Arrival and Dismissal



Students can arrive at school beginning at 7:15 a.m. They should enter through the west side doors leading to the gym. They will wait in the gym, and starting at 7:35, they can leave the gym to work with teachers as needed. Breakfast is available for \$1.70 in the cafeteria beginning at 7:30 a.m.

When the bell rings to dismiss school at 3:15 p.m., students can leave through the front doors, gym doors or other main exits. Buses pick up students in front of the building.

Hays Middle School offers grades 6-8. We have approximately 750 students and 100 staff members. Our principal is Mr. Tom Albers. Our two assistant principals are Mrs. Shauna Zweifel and Mr. Bruce Rupp.

Our office staff includes Mrs. Janae Atkerson, Mrs. Shari Meredith and Mrs. Kay Taylor. One of these friendly voices will answer the phone when you call the school office at (785) 623-2450. Please call the office if your child is absent or tardy, if you need to pick up your child early, or if your child needs to leave throughout the day for an appointment. Our office staff also collects money for lunches, yearbooks, school shirts, school fees, etc. They also take school physicals and other paperwork.

Our school nurse is Mrs. Bethany Pfannenstiel. Our librarian is Mrs. Karen Wilson.

Our Falcon Parent Squad meets on the first Monday of each month at 5:30 p.m. in the library. All parents/guardians are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Students are assigned a locker and a lock on their first day at HMS. If your child brings a cell phone, it must be kept in their locked locker during classes.

Mental Health Matters

Each child's physical and mental health are very important to us. On our website (www.hays falcons.com), we have a page dedicated to available resources for your child's behavioral and mental health.

Our counselors provide brief individual counseling and small group counseling. Working with parents, counselors can make referrals to Mrs. Malone who coordinates services between High Plains Mental Health and HMS. Mrs. Malone is able to help coordinate individual therapy, medication services, and other forms of support offered through HPMHC.

Schoolwide, our students participate in 7 Mindsets, a Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) curriculum. We do SEL on Mindset Mondays during Falcon Squad.

Technology

Havs Middle School is an iPad school. Your child will be checked out an iPad and a charger block and cord. We expect the iPad to be FULLY charged when they arrive to school each day. Your child will receive a Tech Tips card that can help them as they get used to the iPad and Canvas.

Most of your child's work will be done on the iPad. We use an app called Canvas to manage classes and assignments. While there is a Canvas parent log-in, it is limited, so it may be better to have your child show you how Canvas works.

If the iPad, charger block or cord is damaged and/or lost, your family is responsible for repair or replacement. These charges are specified on the iPad Agreement that you and your student must sign before they receive their iPad.

Our district uses PowerSchool for grades. Please make sure you sign up for a parent account on PowerSchool so you can check grades. You can also set notifications so you are contacted if your child's grades change or if they have what we call NHIs - work that is Not Handed In.
