Annual Audit Review by Andrew Parente of Lerch, Vinci and Higgins

The Audit presentation was given by Andrew Parente, Partner of Lerch Vinci and Higgins. He explained the audit was issued an unmodified opinion, which means the district financials are fairly stated. He reviewed the fund balance and reserve accounts. The audit contained three general comments which are the least severe of recommendations that the auditors will give. Trustee Cummings asked for an explanation of the third comment which is to obtain vendor proposals to compare to state contract amounts (when purchasing through coops).

B. Discussion - any item on Consent Agenda - Board of Education Only

Trustee Moldt asked about the Bridge Year to which Mr. Burke explained it is a new law allowing seniors to remain in high school for one additional year, due to COVID. The student must have met all graduation requirements by the end of their regular senior year and the student must not turn 20 years old during the Bridge Year. Trustee Klein stated that the deadline was short notice, also the program encouraged spring sport participation, but not fall and winter. Trustee Klein asked about the information given regarding the high school Chiller. A discussion ensued among the Board members. Trustee Gorfin asked about Finance #6, final payment to Tremco, to which Dawn Delasandro explained that the entire cost was paid by insurance, except the \$5,000 deductible. Trustee Klein asked for an explanation of Policy 1649.

BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Villani asked for a moment of silence for Carmella Ferrito and described her accomplishments and dedication to her work. President Villani publicly thanked Tom Schillaci and the custodians for the excellent snow removal at all three schools. President Villani congratulated Dawn Delasandro and her staff for excellent Audit results. She thanked Mary Ann Gallivan for her donation to the scholarship fund.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Burke credited Ms. Delasandro on the Audit and thanked Mr. Schillaci on the superb snow removal. Mr. Burke wants to save the last built-in snow day. He thanked Erik Roth for the video that Erik prepared regarding his role as the Director of Curriculum; Mr. Burke stated that this position is essential. The Diversity and Inclusion Committee formed a sub-committee for Professional Development for staff, which will meet tomorrow night. Mr. Burke thanked the town for broadcasting Varsity games, but would like to have Freshman and JV games broadcast also. At the Bergen County Superintendents meeting it was stated that educators should have access to vaccines soon. The staff continue to do a fantastic job.

PUBLIC COMMENT - ANY SUBJECT

Citizens may address the Board of Education on any item not listed on the agenda. Citizens will give their names and addresses when recognized to speak. A time limit of three minutes per person and a total of 30 minutes for all communications are allowed. Large groups are urged to select someone to represent them.

David Spelbrink, commented that in his daughter's 1st grade class, 7 of 14 children are positive for COVID. He believes a review needs to be done to determine why there was classroom spread. Mr. Burke hopes that all of Mr. Spelbrink's family is recovering. Mr. Burke has been speaking with the medical professionals at the county and state levels and has reassessed the school's procedures. This scenario is why we need to continue to be diligent. Mr. Burke believes that cohorts will be in place through September of 2023. Trustee Cummings asked about outside activities with the 1st grade students. Trustee Klein asked if the school's processes change due to the large number of positives cases. Mr. Burke replied no, the same protocol is in effect, along with the same reporting and quarantining. Mr. Burke believes that at some point the school may be sporadically testing students. Bernard Yoo, asked if there is something between shutting down the school and following the usual process. He specifically asked about ventilation and air circulation. Mr. Burke replied that air circulation is key, the recommendation is to keep windows open, but there is no 3rd quarantine option. Barbara Costa asked if a child has had COVID and travels out of state, is the 14 day quarantine still necessary? Mr. Burke replied yes, because the child can get COVID a second time and can still be contagious.

Bernard Yoo asked about the 2/10/2021 Winter Wellness offered by the HSA to which Trustee Klein replied that it was for the Middle/High School families due to limitations on numbers in Zoom meetings. Kathleen Gerber thanked Tom Schillaci and the custodial staff for doing a great job in snow removal and an amazing job in cleaning all year long.

TRUSTEE COMMENT

Trustee Odashian asked about wellness programs for children. Mr. Burke is working with Michelle Blanco and other schools brainstorming ideas. He understands that children are not coming to school because they don't want to quarantine. Trustee Klein suggested a mental health hot line and wellness programs.

Trustee Gorfin asked about declining enrollment in the school. Mr. Burke is seeing the enrollment declining across the county. A previous demographic study showed enrollment at a plateau in 2020, however, today, a family with 7 children enrolled. Online Kindergarten enrollment is at 48 students in the first week. Trustee Cusick felt that 1st grade may grow more since Kindergarten is not required by the state and families may have kept young children home this year. Trustee Gorfin stated that Bridge Year students will need to be factored into enrollment.

8. WAIVER OF REQUIREMENTS-SPECIAL EDUCATION MEDICAID INITIATIVE (SEMI) PROGRAM

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, that the Cresskill Board of Education hereby authorizes the Chief School Administrator to submit to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools in the County of Bergen an appropriate waiver of the requirements of NJAC 6A23A-5.3 for the 2020 - 2021 school year.
