Homecoming Highlights 2015

WE BUILD MEN... was the motto back in 1961 when the SJMA Class of 1965 entered the doors as freshmen. If you look in their yearbook, you see young boys, many leaving home for the first time, to live and learn in a military boarding school. Half of the class were known as day dogs, coming from the local area, while the other half were known as border rats, coming together from different states and in some cases even different countries. These students shared classes throughout the day, but after hours was a different story. The Capuchin friars did their best to keep them separated. Day dogs were not allowed in the resident quarters or designated areas. Border rats were not allowed to own cars and visitation to the homes of day students was limited. Senior students "initiated" incoming freshmen with highjinks that would certainly be called "hazing" by today's standards. Fraternization with the young ladies across the field attending Girl's Catholic High was limited to a few activities and school dances.

Many years after graduation, this class continues to get together in a different location at least once a year and sometimes even more often. The Class of 1965 has joined both day dogs and border rats into a very tight-knit group and added in the young women from Girl's Catholic High Class of 1965. With one of the largest 50-year class reunions ever held here at Thomas More Prep-Marian, these men and women are a true inspiration for your alumni association and all of the classes that follow. They have proved that strong life-long relationships can be built between classmates who never even spoke to each other during their four years in high school, but who told similar stories of development. These young boys shared many stories with our office staff over the weekend with one truly unbreakable bond, evolving into men with integrity, love of God, country and strong Christian family values. Many of them went on to serve their country in Vietnam and they all came back. Some attributed this to the strengths they learned right here at SJMA. Taught by the Capuchin friars and the Agnesian sisters, this class has come to realize and appreciate the solid foundation of faith, inner strength and high quality of education which was their true legacy.

MAKE YOUR MARK... was the motto set by the STUCO officers from the Class of 2016. How fitting that motto was for the Class of 1965 and 1975! These classes have truly "made their mark" in their individual communities as leaders, volunteers and incredible role models. They have definitely "made their mark" at Thomas More Prep-Marian with their generous support of the faculty, staff and students and their commitment to keep this facility in good repair for many generations to come. The Class of 1975 is currently raising funds to help archive the historical photos and purchase digital equipment to display these historical treasures in the museum being included in the fourth floor renovation. The alumni association challenges all classes to put forth the effort to build new relationships with old acquaintances from the past. You will find it truly rewarding in the personal relationships you develop. The best way to start is to join the committee planning your next class reunion and make phone calls encouraging other classmates to attend. Next Homecoming is scheduled for September 21, 22 & 23, 2016. Now is the time to start getting your committee together. E-mails and social media are a great way to follow-up with classmates, but we really recommend sending out an initial letter through the post office to contact as many classmates as possible. Francis lives in Aurora, CO but has not missed very many Homecoming celebrations throughout the years - even though we read his name off during the Mass for Deceased Alumni several years ago honoring him among the deceased. He simply took it in stride and when the crowd was asked who came the farthest, he stood up at the banquet and replied, "I guess I did since they read my name off at Mass this morning." His daughter and grandson came with Francis and attended the Homecoming events. It was great to visit with them.

Local roots brought **Anthony '65 Luick**, president and founder of American Veterans Quest for Peace, to Thomas More Prep-Marian High School Friday – as he graduated from the school, then known as St. Joseph's Military Academy, in 1965. During his time in Hays, Luick delivered three lectures at the school during Homecoming weekend celebrations, enlightening students of the unintended consequences of having troops fight overseas and how he helps repair emotional wounds left behind for veterans.

"I really like talking to high school and university and high school students because this information isn't being taught anymore," he said.

Luick is a semi-retired clinical child psychologist and continues working with students in high school to find career paths as well as working with special-education students in the Tuscon, Arizona area. Previously, he had 38 years in private practice.

But his most prolific endeavor may be his efforts to heal veterans left with emotional scars from deployments, especially veterans of the Vietnam War who suffered from post-traumatic stress disorder and other invisible scars. Luick served in the Vietnam War just after graduation from St. Joseph's. "I think Vietnam and the effects of Vietnam on veterans and family has really been lost," he said. "The media and the public blamed the soldiers when they came back. It was our government that sent us to war, and we were simply soldiers that carried out our duties. "Vietnam veterans were never treated the same as we returned," Luick said.

His work with veterans includes taking them back to the places in Vietnam, helping their memories of the place shift from the dark fog of war, to the peaceful, scenic country Vietnam has become.

During his educational efforts Friday, Luick also pushed students to understand the true effects of war. "People do not look at the true cost of the war and the intangible traumatic effects that are occurring," Luick said, and with veterans returning from current deployments, repairing the damage might be even more difficult than in the past.

