Building: Grades K-5



Spring 2021

Students who have been determined as not on track for graduation, have been identified with learning gaps, and gap(s) in skill developments by district driven diagnostic tests, i-Ready tests, IEPs/WEP/504s, and state assessments tests.

Vulnerable Populations: Students who are identified (gifted, ESL, SWD, foster care/placed, low-economics status, justice involved, students on remote learning or returning from remote learning etc.) who demonstrate a gap in achievement, or are not on track to meet their annual goals will be eligible for services.

Services will be offered to all students in full group, small group, and individual settings with supplemental resources and materials.

Summer 2021

Summer School will be 6 weeks in Mid July/August with transportation and breakfast/lunch provided for all students participating. Students will be provided with opportunities for problem-solving to create excitement and re-engagement for learning. Preference will be given to students in the low achievement/low growth quadrant on the i-Ready assessment, students currently or recently returning from remote learning, incoming kindergarten students identified with deficiencies from the kindergarten screening and students scoring below proficient on the ELA and math Ohio state tests.

School Year 2021-22

The elementary Before School program with students coming into school who are not on track for ELA and reading and identified as low achievement/low growth quadrant on the i-Ready assessment and/or teacher referral. Transportation will be offered to students qualifying for the Before School program.

Title services will be provided to students on RIMPs for reading.



Intervention groups are in place to offer support to students who are identified as off-track in reading and mathematics.

Inspection, testing, maintenance, repair, replacement and upgrade projects to improve indoor air quality in school facilities including air conditioning systems, filtering, purification, and other air cleaning systems, fans, control systems, windows, door repair and replacement.

Professional Development: Teachers will receive training on using state and local data to identify learning needs of students and gaps in skill development. This includes i-Ready, diagnostic assessments, state assessments, and locally created assessments.

Building: Middle School/High School

Summer 2021

Online credit recovery programs will be used to assist students who are credit deficient and/or who need credit advancement. A teacher mentor will be assigned to meet with students who need additional support and assistance. Impacted students will be provided with materials and resources needed to be successful.

Spring 2021, School Year 2021-22

Students who have been determined as not on track for graduation, currently or recently returning from remote learning, have been identified with learning gaps, and gap(s) in skill developments by district driven diagnostic tests, IEPs/WEP/504s, and state assessments tests.

Impacted students will be provided additional support from the PLATO online program, intervention from content level teachers during the academic period, and support as needed. A teacher mentor will be assigned to meet with students who need additional



support and assistance. Online credit recovery program is used to assist students who are credit deficient and/or who need credit advancement. Intervention period is in place to offer support to students who are identified as off-track for ELA II, Algebra, and Geometry with the appropriate content level teacher.

Vulnerable Populations: Students who are identified (gifted, ESL, SWD, foster care/placed, low-economics status, justice involved, students on remote learning or returning from remote learning, etc.) who demonstrate a gap in achievement or are not on track to meet their annual goals will be eligible for services.

Services will be offered to all students in full group, small group, and individual settings with supplemental resources and materials.
