Dear Cros-Lex Families:

The District Administration confirmed through the Sanilac County Health Department within the past 24 hours, of **Four** new positive COVID-19 cases:

- **One** student at Croswell-Lexington High School (CLHS).
- **One** student and **one** staff member at Croswell-Lexington Middle School (CLMS).
- **One** staff member at Pioneer High School.

Based on the Sanilac County Health Department guidelines associated with these **Four** positive cases and the required contact tracing protocols, there are **33** total students in the District, along with **2** staff members who will need to be quarantined.

The Croswell-Lexington Community School's staff and/or Sanilac County Health department as a part of the COVID-19 investigation process will notify anyone identified as a Close Contact. Please answer the phone if the School Administration or County Health Department contacts you, as a contact tracer may be trying to reach you with important information. If you are contacted by the health department and asked to quarantine, please refer to the link [HERE](#) for further information. We recommend taking action to help limit the spread of COVID-19, even if staff members or students are not experiencing symptoms:

- **Wear a mask** (covering mouth and nose) while in public places or if people who do not live with you must visit your home.
- **Practice social distancing** (maintaining a distance of 6 feet apart).
- **Practice frequent handwashing** (using soap for 20 seconds or hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol).
- **Cover coughs and sneezes** with a tissue or with the inside of your elbow and immediately wash your hands.
- **Stay home if you are sick**; you can also follow the link to [get tested](#) or call 810.206.0682.
- **If you are awaiting test results for the COVID-19 virus**, please contact your school, and stay home until you have a confirmed negative test.

Thank you for understanding that, due to medical privacy laws, we are not able to release the names of the individuals with COVID-19. We will continue to communicate changes and updates with you. With your participation, we believe we can maintain a safe environment, while also providing a quality education.
