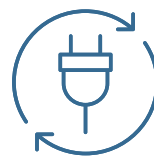


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Student Opportunities



College Credit



Students enrolled in programs at the Mercer County Career Center have the opportunity to earn college credits in multiple ways:

NOCTI

NOCTI (National Occupational Competency Testing Institute) provides a variety of assessments or Standardized tests for students studying in career and technical programs. NOCTI is the largest provider of industry-based credentials and partner industry certifications for career and technical education (CTE) programs across the nation. Seniors who achieve a qualifying score on their NOCTI test can earn college credits.

STUDENTS OCCUPATIONALLY AND ACADEMICALLY READY

The Pennsylvania Department of Education supports career and technical education students by aligning their high school courses to a college program in order to complete a degree, diploma or certificate. SOAR programs articulate skills and tasks gained at the high school level to course credit earned in a postsecondary degree, diploma or certificate program.

LOCAL ARTICULATION AGREEMENTS

Mercer County Career Center partners with local post-secondary institutions to develop formal articulation agreements. These agreements award college credits based on successful course work completed at MCCC.

How Can Career and Technical Education Students Earn Free College Credits?

- Enroll in one of MCCC approved CTE programs.
- Maintain a 2.5 grade point average in your technical courses.
- Achieve competent or advanced standing on the End of Program Assessment (NOCTI, etc).
- Complete a competency task list at Proficient or Above.
- Earn industry certificates where available.
- Successfully apply to the college of your choice that offers your Program of Study.



Cooperative Education

WHAT IS IT?

Cooperative Education is a structured method of instruction combining school- based classroom learning with productive work-based learning in an occupation matching the student's academic and career objectives.

Student learners work under the guidance of a training supervisor in their field of study. Employers pay the student at a wage rate no less than the Federal minimum standards.

TARGET AUDIENCE

In order to be eligible for the Capstone Cooperative Education Program the student must be currently enrolled in one of the programs offered at the Mercer County Career Center .

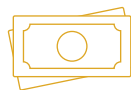
Recommended by their instructor after exhibiting initiative in the field, good work ethic, along with regular and dependable attendance.

DIVERSIFIED OCCUPATIONS

The Diversified Occupations (DO) program combines classroom instruction with on-the-job training that aligns with the career interest of high school seniors. This unique program furthers the Mercer County Career Center's partnership with business and industry to foster the skills needed for today's workforce. This experience is designed to integrate classroom study, focused on 21st-century skills, coupled with planned supervised work experience.

Career competencies and hands-on skills are developed at the job site under the direction of designated supervisor. Related classroom theory is offered through a hybrid model of instruction at MCCC and online. Maintaining employment and class attendance is essential to the successful completion of the course requirements.

THE DO PROGRAM IS DESIGNED TO

- Provide training in a career and technical area not presently being offered at MCCC or the sending high school.
- Provide training for students who need an alternative form of education to meet their unique needs.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS

- Be supervised on-the-job by a cooperating employer on a one-to-one basis.
- Be visited on-the-job, at least once every 30 days by the Diversified Occupations coordinator.
- Attend scheduled instruction and complete all required academic coursework.
- Be employed at least 15 hours per week during or after school hours.
- Must be employed 150 days to be considered completers and receive credits.

Instruction in the DO program encompasses the competencies necessary to succeed in today's world-of-work. Learning activities based on career planning and development are generated through hybrid instruction. DO programs shall be planned in accordance with the student's stated career objective.

