MORRISON COMMUNITY UNIT SCHOOL DISTRICT #6 SCHOOL OPENING INFORMATION 2023-2024



All Morrison Schools will open for classes on Wednesday, August 16th, 2023. First three days of school will have a dismissal time (**NS-12:55; SS, JH, HS-1:05**). Starting August 21st, 2023 normal school hours will be:

The District Office Staff will provide support with the registration process at Morrison CUSD #6 100 E. Knox St. July 10th – July 28th from 7:30 to 3:00 Monday – Friday. Support will also be provided at each school starting August 1st. Registration support will include assisting families on skyward utilizing the district computers.

REGISTRATION & FEE COLLECTION

Parents and Guardians:

Morrison Schools will be utilizing the online process to complete all students' registration. Online registration will open July 10th and continue until August 9th. In order to complete online registration, parents need to have a skyward parent login, which was provided last year. Please contact your child's school or District Office if you need your login information.

Registration is a two-step process beginning with entering/verifying your child's information in Skyward, then print forms if needed. The second step is payment utilizing Skyward - RevTrak, a credit card, e-check, or paying registration fees in person at the District Office July 10th through July 28th.

District Office will take payments over the phone.

SKYWARD:

Step 1 - Skyward Registration:

1. Log in to Skyward Parent Portal
2. Click on School Registration link on the left side
3. Review and correct any information on each of the following tabs.
 - a. Demographics – Student demographic information
 - b. Emergency Alerts – Emergency notification phone, text, and email information
 - c. Language – Home Language Survey
 - d. Guardians – Parent/Guardian contact information
 - e. Emergency – Emergency contacts and medical providers
 - f. Health – Medications, health concerns, and insurance information
 - g. Permissions – Parental permissions for handbook, policies, etc. need by the school.
 - h. Documents – Links to required and informational documents/forms
 - i. Finish – This completes the skyward registration step.
4. Please complete these steps for each child.

Step 2 – Payments

All registration fees must be paid before athletic/extra-curricular fees. Student accounts will have pre-assigned registration fees automatically loaded into Skyward. Monthly invoices for Mandatory Fees will be sent via email from Skylert beginning September 1st until all Mandatory Fees are paid. Any family wishing to make payment plans with the District Office may notify the District office 815-772-2064.

NOTICE TO NEW PUPILS

Any new student's registering in a Morrison School for the first time after having attended school in another district should request the former school to send his/her school records to the School he/she will attend this year. If this has not been done, the parent must sign a release and we will send a request for these records.



SCHOOL BREAKFAST/LUNCH

Breakfast programs are prepared and served at elementary, middle, and high school students from 7:40 A.M. to 8:00 A.M. Upon completion of breakfast, students move to their assigned morning areas. Students are offered 8 ounces of milk, ½ cup fruit, vegetable, or juice; and two servings of bread or meat or one each. The breakfast menu provides the nourishment your child needs to perform in morning classes. The price of a paid breakfast is \$1.40 and the reduced price breakfast is \$0.30. If the student is eligible for free or reduced lunch, he/she may also sign up to receive a free or reduced breakfast.

Lunch Procedures: The Morrison school lunch program is completely automated. No cash will be accepted in the cafeteria. Parents must prepay meals for their child(ren) by sending money on the first day of each week. Following is a brief explanation for each school.

Elementary: As your child eats school lunch or purchases milk with a cold lunch, their individual bar code will be scanned by the lunchroom monitor. Your child's account will be credited with the dollar amount of money you send to school. Each time your child purchases a lunch or milk it will be deducted from the balance in his/her account. When the balance on the account reaches a certain level you will be alerted and can make another deposit.

Students qualifying for **free/reduced lunch** will receive meals but must pay for milk when eating a cold lunch or morning milk break at Northside. **Free and Reduced students are required to pay for milk or extra food taken at lunch.** Money should be sent to school in an envelope with the child's name, payer's name (parent/guardian), teacher's name and the amount enclosed.



JUNIOR HIGH and HIGH SCHOOL: The first meal each day that a student purchases will cost \$2.60. If the student purchases additional meals on the same day, the second meal will be at a higher ala carte rate for each item-purchased. Money should be sent the first day of the week with your child in an envelope with the child's name, payer on the account, grade and amount enclosed.



PHYSICAL, DENTAL, & EYE EXAMINATIONS IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

All students upon entrance into Pre-School, Kindergarten, Sixth, and Ninth Grade, or entering an Illinois school for the first time must have a physical examination performed by a doctor. **Chiropractor exams or sports physicals are NOT accepted.** Physicals must be on an Illinois Department of Health form and on file in the School where the student is in attendance. Forms are available in all School Offices and on the webpage.

