\*Special Education and Gifted and Talented Education are offered at all buildings.

\*Mountain View School District follows the approved curriculum adoption list provided by the AR Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. (DESE)

\*All buildings at the Mountain View Campus now have a reading intervention teacher. Rural Special and Timbo have a reading intervention teacher. We also provide services for students who exhibit characteristics of dyslexia with the use of the Phonics First Program by Brainspring.

Professional Development:

Family engagement is the focus for teacher professional development. We believe that family

partnerships are invaluable for academic success.

#### Food Service:

Mountain View School District is a Provision 2 school district. All students eat a free breakfast and lunch. Mountain View School District contracts with Chartwells for food service.

### Technology:

Mountain View has two technology specialists on the campus. Rural Special and Timbo have one tech. Mountain View School District is continuously updating Chromebooks. We offer a Chromebook for each student as needed.

#### School Safety:

MVSD has four (4) Resource Officers. We also partner with the Mountain View City Police and the Stone County Sheriff's Department as needed.

#### Transportation:

MVSD offers bus transportation for all three campus locations. Drivers hold a CDL license and follow all Arkansas rules and regulations for bus transportation.
