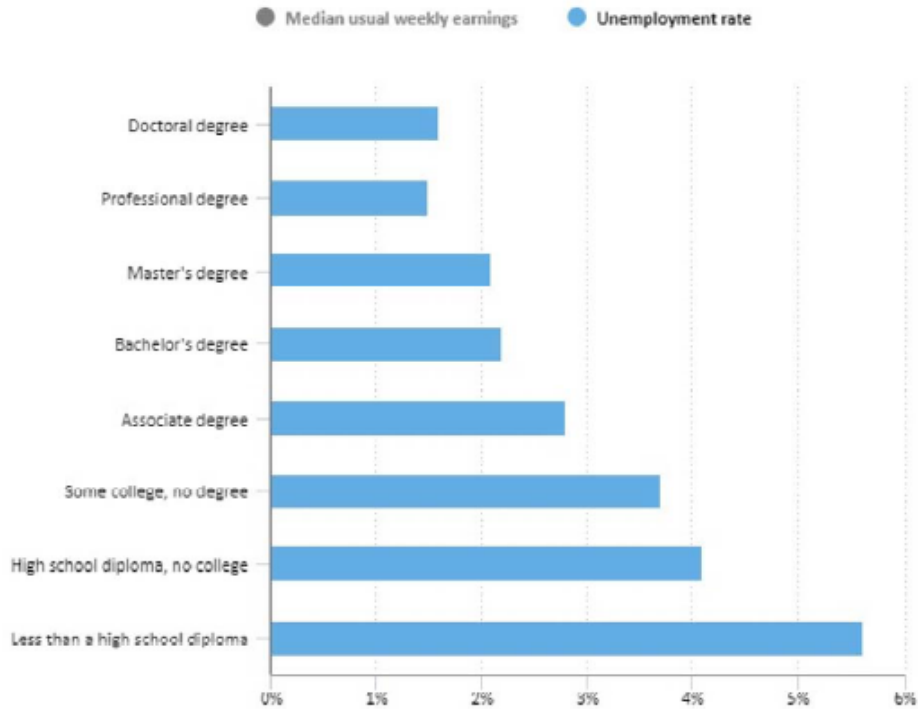

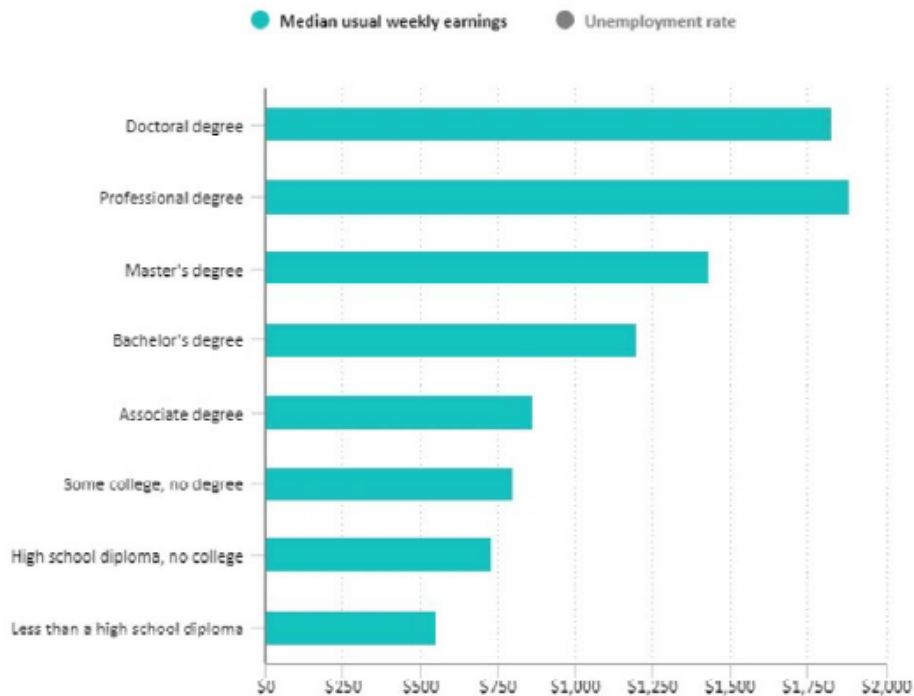
Median weekly earnings and unemployment rate by educational attainment, 2018
