Principal Report - 3/1/21

#### **Effect of Remote Days**

Instructors reported they had unexpectedly good participation in their remote Zoom sessions. Core class teachers felt they were able to reasonably follow their normal lesson plans with some adjustments. Elective classes, such as PE, art, technology, and cooking were challenged to adapt but were creative and provided lessons and activities that connected to their areas of expertise. For some students, this was their first experience with remote learning having never been in a quarantine or isolation situation all year, and I did not have reports of significant problems. The experience sets the stage for investigation into future intentional use of the remote option.

Upon return to classes, teachers sought out those students who were unable to participate remotely in order to provide them with necessary materials and time to make up what was missed.

#### **Spring Intramural Track**

After our first three days, Mrs. Carter reported the number of students is increasing daily. As of Wednesday we have:

6th: 30 Boys: 32 Girls: 46

7th: 25 8th: 23

#### **Scholars' Bowl** is currently our only interscholastic activity

From Mrs. Kemmerer, Scholars' Bowl Sponsor:

We have 16 students total from 7th and 8th grades participating and have had three virtual meets. The 8th graders took 2nd place in our last meet hosted by Chanute; the 7th grade team is doing better each week and learning the ropes of competition. They have not finished in the top tier of teams, but their team and individual scores are improving. The 8th graders prefer the live, in-person meets to the virtual, but are still enjoying the opportunity to compete. We are going to move to evening virtual practices next week which will allow us to practice the virtual formats of the meets. Hopefully, more students can attend practice as it will be in the evening after track. Our next meet is tomorrow and is being hosted by Pittsburg virtually. We have one in-person meet on our schedule at the end of the season at Prairie View.

#### **Parent-Teacher Conference Preparations**

Teachers have been encouraged to begin contacting parents ahead of our scheduled Parent/Teacher conferences on March 8 and 10. It is our intention to provide, as we did in the first semester, an in-person or remote conference with teachers. In-person conferences will be limited to only one parent/guardian per pupil and that person will have the option to see any of their students' teachers while adhering to the mandated mask and social distancing protocols.

#### **Summer School Potential**

I have sent an email to certified staff to inquire about their willingness to teach summer school as well as asking about students who would benefit from the additional learning time. I will be able to report those responses at a later date as we plan for providing summer school.

#### **Community in Schools**

Winter Moore, site supervisor, is investigating the provision of a tutoring service that would allow our students to schedule tutoring sessions in the core subjects though an online company called Learning Together. We will see if this can fit with our students and their needs. Students can schedule sessions from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. seven days a week but would be limited on the number of sessions per week.

In addition, Ms. Moore has been willing to recruit peer tutors from each grade level. We will be approaching these peer tutor candidates with the offer to step into a leadership role that will help others in need. We will provide the tutors with directions and support should they choose to become a peer tutor.

- Interview teams have interviewed some great candidates to fill open positions.
- Winter social emotional testing is complete. Our Collaborative Problem Solving team will meet in March to compare data from the fall and plan SEL interventions for students.
- 100th day of school was Feb 26. We celebrated 100 days of learning with a variety of activities in each grade level.
- We had a high level of engagement during our remote learning days. Our families were very understanding and compliant.

