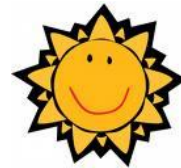
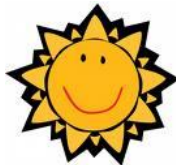
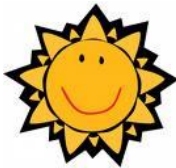

Viroqua Area Schools summer school programming is for elementary, middle, and high school students. The high school has a different start and stop date than the elementary and middle school and is mainly utilized for high school students seeking credit recovery. The elementary and middle school includes a morning classroom experience for resident students with **no enrollment fee**, and a variety of classroom enrichment classes available for the afternoon with **no enrollment fee**.

ATTENDANCE: While students are encouraged to attend all summer sessions, we understand that family trips are often planned during the summer and that some absences are inevitable. Please let your child's teacher know ahead of time of any planned absences. If you sign up for one of the enrichment classes (e.g., biking, camping, canoeing, etc.), please note the date so your child is in attendance. These classes are dependent on enrollment and often have a waiting list. Please notify Mr. Abing or the elementary office as soon as you know your child will not be attending to allow another student to have the opportunity. **For HS students, absences could jeopardize their ability to recover lost credit.**

BREAKFAST AND LUNCH: For ES/MS students, all food will be **prepared and delivered to classrooms at the elementary**. For HS students, breakfast and lunch will be brought over from the elementary to eat in the commons. Breakfast will be served between 7:45 and 8:00 and lunch will be served at two times: 11:15 (middle/elementary) and 12:15 (high school). Breakfast and lunch will be available to all summer school students age 18 and under who wish to participate (**at no cost to families**).

[**Note:** The Summer Food Program is open to the public daily during summer school from 7:45 - 8:15 for breakfast and 11:45-12:30 for lunch. These meals are "to go".]

TRANSPORTATION: Transportation to and from summer school is a parent responsibility. Please utilize the parent pick-up and drop-off area in the NE parking lot. It is important that children are here on time and picked up promptly. Students may arrive for the morning session at 7:45. The morning session ends at 11:45. The first afternoon enrichment session starts at 12:00 and the last session ends at 2:50.

REGISTRATION: Students are required to enroll in classes according to their current 2020 - 2021 grade level. **All registration forms are due by May 7th**. It is important that all students enroll by May 7th because courses are dropped based on enrollment and the availability of qualified instructors as of this date. Each student is to have their own registration form and emergency form. Please do not put two students on one form.

NOTE: For MS and HS students, this registration booklet will be left in the MS and HS offices for pick-up at your convenience. For students interested in working with band, orchestra, or weight/speed/agility training from June 7th through July 9th, please email the instructors for a letter that will guide you in signing up for their specialized sessions.

MORNING CLASSES

CLASSROOM PROGRAM: GRADES PK-K-1-2-3-4

7:45 – 11:30

Students are assigned to classrooms with students of their age and peer level. Daily activities include academics which are enriched by library, music, art, and computer instruction.

CLASSROOM PROGRAM: GRADES 5-6-7-8

7:45 – 11:30

Through a variety of activities in and out of the classroom, students will have the opportunity to strengthen their reading and math skills.

AFTERNOON ENRICHMENT CLASSES

ART CREATIONS: GRADES 3-4

12:00-12:50

Students will work with several medias, including clay, yarn, paint, canvas, recycled materials, drawing materials, and paper. Students will create masterpieces to take home.

ART & NATURE: GRADES 2-3-4-5-6-7-8

2:00 – 2:50

Art can be used in nature, and nature can be incorporated into art. Students will explore the connections that can be made by using them together. Individual and group projects will be created.

A TO Z – WHAT'S OUR THEME TODAY?: GRADE PK

2:00 – 2:50

Working their way through the alphabet, students will learn science (through science activities), math skills (through counting, adding, & patterning), and language arts (through vocabulary & grammar).

