Student Safety Plan - April 2021



The safety of our students is a top priority in our district and schools. Below is a safety plan that will be implemented as we bring middle and high school students back to school on April 14.

What school administration and district leadership will do:

- Ongoing communication around questions and concerns raised by students, parents/guardians, and staff
- Communicate plans and protocols with teachers and support staff
- Notify and partner with law enforcement when a threat or hate incident occurs
- Increase supervision and security staff on campuses
- Provide access to counseling services and resources
- Provide resources and strategies to teachers for facilitating classroom conversations with students about safety including racism, hate, threats, and all forms of discrimination
- Have more diverse voices at the decision-making table
- Teacher training on reporting incidents and classroom safety
- Share reporting steps ensuring that all students, families, staff (teachers, paraeducators, bus drivers, food service, clerical, custodial) know where to report hate, racism, dehumanizing acts, and all forms of discrimination
- Check-ins with staff

What school staffs will do:

- Listen to and document student's reports and respond to reports in a timely, culturally responsive, and effective manner
- Participate in classroom conversations about safety including racism, hate, threats, and all forms of discrimination
- Ongoing communication around questions and concerns raised by students, parents/guardians, and staff
- Share reporting steps ensuring that all students and families know where to report racism, hate, threats, and all forms of discrimination (SafeSchools Alert)
- Document follow-up and check-in with students and families as needed

What parents and guardians can do:

- Have a conversation with your child about their trusted adults at school to determine a "go to" person to talk to if they have a problem
- Encourage your child(ren) to report incidents of HIB, racial discrimination, hate, or any other forms of discrimination immediately to school counselors, teachers, or administrators (SafeSchools Alert)
- Contact teacher(s), principal, or other trusted adult at school if you or your child has a concern