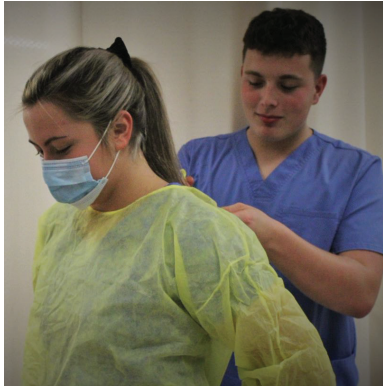

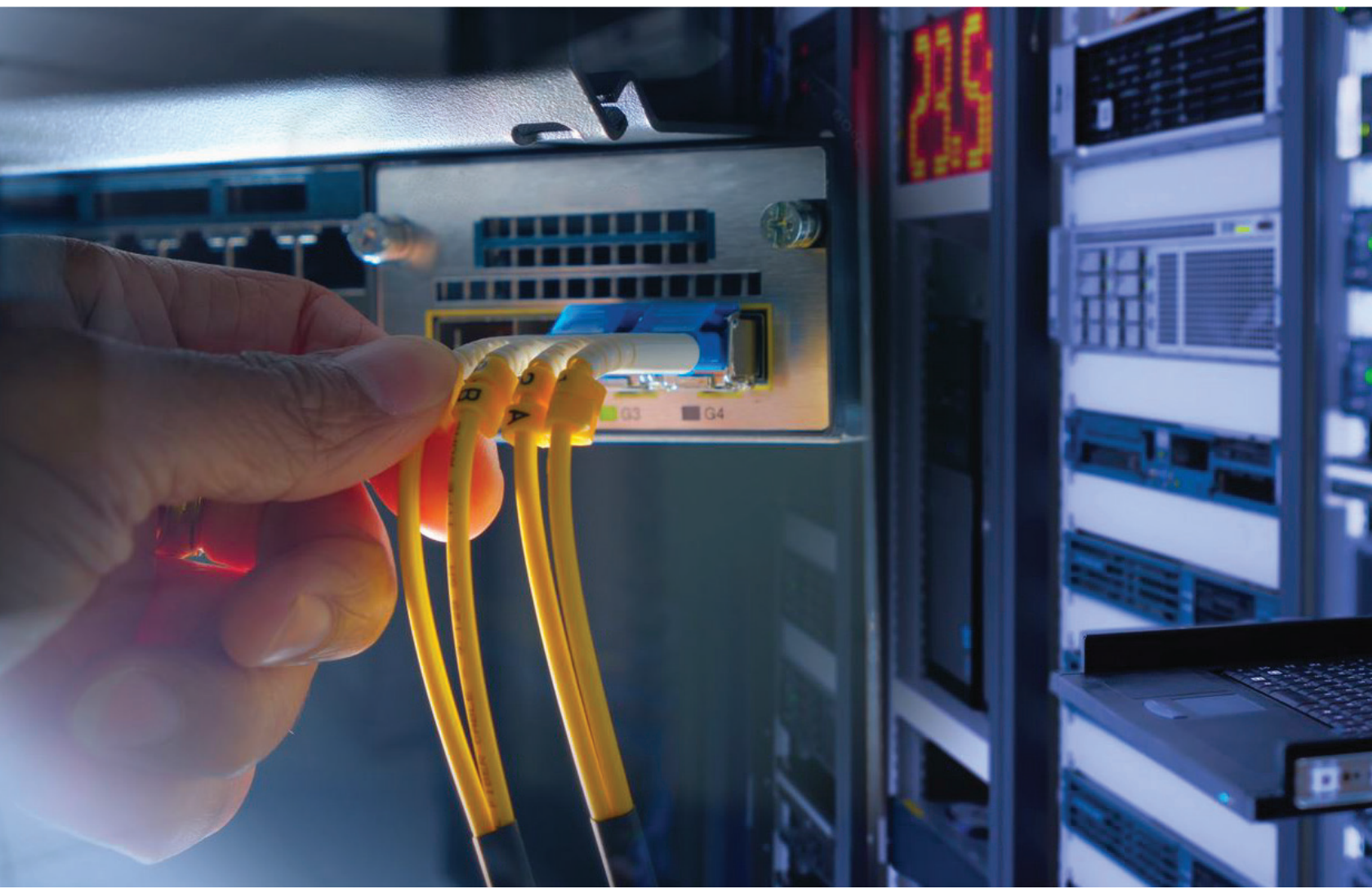

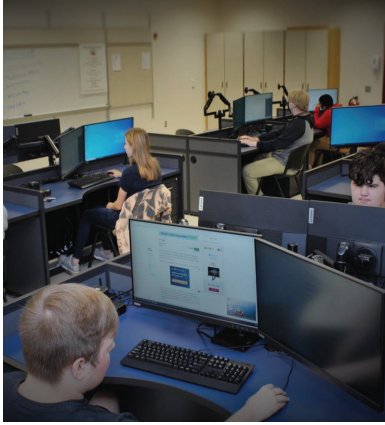

ELECTRICAL OCCUPATIONS

The purpose of an Electrical Occupations program would be to prepare students to apply technical knowledge and skills necessary to install, operate, maintain and repair electrically-energized residential, commercial and industrial systems, and DC and AC motors, controls and electrical distribution panels. Instruction emphasizes practical application of circuit diagrams and use of electrical codes and includes blueprint reading, sketching and other subjects essential for employment in the electrical occupations. Reading and interpretation of commercial and residential construction wiring codes and specifications, installation and maintenance of wiring, service and distribution networks within large construction complexes are also critical components of the program.