Students requiring a physical must have the physical on file by October 15th, or will not be able to attend school. Every effort should be made to have this completed by the first day of school. New students entering the District will have thirty (30) days to obtain such examination or appointments after they are enrolled. **STRICTLY ENFORCED.**

*Meningococcal – **12th grade** - two doses if meningococcal needed (If 1st dose after 16 years of age only one dose required).

* Any child entering Kindergarten through 6th Grade is required to have a lead screen.

* Dental examination is required by May 15, 2024 for all students entering Kindergarten, Second, Sixth Grade and Ninth Grade.

* Vision examination is required by October 15, 2023 for all students entering Kindergarten and students that are new to an Illinois School.

Vision and Hearing Screenings: Vision and hearing screening test will be given to students according to State mandates which are as follows.

- Pre-School – Hearing and Vision
- K- Hearing and Vision
- 1st- Hearing
- 2nd – Hearing, Vision, and Color deficiency screening
- 3rd- Hearing
- 5th – Vision checked as recommended and any teacher referrals will be screened
- 8th – Vision

- All Students with IEP's and new to the district
- All teacher referrals

Vision screening is not a substitute for a complete eye and vision examination by an eye doctor. Your child is not required to undergo the vision screening if an optometrist or ophthalmologist has completed and signed a report indicating that an eye examination has been administered within the previous 12 months. We must have a copy of this report on file.

Religious Exemption from Immunizations and/or Examination Form Process:

In accordance with rules adopted by the Illinois Department of Public (IDPH), a student will be exempted from this policy's requirements for: Religious or medical grounds, if the student's parents/guardians present the IDPH's Certificate of Religious Exemption form to the Nurse. When the Religious Exemption form is presented, the Nurse shall immediately inform the parents/guardians of exclusion procedures pursuant to Board Policy 7:280, Communicable and Chronic Infectious Disease and State rules if there is an outbreak of one or more diseases from which the student is not protected.

District Supply of EPIPEN

District Supply of EpiPens The State of IL requires parents/guardians to be informed that: (1) the District maintains a supply of Undesignated Epinephrine Auto injectors (UEA), and (2) the District and the prescribing physician are protected from liability when the school nurse and/or trained personnel administer a UEA to any student when these individuals in good faith professionally believe that the student is having an anaphylactic reaction.

PRE-K – 12th GRADE CONCUSSION POLICY

Concussions are one of the most commonly reported injuries in children and adolescents who participate in sports and recreational activities. Continuing to play with a concussion or symptoms of a head injury leaves a young athlete especially vulnerable to greater injury and even death. The Return-to-Play protocol which will determine when a student may return to practice or competition after a concussion as well as the Return-to-Learn protocol which will determine when a student may return to the classroom after a concussion. Medical Release In case of surgery, orthopedic injuries, and extended illnesses, a note is required from your student's physician regarding activity for recess, required gym classes, and sports participation.

***REMINDER SPORTS PHYSICALS need to be completed before attending the 1st day of practice.**



ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

Regular school attendance is directly related to success at school. If a student must be absent from school, please call the school office by 8:30 A.M. to report the child's absence and the reason for the absence. If a student who is subject to compulsory attendance laws is absent without valid cause for more than 10 days he/she will be released to Regional office of Education for truancy intervention.

Homebound Education and Hospital Instruction

A student absent from school for more than two consecutive weeks because of health or physical impairment may receive services of a certified teacher in the home or hospital. Appropriate educational services can begin as soon as eligibility has been established with a written statement from a licensed medical examiner and a written parent or guardian request is filed in the office of the Superintendent. Instructional time will be provided for a minimum of 5 clock hours per week on days when school is normally in session.

Homeless Children & Education

The Illinois Education for Homeless Children Act and the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act require school districts to provide a homeless education liaison to assist these children in working with the problems involved in getting to school and staying there. Many times homeless children and teens face barriers to enrollment such as lost records, immunizations, and physical examinations. Your liaison can assist with these issues. Call for information. Together we can try to minimize the disruption to the lives of these children. Homeless children have the right to: Stay in their old school, or go to the school near where they are staying. Annual Asbestos Management Plan Notice

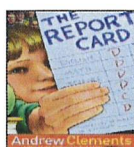

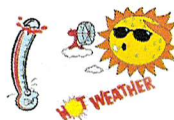
HAZARDOUS WEATHER PROCEDURE

When fog, snowstorms, bad roads, or other emergencies make it necessary to close school for a day or more, students and parents will be notified via radio, television, and Skyward as soon as a decision has been reached to close school. In case school is dismissed early or it is necessary to delay the running of buses due to inclement weather, the information will also be broadcast over the same stations. In the event conditions warrant the necessity of a delay in the starting time of school for the safety of students, the following procedures are in effect:

