THE AIR QUALITY INDEX IS A GUIDE FOR REPORTING DAILY AIR QUALITY. IT USES COLORS AND NUMBERS TO SHOW HOW CLEAN OR POLLUTED THE AIR IS. THE FLAG PROGRAM USES BRIGHTLY COLORED FLAGS BASED ON THE U.S. EPA'S AIR QUALITY INDEX (AQI) TO NOTIFY PEOPLE AND THEIR COMMUNITIES ABOUT OUTDOOR AIR QUALITY CONDITIONS. METUCHEN HIGH SCHOOL WILL RAISE A FLAG EACH DAY THAT CORRESPONDS TO THEIR LOCAL AIR QUALITY FORECAST. THE FLAGS CAN BE SEEN ON THE FLAG POLE IN FRONT OF THE SCHOOL OR ON A WIDGET ON THE HIGH SCHOOL WEBPAGE.

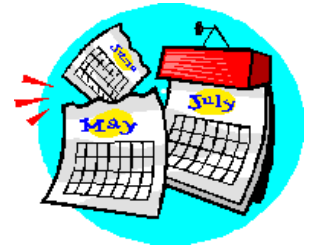
The Junior/Senior Prom is on **Thursday, May 27, 2021** at the *Pines Manor* in Edison, NJ from **6:00pm until 11:00pm**. Prom bids (\$75.00 per person) go on sale beginning the week of April 12th. Prom Bids will be sold between **3:00pm and 4:00pm** on **Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays during the week of April 12th, week of April 19th and the week of April 26th**. If your child is bringing an out-of-district guest to prom (this includes MHS Alumni), you must have your guest approved **before you will be able to buy your prom tickets**. Guest Application forms can be found outside the Front Office or on the high school website. All completed Guest Application forms must be returned to the Front Office no later than **Friday, April 9th**. **NO EXTENSIONS WILL BE ALLOWED.**

As many of you know, the age limit for guests attending the prom has been 19 and younger. MHS extends the privilege of attending the prom to 20-year-old guests if they are graduates of MHS and if they were in good standing academically and disciplinarily at the time of graduation. **Please note, as with all guests, that the decision to allow an out-of-district guest is at the discretion of the administration.**

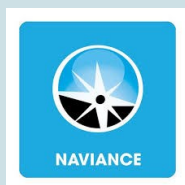

Dear parents,

How much pollution is in the air outside today? Our school community can now find out by simply looking up. We fly brightly colored flags to show how clean or polluted the air is each day. Additionally, there is a widget on the MHS website that will indicate the flag colors for that day. The flags correspond to the colors of the Air Quality Index. The Air Quality Flag Program helps students to continue exercise while protecting their health.

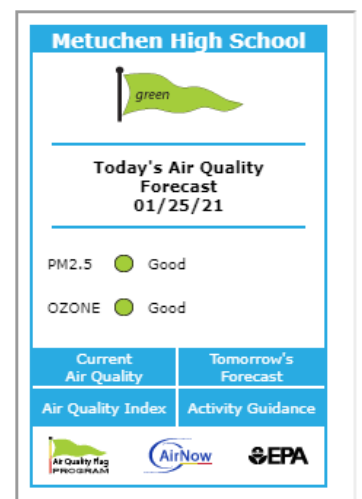
Every school day we fly a flag with one of the following colors:

- Green-good air quality
- Yellow-moderate air quality
- Orange-unhealthy for some people, including children and those with asthma
- Red-unhealthy for everyone
- Purple- very unhealthy for everyone

Days that are code green and yellow signal teachers and coaches to encourage their students to get outside and get moving. When air quality is orange or red, it is still o.k. to exercise outside, but we will encourage students to reduce strenuous activities. Also on orange and red days we will make indoor space available for any child who has asthma or who complains of difficulty breathing. The flags help students and teachers with asthma notice whether their symptoms get worse, and whether they need to take extra steps to protect their health.

The Air Quality Flag Program is used in many cities in the U. S. and we're proud to be a part of the program! In addition to raising flags, we will have in-class activities to learn more about air pollution, how it affects us, and what we can do to make the air cleaner.

Air Quality Flag Program: Fact Sheet

What Is the Air Quality Flag Program?

The Flag Program uses brightly colored flags based on the U.S. EPA's Air Quality Index (AQI) to notify people and their communities about outdoor air quality conditions. Organizations raise a flag each day that corresponds to their local air quality forecast.

Why Is the Flag Program Important?

The Flag Program creates public awareness of outdoor air quality conditions. People can continue to get plenty of physical activity, while still protecting their health from poor air quality. When air quality is unhealthy, people can modify their activities, or move them inside. Recommendations for outdoor activities on poor air quality days can be found at airnow.gov/flag.

What Is The Air Quality Index?






The Air Quality Index is a guide for reporting daily air quality. It uses colors and numbers to show how clean or polluted the air is. EPA uses the Air Quality Index to report ground-level ozone and particle pollution. For each pollutant, EPA has established national standards to protect people's health.

What Do the Colors Mean?

The Flag Program uses green, yellow, orange, red and purple flags. These colors correspond to the Air Quality Index.

How Will I Know What Color Flag To Use?

On the Flag Program home page (airnow.gov/flag), click "Which flag do I fly?" and enter your zipcode. At airnow.gov, you can sign up to get AQI emails, download the AirNow app, or install an AQI widget.

 A green flag with the word "green" written on it.	Green means air quality is good.
 A yellow flag with the word "yellow" written on it.	Yellow means air quality is moderate.
 An orange flag with the word "orange" written on it.	Orange means air quality is unhealthy for sensitive groups -- people with heart disease or lung disease such as asthma, children & teens, people who are active outdoors, and older adults.
 A red flag with the word "red" written on it.	Red means air quality is unhealthy.
 A purple flag with the word "purple" written on it.	Purple means air quality is very unhealthy.

Prom bids will cost \$75.00 per student and the bids can be purchased beginning the week of April 12th in the Main Vestibule of the high school. You can purchase bids from **3:00pm to 4:00pm on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays the week of April 12th, week of April 19th and week of April 26th**. Checks can be made out to Metuchen High School and in the memo section please mark **Class of 2021 Junior/Senior Prom**.

The entire event will be held outside under a tent. **Temperatures will be taken as the students enter the tent area. Students will be required to wear a mask at all times (except when they are seated having dinner).**

If your child is attending the Prom with an outside guest (this includes MHS Alumni), a **MHS Guest Form** must be completed and **approved before bids are purchased**. MHS Guest Forms can be obtained by going to the High School website. You will be able to access the document by going to the "News" tab or on the High School Home Page. Once completely filled out, the MHS Guest Form must be handed into the Main Office for approval. **The deadline for handing in the MHS Guest Forms is Friday, April 9th**. **All forms MUST be approved before bids are purchased.**

Also, if your child will be having an early dismissal the day of Prom (May 27th), you will have to send an email to mmiranowic@metboe.k12.nj.us, cnicholls@metboe.k12.nj.us OR ktmallory@metboe.k12.nj.us **NO LATER THAN TUESDAY, MAY 25TH**. **No student will be dismissed BEFORE 1:05PM.**
