Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP)

Overview of the Assessment

- The Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP) is aligned with the Iowa Core standards, providing a clear and accurate assessment of student learning outcomes.
 - The assessments are developed for the state of lowa and align with the grade-specific lowa Core standards.
 - The assessments were developed in collaboration with Iowa educators.
 - The assessments will be available online and in paper and pencil form.
 - Math and science tests will be available in Spanish.
 - The assessments will be administered each Spring in the following subjects and grade levels:
 - Math: Grades 3–11
 - English Language Arts, including reading and writing: Grades 3–11
 - o Science: Grades 5, 8, and 10.
- 2. The ISASP assessment is supported by responsive, lowa-based experts and vendors.
 - The assessment will be delivered and supported by lowa-based Pearson, ensuring local support in the implementation process and rapid-response to any challenges.
 - Pearson will provide materials and support for district officials and conduct training
 programs for school administrators to manage the online test taking process.
- The move to online delivery and innovative technology-enhancements heralds a new era in lowa. Feedback on learning outcomes is quicker and more accurate than ever before.
 - Where previous tests relied heavily on multiple choice questions, the English, math and science tests will evaluate students' skills using a mix of item types including technology-enhanced questions as well as open-ended essay questions.
 - By allowing students to manipulate material on the screen, the technology-enhanced questions provide greater insights into learning than previously used multiple choice questions.
 - Online testing broadens its accessibility to students with a wider array of learning needs.
 - Efficient, automated scoring of open-ended questions validated by human quality control processes – will shorten the delivery of results.
- 4. The assessments will provide parents with actionable information about their child's learning.
 - The results will provide a detailed analysis of how students performed relevant to the proficiency definitions set on the lowa Core standards.
 - Over time, parents will also be able to access year-over-year analysis of how their child performed from one year to the next.

This speaks to the caring and support you have for your child, the teachers and our schools. It takes all of us to make sure our kids continue with their success.

COVID-19 Update

Pottawattamie County Public Health and Riverside Community School District can confirm:

There ARE NO additional students and staff this week placed in quarantine due to primary exposure or testing positive for COVID-19.

Total Student/Staff Positive COVID-19 Cases (Since the Beginning of School) - 62 - 8.0% Total Student/Staff Positive COVID-19 Cases (Current)-0 - 0.0 % Total Student/Staff Absent (Positive/Primary Contact) - 2 - 0.3%

Number of Students/Staff that could return this week - 2

- Remote Learners:
 - o Grade PK-5 -- 8
 - o Grade 6-12 -- 17

We have had a total of four hundred forty-seven (447) students and staff since the beginning of the year that have been out and ALL have returned to school.

No students or staff members with major symptoms or a Positive COVID-19 diagnosis are attending school or will be allowed to attend school or participate in activities.

We will continue implementing strict mitigation protocols.

As of today (3-15-2021), Pottawattamie County has recorded 7% Positive tests in the last 7 days

CDC Operational Strategy-Return to School-Updated March 19, 2021

- Revised physical distancing recommendations to reflect at least 3 feet between students in classrooms and provide clearer guidance when a greater distance (such as 6 feet) is recommended.
- · Clarified that ventilation is a component of strategies to clean and maintain healthy facilities.
- · Removed recommendation for physical barriers.
- · Clarified the role of community transmission levels in decision-making.
- Added guidance on interventions when clusters occur.

Key Points

- Evidence suggests that many K-12 schools that have strictly implemented prevention strategies have been able to safely open for in-person instruction and remain open.
- CDC's K-12 operational strategy presents a pathway for schools to provide in-person instruction safely through
 consistent use of prevention strategies, including universal and correct use of masks and physical distancing.
- All schools should implement and layer prevention strategies and should prioritize universal and correct use of
 masks and physical distancing.
- Testing to identify individuals with SARS-CoV-2 infection and vaccination for teachers and staff provide additional layers of COVID-19 protection in schools.

Riverside Staff-Vaccination COVID-19 Update

<u>Most staff have now received both vaccinations</u>. A few have received only the first. A small group is waiting to get vaccinated. Pottawattamie County Public Health will host Closed POD (Point of Dispensing) for Priority Group 1B on Saturday for the next month to complete 1B. Individuals can register at their website or Facebook page. Getting vaccinated is encouraged for all staff at the Riverside School District. An informal survey had indicated that 92% of all staff are willing to get vaccinated.

Each year the district is held accountable by taking the state assessment. This year will once again have our students take the online state assessment aligned with Iowa Core Standards. The district will start planning classroom activities to help our students be successful by reducing student stress and integrating preparation into our daily instruction.

That assessment will take place on April 12-April 16, 2021.

The district will start planning classroom activities to help our students be successful by reducing student stress and integrating preparation into our daily instruction.

What can Parents Do:

- · Make sure your child gets an ample, normal amount of sleep the night before a test
- Mark testing days on your calendar to help remind you and your child when testing will take place and plan your
 preparations
- The student should eat a nutritious and filling breakfast. Avoid high sugar cereals which can make a student unfocused
- · Set aside time each night prior to the test for several weeks to review concepts
- · Work with your child's teacher to find materials to work on at home in preparation for the test
- · Make sure the student is on time on the day of testing
- · If your child is sick please contact the school immediately so make-up testing can be schedule.

Mental health professionals from lowa's nine AEAs recently collaborated to create a website for lowans who are searching for mental health assistance. The website at www.lowaAEAMentalHealth.org came from a request by the state legislature to help educators, parents, and students navigate resources related to mental health and well-being in lowa. In addition to AEA contacts for the schools, the site provides contacts for the home setting from lowa's Mental Health and Disability Services (MHDS). The website features vetted sources to educate visitors about addiction and substance abuse; anxiety and stress disorders; attention deficit disorder; depression; eating disorders; and self-harm.

The Riverside PRIDE Campaign will leverage district resources as well as partner with private donors and foundations to sustain the project. Additionally, the district is in the process of creating an endowment fund. We believe this investment will make the Riverside area a preferred place for families and businesses to call home. This project will create a legacy of positive academic, community, and economic growth to benefit future generations in the communities served by Riverside.

Understanding the virus that

Coronaviruses, like the one that causes COVID-19, are named for the crown-like spikes on their surface, called spike proteins. These spike proteins are ideal targets for vaccines.

What is a viral vector vaccine?

A viral vector vaccine uses a harmless version of a different virus, called a "vector," to deliver information to the body that helps it protect you.

How does the vaccine work?

The vaccine teaches your body how to make copies of the spike proteins. If you are exposed to the real virus later, your body will recognize it and know how to fight it off.

When your body responds to the vaccine, it can sometimes cause tiredness, headache muscle pain, nausea or mild fever. These are normal signs the vaccine is working.
