One of these changes will be with the schedule! Four day weeks will be introduced next year. Our weeks will change from no Fridays/ half day Fridays to four days a week completely. Principal Powell has worked with parents, students, and teachers to discuss this new schedule. The board of education came into agreement with them that 4 day weeks should be something to experiment with for the next few years. Mrs. Powell thinks, "students will enjoy the extra day off to do other things."
