Additionally, a new PA law (Act 35 - Assessment of Civic Knowledge) requires that by the 2020-2021 school year all school districts in PA must test students in topics related to basic US citizenship, history, and government at some point during grades 7-12. This text will better assist Social Studies teachers and students in meeting this state mandate.
