Although the levels do meet NH standards for drinking water and there are currently no limitations on the use of the water at school, water fountains have been shut off as a precaution. We will provide water in this way until our next water test September 24 at which time we will have further information with which to determine our next course of action. Until such time we ask that you send your child with a water bottle to limit the consumption of paper products which result in excessive waste in our landfills and cost to our town's school budget.
