Parents/Guardians of the Class of 2021,


Today, we were informed that the Missoula County Health Department is now operating under the "Alternate Appendix A" health order. This is good news for graduation! This means we will be able to hold a graduation ceremony where most family members of graduates can attend. The tricky part about the "Alternate Appendix A" is that the order only stays in effect "based on a 7-day rolling average" and that "average does not trend above 25 per 100,000 population for the previous 14 days."

We will keep you posted on details as the date draws closer. We just wanted to let you know we are hoping each graduate will be allowed upwards of 10 tickets and reasonable accommodations will be made for anyone that may need more.

Graduation is Sunday, May 30th at 1 p.m. The students and weather will determine the location either the football field or gymnasium.


4-PEAT!

Scholarship Winners




