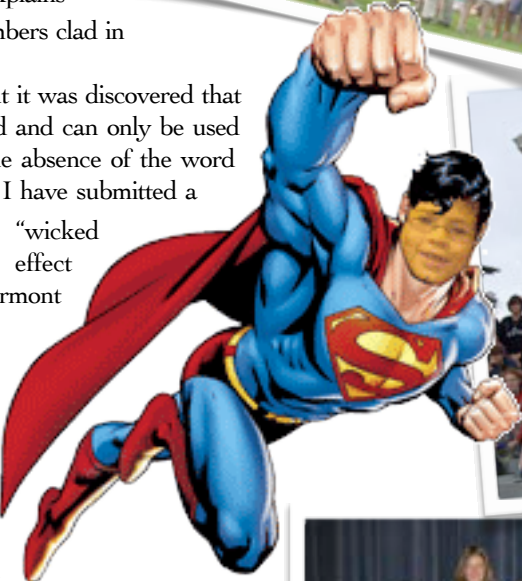
Kiss a *WHAT!*

Zimbabwe Pen Pals

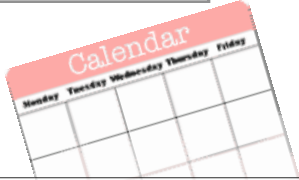
In the fall of 2006 Bill Murphy and Helen North introduced two educators from Chibuwe, Zimbabwe to our school, Oliviah Chingwara, and another educator by the name of Balance.

We have been in correspondence with the Chibuwe children for about 3 1/2 years, the letters are exchanged about once a year (it costs about \$10 to mail a letter from Chibuwe). We have sent photographs, children books from our book fair and school supplies along with letters.

Last week we received 21 woven baskets, pot holders and pencil cases. Given the political, medical and social hardships this country is experiencing, this was a real act of love bestowed upon us. Our students are beading bracelets for their pen pals as a thank you. Each bracelet will have the pen pals name on it.
