MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Preston called the meeting to order with a reminder that the mission of the Board and Lawrence County Schools is *Every Child College and Career Ready; A Community Involved and Informed* and then led *The Pledge to the United States Flag*.

2. APPROVE AGENDA

Approval of agenda with the addition of a fundraiser, **5.D.3.a.3. Louisa Middle School**, passed with a motion by Mr. James See and a second by Ms. Maddelene Roberts by a vote of 5 to 0.

3. STUDENT/STAFF PRESENTATIONS/RECOGNITIONS

3.A. Fallsburg Elementary Presentations

Fallsburg students performed sign language to a song illustrating a skill they are developing in order to better communicate with a classmate and artwork was on display on an easel. In addition, the Board and audience were entertained by Fallsburg students, Zach and Savanna Wright who played instruments and sang. They are part of the bluegrass group, First Time Around. Dr. Fletcher thanked the students for their presentations, noting that they will receive certificates of appreciation from the Board and that it would be hard to find talented students like we have anywhere across the state. He also praised the staff and volunteers who helped organize the Board's visit to Fallsburg.

4. COMMUNICATION

4.A. Superintendent's Update

4.A.1. New Principal at Fallsburg Elementary

Mr. Stuart Cook was introduced as the new principal of Fallsburg Elementary and welcomed by Dr. Fletcher and the Board. Dr. Fletcher reviewed the selection process and praised the SBDM members for their commitment and their long hours. He noted that thirty-seven applications were reviewed and six interviews conducted resulting in Mr. Cook's selection and that Mr. Cook has great success at his former school based on state assessment scores. Mr. Cook thanked the teachers and staff for welcome and work in hosting the Board. He stated that on this first day spent at Fallsburg, "It is very evident the initiative the teachers and staff take in caring for the students of Fallsburg. I spent time with the students in the classrooms. There is a lot of pride here at Fallsburg, and I want to continue that tradition; and it feels great to be back home."

4.A.2. Teacher Academies and Principal Academies

Modeled after other successful programs across the state including Pike County and East Carter, the first round of Teacher Academies has been held with positive feedback. Every teacher in each grade level meets for three hours to determine needs and share information and strategies and plan how to move forward. Dr. Fletcher noted that this is part of flattening communication across the district, having all teachers sitting around the table working for what's best for our students. He applauded Ms. Webb and Ms. Moore for their leadership with NISL and in preparing for upcoming work in Principal Academies.

4.A.3. State Testing Results Release Dates: Staff - September 29; Public-October 1

Once teachers sign confidentiality agreements, testing results can be shared with them on September 28th, and data is available to the public on October 1.

4.A.4. Read 180 update

Dr. Fletcher noted that he is excited about the opportunity Read 180 will afford our students. Students have had a positive response to the program that is targeting the one-third of our students who are at least two years behind grade level in reading. The Board has evaluated how money is spent and approved \$70,000 for 150 students to participate in Read 180.

4.A.5. Go Math textbook update

Through re-purposing funds, the Board has been able to purchase math textbooks K-12. Now the challenge is learning how to use the resources, especially the electronic ones available. Dr. Fletcher is currently setting up nine hours of professional development for teachers on the new Go Math series.

4.A.6. SIG application submitted

The School Improvement Grant has been submitted which is about 198 pages and requests about \$1.4 million. Dr. Fletcher indicated that the grants will hopefully be awarded in November, and that even if the high school comes out of PLA status, they will still be eligible for grant funding.

4.A.7. Diagnostic Review vs. Sustainability Plan options

As part of exiting the PLA designation, the high school will be undergoing a Diagnostic Review in November. The district will also either undergo a Diagnostic Review or be allowed to develop a Sustainability Plan which would outline how we would assist the high school in continuing the progress it has made.

4.A.8. New Commissioner announced by KBE

Dr. Stephen Pruitt has been chosen as the next Commissioner of Education in Kentucky and is slated to take office on October 16. Dr. Fletcher discussed his former accomplishments and noted that he had worked with Kentucky on the science standards.

Note: Mr. Jim See, as a member of the KSBA Board of Directors, extended a personal invitation to board members and Dr. Fletcher to attend the upcoming Fall Regional KSBA Meeting.

5.E. High School Football/Track Drainage Improvements

5.E.1. Approval of draft contract with ECSI, pending KDE review and approval, passed with a motion by Ms. Garnett Skaggs and a second by Ms. Maddelene Roberts by a vote of 5 to 0.

Tim Murphy of Murphy, Graves, Trimble discussed the process for addressing the drainage problem on the Lawrence County High School track field. He explained that the funds for the project are coming from the balance of the high school renovation project and that as a long-

time partner with Lawrence County they are offering their services free of charge. They have located a civil engineer (ECSI) who will survey, design and bring back to the board a bid package. The first step is seeking approval from KDE for the draft contract. The Board expressed appreciation to Mr. Murphy for his services.
