The fifth grade has almost finished their annual Heritage Project. This project is designed to familiarize students with National Parks, cities and historical sites within the continental United States. Students are arranged in groups who travel on different pre determined routes from west to east. Students keep journals of the destination points along the way and write reports which they present to the whole class. This activity focuses on developing students research skills, citation skills, oral presentation skills, cooperative group skills, individual and group goal setting and organization, in addition to the geography and mathematic content which is learned. Students also write a reflective review which articulates what they learned, what they felt was effective, and what they would approach differently, -- one of the big items from these reflections -- the importance of taking independent responsibility for deadlines and tasks.