- The superintendent shall have the authority to delay the morning start of school and will determine the length of the delay based on conditions.
- Depending on the length of the delay, all schedules will be delayed accordingly: Example; a one hour delay will delay all bus schedules one hour, etc.
- The principal will make the adjustments in each building that are most appropriate for the circumstances.
- Notification of late start or early dismissal will be done in the same manner as a cancellation.
- Parents/guardians should make necessary arrangements for child care in the event that a late start becomes a school cancellation day.
- The superintendent has the option of canceling school if the delayed start does not provide the safety required for students



TOO HOT! SCHOOL CLOSED DUE TO HEAT

School Closed Due to Heat at the start of the school year, it is necessary for the administrative team to monitor the classroom temperature for extreme heat. We have thermometers in classrooms throughout the district. You can help address the comfort of your child on these hot days by dressing him/her in cool clothing and providing him or her with a bottle of WATER to drink throughout the school day. We will assure that all students have plenty of fluids on days of extreme heat.

In the event of extreme heat, the district may announce an early dismissal. The decision would be made by 10:00 a.m. and announced on the local radio & television stations as well as skyward.

Please make sure that your child knows what to do in the event of early dismissal. Inform his or her teacher about specific instructions about where your child is to go on early-outs.

**** EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES** would be rescheduled to a later time of day on days that school would be dismissed early.

Safety First - Where to Drop Your Kids Off

Only buses and staff vehicles are allowed in the parking lot between the Junior High and Southside during the following school hours:

7:45 -8:00a.m. and 2:45 – 3:15 p.m.

Students may arrive to school no earlier than at 7:50 a.m.

To increase safety for students who use the parking lot between the Junior High and Southside School, the District has worked closely with Police Chief Melton and the city of Morrison to improve traffic patterns in the parking lot and on Academic Drive. Buses will enter and exit the front of Southside main parking lot in a one way direction both during the AM drop off and PM pickup. Sixth grade students will be moved to the front of the junior high as they wait for school to start. Junior High & Southside parents must use the loop parallel/closest to Academic Drive

as a drop off point in the morning and pickup site after school. Traffic through the drop/pickup loop will remain one way at all times. When exiting the loop onto Academic Drive, drivers will be able to turn right or left. Southside parents will not be allowed to drop off student's **front of Southside in the loop**. Dropping off a student on Academic Drive is not the safest drop off location. Please note that this is an attempt to make the parking lot, Academic Drive and schools as safe as possible. If we feel additional changes are beneficial and or the new patterns create more student safety issues, the School District, Police Department and the city of Morrison will continue to refine the process. Do not hesitate to contact the School District or Chief Melton if you have concerns, questions or suggestions.

Destruction of Records

a. Permanent records shall be maintained for 60 years after the student graduates, transfers or otherwise permanently withdraws from school and thereafter destroyed.

b. Temporary records will be destroyed each July; five years after the student's transfer graduation or permanently withdraws from the District, unless called during a periodic review.

Parents may copy student record information before such time records are destroyed. Student temporary records shall be reviewed every four years or upon a student's change in attendance center to verify entries and to eliminate or correct any out of date, misleading, inaccurate, unnecessary or irrelevant information.

c. Documents subject to a litigation hold shall not be destroyed until such time as the litigation hold has been lifted or the applicable time line for retention has expired, whichever occurs last.

Driver Education Prerequisite

Students that are eligible to take a driver education course must receive a passing grade in at least eight (8) courses during the previous two semesters before enrolling in the course. If a student is a freshman, school districts may count passing grades from the last semester of the student's eight-grade school year. The Superintendent may waive this requirement if he believes a waiver to be in the student's best interest.

SCRIP PROGRAM



The district realizes that paying fees can be a challenge. To help families, the district has worked with the Athletic Boosters to establish a Scrip program. This allows you or member of your extended family to make purchases with gift cards to area merchants that you would already be making at no additional cost to you. The merchants then make a donation to the boosters and half of that donation can be credited toward your student's fees. Please look

Anyone participating in extra-curricular activity that is not able to finish the season due to health reasons or injury may request a refund. To do so a dated physician's note stating the nature of the illness/injury and that the student will be out for the remainder of the season must be submitted to the office. FEE WAIVERS:

****Remember you must fill out a Fee Waiver and turn it in at the District office with all supporting documents to apply for free or reduced activity or book fees. The waiving for activity fees is not based on eligibility for free or reduced meals or those that are on Medicaid.**

If you would like to set up payments before school starts, stop at the District office to set up a payment plan.

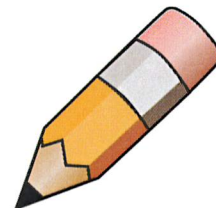