CONNECTING LITERATURE & ART: GRADES K-1-2**1:00 – 1:50**

Students will listen to a story which will extend into an art activity. Students will work with several medias, including clay, yarn, paint, recycled materials, drawing materials, and paper. Students will also listen to the story, Mouse Shapes, and create an animal using various shapes from recycled paper.

CREATIVE WRITING WORKSHOP: GRADES 5-6-7-8**12:00 – 12:50**

Students will read and write poetry, short stories, songs, etc. They will also learn how to create dynamic characters and realistic/believable settings.

DRAMA (1): GRADES K-1-2**12:00 – 12:50**

Students will learn character development, improvisation, movement, and memorizations. Students will learn short, scripted scenes. Improvisation based on characters, situations, and first lines.

DRAMA (2): GRADES 3-4-5**1:00 – 1:50**

Students will learn character development, improvisation, movement, and memorizations. Students will learn short, scripted scenes. Improvisation based on characters, situations, and first lines.

DRAMA (3): GRADES 6-7-8**2:00 – 2:50**

EVERY DAY IS A HOLIDAY!: GRADES 2-3-4**12:00 – 12:50**

Did you know that there is a specific day that celebrates picnics? Sea turtles? Fudge? In this social studies focused class, students will explore what makes each day special through crafts, snacks, and games.

FISHING CLASS: GRADES 3-4-5-6-7-8**12:00 – 2:50**

This fishing class is for any child in 3rd grade and up who would like to learn more about fishing and enjoy the outdoors. Fishing trips will focus on the man-made lakes near Viroqua. A note with further details will be sent home prior to the class. Students are required to furnish their own fishing equipment and bait. **NOTE: This class runs all afternoon, please do not choose a 1:00 and 2:00 class.**

FUN WITH FABRIC: GRADES 5-6-7-8**12:00 – 12:50**

Students will craft and create projects with fabric and other common items.

FUN WITH STEM (1): GRADES 3-4**12:00 – 12:50**

Students will engage in fun design and engineering challenges in which they develop solutions to problems, reinforce core science and math concepts, and learn new skills.

FUN WITH STEM (2): GRADES 5-6-7-8**1:00 – 1:50**

Students will engage in fun design and engineering challenges in which they develop solutions to problems, reinforce core science and math concepts, and learn new skills.

IT'S PLAYTIME!: GRADE PK**12:00 – 12:50**

Students will participate in free play, outdoor play, and game activities to use their social-emotional skills (sharing materials, taking turns), their language skills, and their readiness skills.

LET'S BUILD!: GRADE K**2:00 – 2:50**

Students will explore and use their creativity building structures using different materials such as Legos, blocks, and recycled materials.

MUDWORKS: CREATIVE EXPERIENCES WITH GOOEY THINGS: GRADE K-1**1:00 – 1:50**

Using clay, dough, and other gooey things, children will create some projects that will be lovely to look at, some will be lovely to taste, and others lovely to have been explored and nothing more.

OUTDOOR ADVENTURES IN VERNON COUNTY: GRADES 4-5**12:00 – 2:50**

Students will be getting outdoors to explore Vernon County! Our county has much to discover! We will learn about trees, plant life, and wildlife (including birds, mammals, fish, and more). This class will include local experts and hands on activities to discover our great outdoors. **NOTE: This class runs all afternoon, please do not choose a 1:00 and 2:00 class.**

PAPER CRAFTS (1): GRADES K-1-2

TUITION FOR NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS

Any student seeking entrance into the Viroqua Area Schools Summer School Program must reside within the established boundaries of the district or participate in Open Enrollment. The child's parent or legal guardian must reside within the Viroqua School District boundaries. Non-resident students will be charged tuition in accordance with state tuition laws (121.77). Non-resident students who have applied to the Board of Education by April 30, 2021 for the Public School Open Enrollment Program, and have been approved to enroll for the 2021-22 school year, may be waived for tuition for summer school enrollment. Summer school tuition is \$667 for the Morning Session and \$159 for each of the afternoon enrichment classes. Tuition can be calculated (if requested) for the extra classes (fishing, camping, biking, etc.). **NON RESIDENT = students residing outside of the district and not attending Viroqua Area Schools.**
