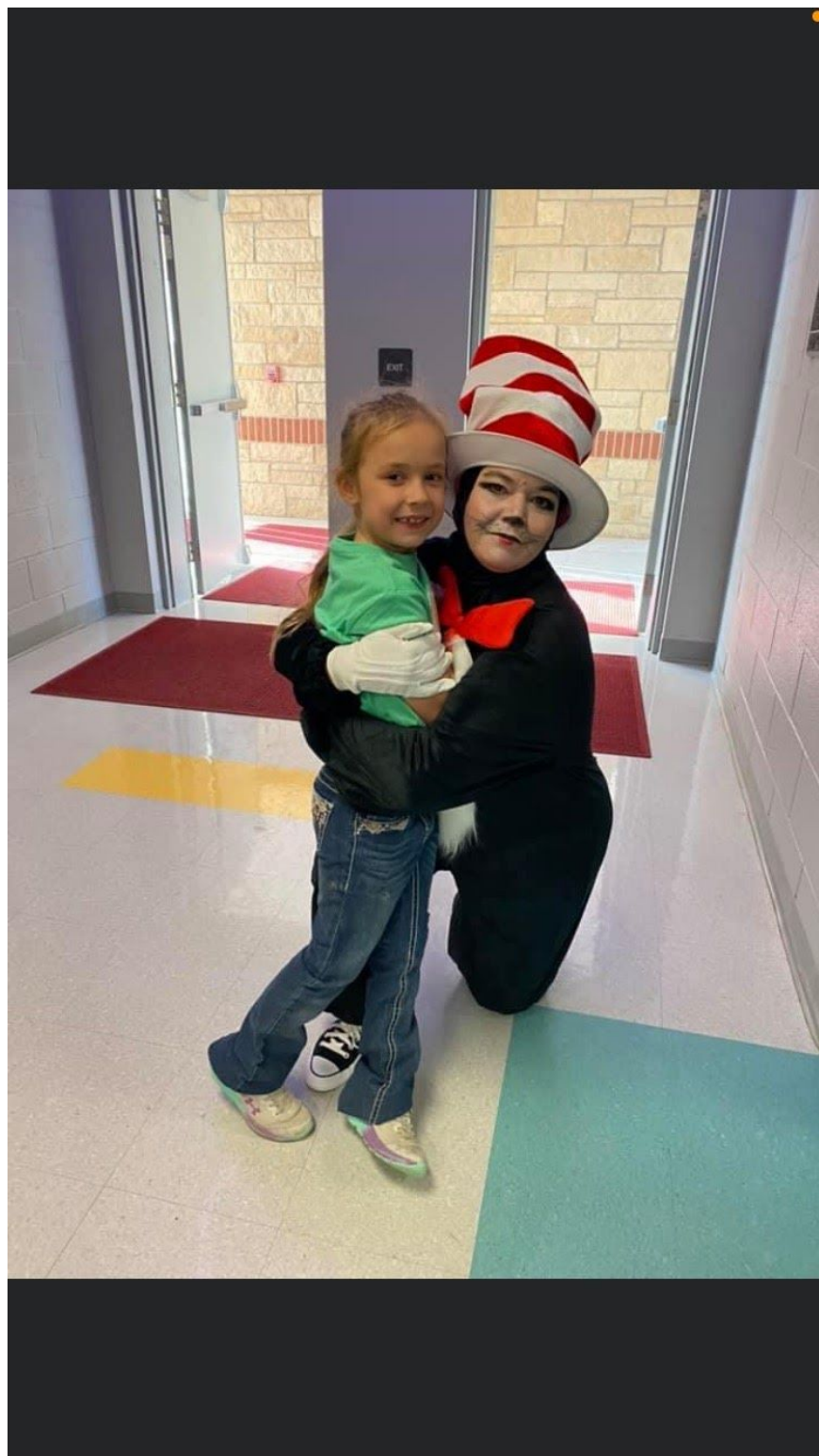
Dr. Seuss Week
