## Student Code of Conduct and Cell Phone Policy for K-12

*This form relates to important policies at Dufur School. Please read this information carefully, and sign the form indicating your understanding of the policies.*

**STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT:** I understand and consent to the responsibilities outlined under the Student Code of Conduct per the Student Handbook. I also understand and agree that students shall be held accountable for the behavior and consequences outlined under the Student Code of Conduct in the Student Handbook at any school related activity regardless of time or location, and while being transported on district provided transportation. I understand that should a student violate the Student Code of Conduct, he/she shall be subject to disciplinary action up to and including expulsion from school and/or referral to law enforcement officials for violations of the law.

### Dufur School Code of Conduct

Students are responsible for conducting themselves properly, in accordance with the policies of the district and the lawful direction of staff. The district has the responsibility to afford students certain rights as guaranteed under federal and state constitutions and statutes. **The following includes general expectations for behaviors.** A full explanation of behavior expectations and consequences can be found in the Dufur Student Handbook. Classroom expectations set by teachers may vary according to grade and subject, but will, at minimum, support the schoolwide Student Code of Conduct and behavior expectations. Violations will not be tolerated and dealt with accordingly by staff and administration.

1. Attendance/Punctuality/ Preparedness for class
  - a. Students need to be in class every day.
  - b. Students are expected to prearrange all excusable absences two days in advance.
  - c. Students need to report to class on time, be seated, and ready to work when the bell rings.
  - d. Students need to bring appropriate materials to class and have homework completed.
2. Respect
  - a. Students need to respect themselves and others.
  - b. Students need to respect the property of others.
  - c. Students need to respect the privacy of others.
3. Conduct and Behavior Expectations
  - a) Students will follow all school district rules and policies.
  - b) Students will follow individual teacher's classroom rules.
  - c) Students will follow appropriate directives from staff.
  - d) Students will be on task in the classroom and in common areas according to set expectations.
  - e) Students are expected to display appropriate social behavior at all times including appropriate language, modest dress and attire, and awareness of expected interpersonal space.
  - f) Students are not allowed to use cell phones/electronic devices to send or receive calls or text messages at school and especially during instructional times. Cell phones (or other electronic devices) used or seen at prohibited times may be confiscated as explained in the Student Handbook.

**EXTRA CURRICULAR GUIDELINES**

**This section is for students in 6<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grades only**

**The Dufur School District will provide the following:**

1. Competent coaches and advisors.
2. School approved transportation for all activities away from Dufur.
3. Safe and appropriate equipment and/or uniforms for each participant in each activity.
4. Competent officials for each activity held in Dufur.

**The Student will:**

1. Meet OSAA regulations.
2. Meet Dufur School District regulations.
3. Meet current O.S.A.A. academic standards.
4. Attend school all day as a requirement for practice and participation in events, unless an emergency arises.
5. Attend all practices and games or meets unless excused by the coach or advisor. Each coach/advisor will develop rules for their particular activity.
6. Follow the rules of conduct set forth in the Dufur High School Handbook and other rules that may be adopted for a particular activity by the coach or advisor. Students who are referred to the school principal for misconduct during the school day will not be allowed to participate in practice or games until approved by the principal.
7. Have physical exams in accordance with Dufur School District/OSAA regulations: each year for football, and every other year beginning in seventh grade for all other athletic events.
8. Refrain from using any vulgar, obscene or distasteful language, signs or gestures.
9. Maintain proper diet and sleep habits.
10. Return all school loaned equipment and uniforms promptly when requested to do so. Uniforms/equipment should be clean and in good condition when returned.
11. Wear suitable attire to games and practices. Coaches and advisors will develop a list of suitable attire for each activity.
12. Refrain from all illegal use or possession of alcoholic beverages, all use or possession of tobacco and all use or possession of drugs not prescribed by a doctor. **Attending a party where illegal substances are present, is the same as using the illegal substance.**
13. The student and parent must sign and return this form prior to the student participating in extra-curricular activities.

**DISCIPLINE**

1. Students found to have violated the tobacco, alcohol or drug regulations for the first time will be ineligible to represent the Dufur School District for 30 calendar days. During the period of ineligibility, and prior to returning to participation in activities, the student will be required to do the following:
  - a. Complete a drug and alcohol screening at the parent's expense.
  - b. Continue to practice and travel with the team or group, but not be allowed to participate in activities.
  - c. Complete 20 hours of Community Service, in addition to the 40 hours required for graduation.
  - d. If students choose to leave the team prior to the completion of steps a) through c), they will be ineligible for the next activity until all steps are completed.
2. Students found to have violated the tobacco, alcohol or drug regulations for the second time in a school year will be unable to participate for the remainder of that school year. Plus complete steps a) through c) outlined above, prior to participating for the Dufur School District during the next school year.
3. A third violation in a school year will mean that the student would never be eligible to participate in extra curricular activities for the remainder of their high school career.

4. If a student is cited for a violation during the summer months, they will be ineligible to participate for the first 30 calendar days of the first activity that they choose to participate in. In addition they must complete steps a) through c) outlined above. A summer violation will be considered the first violation of a school year.

**RAMIFICATIONS FOR STUDENT GOVERNMENT**

1. Students will lose their student government positions for the remainder of the school year. Steps a) through c) must be completed prior to being a member of student government the following year.
2. If a student government member is removed the remaining officers will take applications for the open position and appoint a person to the position, following interviews with each of the candidates.
3. The High School Principal will supervise the process.

**DEFINITIONS FOR ENFORCEMENT OF THIS POLICY**

1. School year is defined as June 1<sup>st</sup> through May 31<sup>st</sup> of the following year. This form is valid for the school year in which it was signed.
2. Each season begins with the first practice date and concludes with the awards program at the conclusion of the season.
