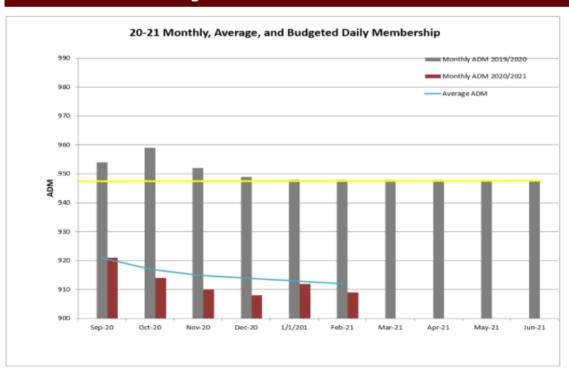

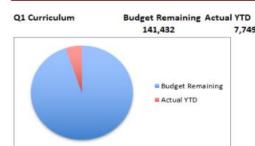

Q1 Staff Development



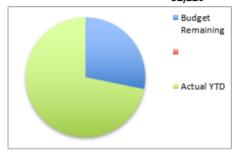




ISD 108 Promise to Voters
