IV. Student Representative: Markus Baran

Mr. Baran told the committee that cross country and boys and girls basketball had started their practices.

## V. Continuing Business:

- A. Reopening Planning Process
  - a. Safety Committee update

The Department of Education has not given any guidance on when full in-person teaching can start for grades 9-12. Mr. Sullivan stated that there will be enough classrooms for the students to all be inperson. The fans have been installed in the gym so students have the option to eat in there as well. The schools are using contact tracing to determine if or when a student, staff member or whole class would possibly be out due to COVID. The desks are placed 3 feet part.

**MOTION:** Ms. Parent motioned to approve that grades 9-12 can start full week, in-person learning on April 26th seconded by Ms. Pelletier.

## B. Spring Sports Update

If the community is in the red, sports can still play. The programs would be effected by school transmission not community transmission. The spring sports (Boys/Girls Lacrosse, Softball and Baseball) registration is open on Family ID. There are some kinks still being worked out for wrestling.

#### C. Superintendent Search

There is a meet and greet and public forum scheduled for the Superintendent Candidates on April 12<sup>th</sup> and April 13<sup>th</sup>. A survey from the Massachusetts Association of School Committee will be sent both evenings. Ms. Pelletier who was on the Superintendent Search Committee thanked all who was on the committee for their time and efforts.

#### VI. New Business:

#### a. Chartwells

Chartwells Food Service provided some figures for the school committee regarding their amount of meal sales and revenue. They are not sure yet if the free meal program will continue after September 2021.

## A. Superintendent's Report

Mrs. Hepworth

Mrs. Hepworth thanked all who donated to the Western Mass Food Bank drive. There is a Granby to Go clothing event on April 16<sup>th</sup> at Granby to Go. Mrs. Hepworth also provided the number of students in each school who attend in person and remote learning.

#### B. Business Office & Facilities Report

Mr. Tarquini

Mr. Tarquini stated there is a joint meeting with the School Department and Select Board on April 7<sup>th</sup>. At the next school committee meeting he will provide an update on the FY22 preliminary budget and a FY21 update.

#### C. Collaborative of Educational Services (CES)

Ms. Mallette

The Collaborative had a presentation on Social Injustice and Equity Initiatives. The United Way is looking into after school programming for students.
