COVID has certainly captured our full attention over the last 13 months.

COVID numbers this week: Highland Primary reported 1 new positive staff case and 2 new student positives as well as 3 students in quarantine all due to outside exposures. Alhambra Primary reported zero new positive cases and 1 new quarantine due to outside exposure. Highland Elementary reported zero new positive cases and 2 students quarantined due to outside exposures. Grantfork Elementary reported zero new positive cases and zero new quarantines. Highland Middle School reported 1 new student positive case resulting in 2 students quarantined and 5 additional students quarantined due to outside exposure. Highland High School reported 2 new student (1 in-person, 1 remote) positive cases and 5 new student quarantines.

HHS sent out information this regarding available vaccination opportunities to students 16+ years old from the Madison County Health Department. We simply want to provide families with the information to make their own decision moving forward. Please contact MCHD if you have any questions regarding the vaccinations.