#### Preschool Board Report for March 2021:

#### Key points:

- Preschool has been busy the last few weeks.
   The students enjoyed Valentine's "Love" Week and each classroom celebrated various activities without the month.
- March 1st, the team will begin giving the My IGDI assessment for the spring window. All
  assessments must be completed by the end of April. This data will be shared with
  Winfield Scott and the Early Childhood Block Grant.
- The week of March 1st is "Read Across America". Our focus for the week will be inviting our families and students to read their favorite books. Now that we are focused on more of a literacy component the last few years, we have observed the increased retention in our students. The data is looking much better, and it has been rewarding for not just the educators to see the progress of the students, but also the families.
- All Parent/Teacher conferences will be held either through Zoom or phone calls with parents the week of March 8th.
- Remote Learning was successful for the most part last week. We are very fortunate the
  preschool was able to purchase the SeeSaw platform for remote learning this pastfall.
  It has definitely played a key role in the educational experience for students and families
  during remote learning. Roughly 70% of our families were able to access the online
  platform daily. Other students who did not have access to the internet or a device were
  given activity calendars and activities to complete at home.
- Our Early Childhood Committee continues to meet monthly. We have been able to complete a needs checklist for our Early Childhood Community in Bourbon County. The main needs for families with children within the ages of 0-5 years is the lack of early childhood resources, importance of early intervention/opportunities, and knowledge of where to find resources. In order to resolve some of these issues, a group of committee members is working on a Bourbon County Early Childhood Resource Guide to be available this spring.
  - Additionality, during PLC last month the Kindergarten and Preschool team met to discuss the alignment of state standards and essentials skills for kindergarten readiness. In the next few weeks, we will have completed an essential skill list to distribute to Early Childhood providers in our community.
- On another note, we are encouraged by students coming in each month and our numbers growing. However, space continues to be our main struggle; we are constantly becoming creative in the ways we serve students to the best of our ability. We understand the importance of access to Early Childhood resources for all USD 234 students. It still remains our goal to continue to have strong community partnership with all of our early childhood providers. My aspiration still remains to have one faculty that can provide early childhood education and resources to all Bourbon County students and families.

The AP English Language and Composition course focuses on the development and revision of evidence-based analytic and argumentative writing, the rhetorical analysis of nonfiction texts, and the decisions writers make as they compose and revise. Students evaluate, synthesize, and cite research to support their arguments. Additionally, they read and analyze rhetorical elements and their effects in nonfiction texts—including images as forms of text— from a range of disciplines and historical periods.

The AP English Language and Composition course aligns to an introductory college-level rhetoric and writing curriculum.

#### 2. Project Management/Studio Exploration

The Project Management/Studio Exploration course will provide students with the opportunity to apply the fundamental techniques learned in Drawing, Ceramics/Sculpture, Photography, and/or Graphic Design courses through the production of a portfolio and projects designed for public presentation. Topics include developing a production schedule, working on collaborative projects/working as a team, utilizing composition principles, and studying studio arts and how artists work in the professional world. Prerequisite for the course is to have taken one of the introductory courses in art that you plan to focus on as your study. Entrance into the course is by application only.

I am requesting the establishment of a teaching position entitled Business Essentials/21st Century Skills for the 2021-2022 school year. Our current collaboration with Fort Scott High School in the Career Technical Education (CTE) pathways provides for some introductory classes to be housed in the 8th grade thus allowing 9 through 12th graders to follow the pathway classes throughout their high school career. Those introductory classes include pathways in culinary arts, agriculture, engineering, and business. It is the business pathway that needs this dedicated instructor to reach all 8th grade students to fully qualify for CTE funding moving forward.

Prior to her transfer to the IT department at the BOE, Staci Sinn-Black conducted classes with the 8th graders that qualified as Business Essentials. Without that instructor, we have attempted to absorb this curriculum into our Tiger Den (Advisory Classes) as best as we could during this second semester to adhere to the requirements for our CTE pathway

The establishment of this Business Essentials position would allow us to continue to offer the introductory business pathway and it's robust curriculum to all eighth graders. In addition, this new position would provide the benefit of offering a 21st Century Skills elective to all grades.

21st Century Skills is currently being taught using the approved one-year position the Board of Education approved earlier this year. It has provided a curriculum designed to meet the needs of students in this more technical and advanced learning environment and, in my opinion, has been successful in engaging students in areas beyond the 3 "R's". A modern educational institution and society demand that students be prepared for a digital world and the complexities of that digital world. A student's ability to navigate through this ever-changing environment requires teaching digital citizenship, coding, cyber security, use of digital platforms, and online applications for the world they will be in charge of one day.