"I could see the PTSD was worse in Iraq and Afghanistan veterans and the reason is very simple: It's the multiple tours. There's no time for healing," he said. "I think we are averaging many with eight tours now." But even with such staggering emotional burdens placed upon soldiers, the average American is greatly detached from current military actions. "Less than half a percent of the American public have any attachment at all to military that has served in Iraq, Afghanistan and now Syria," he said, pulling on past experiences to work towards healing current veterans.

"The correlation is rather amazing... the statistics of the PTSD are almost identical to Vietnam veterans," he said. "The American public needs to become aware" of the damage soldiers sustain fighting across the globe.

"I think every citizen needs to get involved and support veterans in whatever way they can," Luick said, noting Abraham Lincoln first pushed the idea of government support for veterans. "We have a responsibility." Despite the seriousness of the message Luick delivered Friday, he was also happy to credit the school as part of the reason he made it through the war to become the healer he is today. While at SJMS, he served as a Cadet Colonel and Battalion Commander. One year later, Luick was drafted, commissioned as Second Lieutenant and sent to Vietnam from 1968 to 1969. Many of his classmates also served during the war, with this year marking the 50th anniversary of their graduation. Luick estimated nearly half of the classmates served in Vietnam and credits the training from the school for preparing those classmates to serve without a single casualty.

"I think it is due to our training we received here," he said. "I know it saved my life in Vietnam." Mr. Luick was also featured in an article on the front page of the Hays Daily News on September 21, 2015.

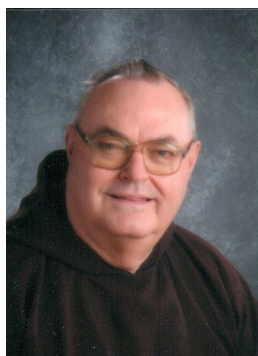

is the final total for the Auction for Christian Education "ACE" 2015, which surpassed all previous records.

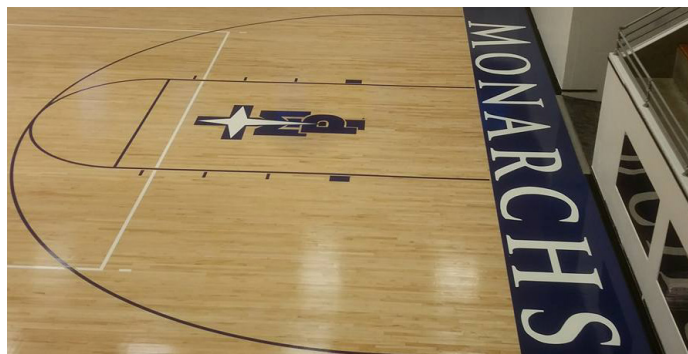

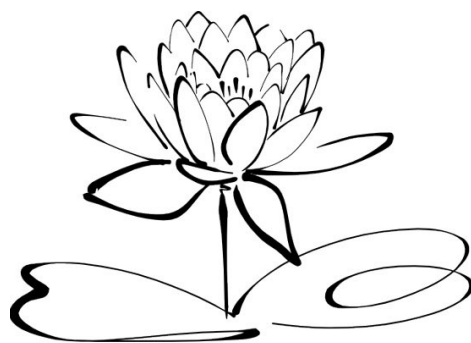

1938Sp - Wilfred "Wiff" Beilman was proclaimed the Beilman Family's "Greatest Generation" person at their recent reunion this past June. The reunion was for descendants of Joseph and Vincent Beilman, sons of Peter Beilman, who immigrated to Kansas from Katharinenstadt, Russia in 1887. He is one of 11 sons and one daughter of Joseph & Elizabeth Jacobs Beilman. Wiff is 95 years old and had just completed nine holes of golf on the day prior to the reunion. Way to go Wiff!

1940C - Zac G. Shawhan sent us a phenomenal letter reminiscing about his days at St. Joseph Military Academy and how it has been his "gift from the past." Growing up during the depression, he attended a Citizens Military Training Camp in Ft. Leavenworth and won a scholarship during each of two years to attend St. Joseph Military Academy College in Hays. After graduation, he enlisted in the army and because he learned to fly at SJMA, ended up in the Army Air Corps. Zac dispatched the B-17's that were interrupted by the Japanese on December 7th at Pearl Harbor and spent five years in Alaska, where he received the Distinguished Flying Cross during the Aleutian campaign. When he returned to civilian life in Texas, furthering his education became necessary and a Masters Degree was obtained, thanks to being taught that "education provided answers" at SJMA. Zac went on to work with the Titan Missile program, Gemini space craft recovery and the F-4 aircraft program in Iran. His letter credits SJMA for inspiring him for the future and the wonderful world that awaited. Thank you for your special tribute.
