Chairman See called the meeting to order with a reminder that *Every Child College and Career Ready; A Community Involved and Informed* is the mission of the Board and Lawrence County Schools.

## 9. COMMUNICATION

### 9.A. Superintendent's Update

#### 9.A.1. Process Revisions/Implementations

##### 9.A.1.a. COCA Meeting & Distribution to Board

Board members are receiving emailed notes from the weekly Central Office Communication and Accountability (COCA) Meetings. COCA is a way for Central Office administrators to hold each other accountable for what is being done that week and to build a good relationship of helping each other out.

##### 9.A.1.b. Principal/Administrator Joint Meetings

A process has been developed for joint meetings with principals, Central Office administrators, and district managers to provide opportunity to communicate information, to allow everyone to be on the same page, and to discuss and set due dates.

#### **9.A.1.c. Learning Walk Cycle**

From initial meetings with principals, Dr. Fletcher shared that he is impressed with the principal leadership team. “Our principals have done a phenomenal job of having good and sincere input on how to do our Learning Walks, our walkthroughs, if you will. We’re aligning the walkthroughs with the TPGES (Teacher Professional Growth and Evaluation) system to help improve teacher pedagogy...”

#### **9.A.1.d. Focus on Response to Intervention (Enrichment & Remediation)**

The district has a renewed and intentional focus on Response to Intervention (RtI) not only targeting students who need remediation but also targeting those students who also “need a push” to work to their full potential. Dr. Fletcher stated, “Our schools are onboard with RtI systems. It’s been a team effort, and I am very proud of principals and their work on this.”

#### **9.A.1.e. Focus on Academic Teams**

As a strong supporter of academic teams and a former academic team competitor himself, Dr. Fletcher plans to take an active role in academic team matches and competitions, such as serving as a moderator. He challenges all Central Office staff and school administrators to actively support and participate in academic league competitions. Ed Dixon, Assistant Principal of Louisa East Elementary, will be coordinating the elementary league and offering support for academic team processes throughout the district.

#### **9.A.1.f. Developing School Dashboard to Collect, Organize, & Display School Level Data Clearly & Concisely**

The Board will be refining the “data dashboard” process to more clearly serve as a good predictor of the Academic Index at the end of the year. The goal is to put together MAP data and data from Common Assessments so that it is very clear how to respond to interventions and very clear on where we age at different times throughout the year.

Board Attorney Mike Schmitt reported that the appraisal is in process but not completed. The appraisal must occur before action can be taken on the Fallsburg Community Church property that the district owns.

Judge Executive Osborn has graciously offered UPike free rent to provide classes in the downtown courthouse annex. Moving forward on this centers around a grant, and Dr. Fletcher will be following up with Vice-President Justice, who is the Dean of Students at UPike.

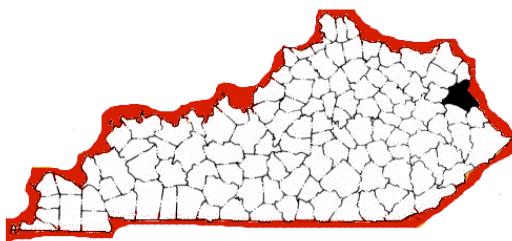

2. The effectiveness and efficiency of district operations including whether you as superintendent have:
  - Established a balanced operating budget for school programs and activities
  - Leveraged district resources to attain the best use of and to improve
    - Student learning
    - Compliance with legal, ethical, and policy standards
  - Communicated aspects of the district's budget and resource allocation to the board
3. Improvement on the TELL Kentucky Survey questions relating to Facilities and Resources

An update to this orientation will be provided to you as KDE's implementation timeline moves forward and as the Board completes the process of notifying KDE of our choice in a superintendent evaluation system, which is currently slated to occur in October 2014.

Dr. Fletcher, do you have any questions or comments you wish to share with the Board regarding your evaluation process?"

**Dr. Fletcher:**

"I acknowledge receipt of copies of the proper KRS, policies, and all timelines related to superintendent evaluation. As the Board is aware, I attended a training last week for new superintendents, and one of the things that you'll be seeing at the end of this year will be a Capstone Project that I will be using as part of my evaluation process to show progress that we've made throughout this year. We have a committee that oversees my progress. As Board Chair, Mr. See will be serving on that committee, and also I have a superintendent who will serve as a mentor, Mr. Henry Webb from Floyd County. They will be involved in helping me through the seven standards and the forty-three indicators for all superintendents that is part of the SPGES system. Thank you, Mr. See, for this orientation."
