8th Grade Coming Up For Air Assemblies

Next Wednesday and Thursday, we will be hosting the AIR Organization (Attitudes in Reverse) with our 8th graders. In this program, entitled Coming Up For Air, students will learn about and discuss mental health disorders, warning signs and information on suicide, and hear stories from speakers with intimate knowledge of the impact of suicide. Students will be engaging in these assemblies during their social studies periods in small groups. We also require that while learning at home, students use school-issued Chromebook devices. Many programs only work school devices, and we have provided these one-to-one Chromebooks for this purpose.





Madison In-Person Summer Arts Program Information



The Department of Visual and Performing Arts is excited to announce the details for the upcoming 2021 Summer Arts In-Person Program. All classes will be given at Madison Junior School and will be held between 9:00 a.m. and 12:30 p.m., Monday-Friday. Our program will include instrumental music, vocal and musical theater classes and new for this summer, is dance! Students also have the option of participating

in the district STEAM camp in the afternoon which is a separate registration form and fee.

Class Descriptions

- Beginning Strings, Brass and Woodwinds (entering grades 4-6) This class is for students who have NEVER played their chosen instrument before or for those with limited experience. Students who have had at least 6 months of instruction should consult their music teacher to confirm they are ready for the intermediate class. All classes will meet from 9:00-9:45 a.m. (Daily, Monday-Friday)
- Beginning Percussion (entering grades 4 and up)
 All students must receive prior approval from their school's music teacher before registering for this class. Each group will receive two 45 minute lessons each week or if scheduled as a private lesson, will have two 30 minute lessons. The lessons will be given sometime between the hours of 9:45-12:30. Dependent upon progress, and
 if so desired, beginning students will be able to attend the intermediate ensemble
- 3. Intermediate Brass, Strings, Woodwinds, and Percussion (entering grades 5-8) Each group will receive two 45 minute lessons a week or if scheduled as a private lesson, will have two 30 minute lessons. The lessons will be given sometime between the hours of 9:45-12:30. Each intermediate student will also have 2 ensemble rehearsals. 5th/6th grade band will take place on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9:45-10:30. 7th/8th grade band will take place Wednesdays and Fridays from 10:45-11:30. An optional flute ensemble will also meet for flutists entering grade 5-8 from 10:45-11:30 on Tuesdays and Thursdays. 5th grade flutists wanting to participate in flute ensemble should receive prior approval from their music teacher before registering. Flutists should select either band or flute ensemble. Students may participate in both for a \$40.00 additional fee. Finally 5th-8th grade orchestra will meet from 10:00-10:45 on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- Advanced Instrumental Lessons (entering grades 9-12) or Beginning Instrumental Lessons (entering grades 9-12) of Each group will receive three 45 minute lessons each week, or if scheduled as a private lesson, will have two lessons. The lessons will be given sometime between the hours of 9:45-12:30. Dependent upon progress, and if so desired, beginning students will be able to attend the intermediate ensemble rehearsals.
