### Dual Enrollment

High school credit may be granted to students who successfully complete a course of instruction offered by an eligible postsecondary institution.

The following requirements apply to such courses of instruction:

1. Application and admission to the post-secondary institution are the responsibility of the student. All forms are available in the Guidance Office.
2. To receive high school credit for the successful completion of postsecondary institution coursework, the student must obtain prior approval from the high school principal. Approval will be based upon the following factors:
3. Credit earned under this policy section shall be based on a "pass" grade.
4. Upon validation from the issuing postsecondary institution, the student's credit and grade will be recorded on the student's high school transcript. The grade earned by the student shall not be included for any purpose in the computation of the student's grade point average or class rank.
5. The student is responsible to have the postsecondary institution report the student's grade and credit to the Guidance Office in a timely fashion.
6. Tuition and fees for the course(s) will be paid by the school district for eligible students only in accordance with the requirements of the Postsecondary Enrollment Options Act, the Career and Technical Preparation Act and Section 21b of the State School Aid Act.
7. Students must meet all district requirements in order to enroll in any Dual Enrollment or Early Middle College courses.
8. Menominee Area Public Schools does offer Early Middle College course options for classes. Please contact the Guidance Office for further information.
9. If the student does not receive credit and a passing grade within a Dual Enrollment or Early Middle College Course, whoever has custody or legal guardianship will be responsible to reimburse the district for the full cost of the course. (This includes cost of textbooks if paid for by the district)
10. If the student drops a Dual Enrollment Course or Early Middle College Course after the drop date, whoever has custody or legal guardianship will be responsible to reimburse the district for the full cost of the course. (This includes cost of textbooks if paid for by the district)

### Early Middle College

Early Middle College at Menominee High School is a program for students to enroll in a five- year course of study that coordinates high school classes with college **classes**. The goal is to earn an associate degree, industry certificate, Michigan Early Middle College Association certificate (pending approval April 2020) or 60 transferable college credits by the end of the 5th year along with the high school diploma.

Early Middle College benefits include

- Earn college credit at no cost
- Reduce total student debt

- More support than a traditional transition to college
- Smoother transition from high school to college level courses
- Dedicated professionals at both MHS and Bay College for Early Middle College students

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
