# Abigail Dreher, of Midkota was announced as one of the 2023 regional Scholastic Art and Writing award recipients. Abigail earned a Silver Key in the writing division.

Fargo, N.D., Feb. 14, 2023 – The Red River Valley Writing Project at North Dakota State University and Plains Art Museum have announced the regional award recipients of the 2023 Scholastic Art and Writing Awards. It is the country's longest running and most prestigious recognition program for creative students in grades 7-12. This year, 90 creative teens from North Dakota received regional honors, including Gold Keys, Silver Keys, Honorable Mentions and/or American Visions and Voices nominations from the local Scholastic Awards Affiliate.

"For creative teens in North Dakota, these awards are equivalent to what the state tournaments are for athletes – a recognition of hard work and a showcase of talent," said Benjamin Melby, director of the Red River Valley Writing Project at NDSU. "Every teen in North Dakota, from Belcourt to Beulah, from Williston to Wahpeton deserves recognition for creative talent in writing and art.



The North Dakota state awards ceremony was held at the Plains Art Museum in Fargo.

Over \$2,500 in cash prizes was awarded at the ceremony thanks to the generous sponsorship from John Deere. The winners of NDSU scholarships in art and writing were announced, along with this year's American Voices nominees.

For Gold Key works of art and writing in the 29 categories, including architecture, painting, flash fiction, poetry, printmaking, video game design and more, the opportunities for recognition will continue when those works are adjudicated again on a national level by a panel of leading creative professionals. National gold medalists was announced on March 22 and will be honored during a special awards ceremony at the world-famous Carnegie Hall in New York City in June.

Since the program's founding in 1923, the Awards have fostered the creativity and talent of millions of students, including renowned alumni who have gone on to become leaders in their fields, including Andy Warhol, Truman Capote, Richard Avedon, Philip Pearlstein, and Sylvia Plath. More recently, Stephen King, Richard Linklater, Zac Posen, Lena Dunham, and Amanda Gorman received Scholastic Art and Writing Awards when they were teens.

## Archery Team Attends State



In bullseye, national qualifiers were Cole Wessels and Nolan Hoffman who placed 6th and 7th out of 101 participants in the elementary boy's division.




#### Kelsey Johnson

## MIDKOTA BAND & CHOIR COMPETE



President Utke called the meeting to order, and a quorum was established. Motion by Hoyt to approve the agenda as presented with FFA added to New Business, seconded by Spickler. On roll call vote, motion passed.

#### **REPORTS:**

<u>ELEMENTARY PRINCIPAL REPORT:</u> Gym floor update: Water/slippery issues has been decided that it was due to humidity. There are a couple of suggestions that were made to help solve this issue. Until the issue is solved, there will be limited games held in the Elementary gym. Students will have a Lyceum on March 9 entitled "Just for Fun." Ready Month will start on March 1.

ACTIVITIES DIRECTOR REPORT: Mr. Monson attended the District 4 Basketball Meeting where the new three class system was discussed. Starting next year, BBB Districts location will alternate between Devils Lake and Mayville. GBB Districts location has not been set but possible locations are New Rockford, Benson County, Larimore and Northwood. Regionals will alternate between Devils Lake and The Betty in Grand Forks for both BBB & GBB. Elementary VB Practice starts on March 6. We are currently looking for a coach, will put an offer out to staff. If there isn't any interested staff, there are two Senior girls that are interested in coaching together.

First possible day to start Track practice is February 27.

SUPERINTENDENT/HS PRINCPIAL REPORT: Prom has been set for April 21, 2023.

Mr. Baron has been in contact with Harold Rotunda for the last 3 years audit. A contract will be sent to Mr. Rotunda about payments and audit acceptance. Mr. Baron will be contacting two other auditing companies for quotes for future audits.

Window blinds will be ordered for the new elementary windows.

Mr. Baron also spoke about enrollment and ESSER Funds.

- 5.3 <u>SUPERINTENDENT EVALUATIONS:</u> Superintendent Evaluations were handed out to all board members. Evaluations need to be completed and returned to President Utke on or before March 12.
- 5.4 <u>PHONE STIPEND:</u> In lieu of the district paying for part of a cell phone plan, a stipend of \$50 will be given to Ryan Baron and Charla Hoyt. Motion to accept made by Spickler, second by Halvorson. On roll call vote, motion passed.
- 5.5 <u>EARLY GRADUATION:</u> Motion to close meeting to discuss student request made by Vollmer, second by B. Hoffman. Motion to approve early graduation request made by Spickler, second by Vollmer. On roll call vote, motion passed. Motion to reopen meeting made by B. Hoffman, second by Hoyt.
- 5.6 <u>HS SCHOOL GYM:</u> With the addition to the high school now paid off, discussion was had about going ahead with plans for a new gym. Mr. Baron will be contacting Zerr-Berg's to inquire about plans.