MERCER COUNTY CAREER CENTER OFFERS PRE-APPRENTICESHIP FOR ELECTRICAL OCCUPATIONS PROGRAM

What is Pre-Apprenticeship?

The United State Department of Labor Apprenticeship USA defines a Pre-Apprenticeship as “a program that is designed to prepare individuals to enter and succeed in a Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) or other job opportunities.”

A pre-apprenticeship program plays a valuable role in providing work-based learning to help students prepare for a RAP. While Pre-Apprenticeship programs have varied designs and approaches, MCCC’s program includes approved curriculum, hands-on experiences, and facilitated entry into a RAP that may last weeks or months and may include wages. Like earning college credit, pre-apprentices earn credit toward a RAP, ultimately saving the apprentice and employer time and money toward completing the full registered apprenticeship program.



WELDING



The welding program focuses on the instruction of many industry-specific types of welding, and cutting techniques. Students will learn Stick, Mig, Tig, and Flux-Core Welding. Also, students will receive instruction in Plasma and Oxy-Fuel cutting of metals. Blueprint reading and welding symbols will be taught so students can learn to produce real-world products and parts. American Welding Society standards are integrated into this welding curriculum.

Students will split their time between the classroom and shop to learn the skills necessary to enter the workforce as well as have an opportunity to earn industry leading certifications from PPG and I-CAR. Students will learn to repair collision damaged vehicles to pre-accident condition, refinishing and custom painting, shop workflow and time management, along with soft skills that are essential for employment.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

HOW DO I APPLY IF I AM INTERESTED IN A PARTICULAR PROGRAM AT THE MERCER COUNTY CAREER CENTER?

Students who have an interest in attending Mercer County Career Center should contact their sending school counselor; who will work closely with the Mercer County Career Center to facilitate the enrollment process. There are a limited number of students accepted into a program to allow for individualized, high-skilled instruction. To be considered for enrollment, students should have their application on file at the Mercer County Career Center as early as possible.

AM I ABLE TO APPLY TO THE MERCER COUNTY CAREER CENTER IF I ATTEND A PRIVATE, PAROCHIAL OR ARE HOME-SCHOOLED?

Yes, you will need to contact the office of the school district in which you reside to obtain enrollment procedures.

HOW WILL ATTENDING MERCER COUNTY CAREER CENTER (MCCC) HELP ME?

The education you will receive at the Mercer County Career Center will open doors for you. You will learn new skills that are valued by employers. You will experience real-life work situations in your chosen career field, and you will have options to continue your education after high school. Mercer County Career Center programs are designed to prepare students of various ability levels to enter jobs in technical and skilled occupations. Most of the students who complete a MCCC program find employment in their area of study or further their education in college or technical schools. Employers are eager to hire MCCC students because they have gained hands-on skills and experience and need minimal training. Additionally, students will have the opportunity to earn industry certification(s) that gives them the edge when seeking employment.

IS COLLEGE/POST-SECONDARY AN OPTION AFTER ATTENDING MERCER COUNTY CAREER CENTER?

MCCC graduates continue their education in colleges, technical schools, or apprenticeships. MCCC programs provide practical experience to compliment students' academic interests. Almost every program at MCCC offers students an opportunity to earn advanced credits through agreements with the Community College and several other educational institutions.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I START IN ONE PROGRAM, BUT DECIDE THAT I PREFER A DIFFERENT PROGRAM?

Planning for a career should begin in elementary school. Guidance Counselors work with students to ensure their interests match their career goals in the middle school levels.

By the time students make a decision to come to Mercer County Career Center, most of this planning has taken place. To be eligible for many certificates, students have to be in a program for two years; however, program changes can be made on a case-by-case basis.
