


# ALMA AREA SCHOOLS BOARD MEETING MINUTES

## ALMA BOARD OF EDUCATION REGULAR MEETING MINUTES March 15, 2021

Board President, Dennis Hetrick, called the regular meeting of the Alma Board of Education to order at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, March 15, 2021, in the school library. Sarah Danzinger entered the meeting at 5:04 p.m.

No public comment was made.

Minutes from the February 15, 2021 regular and closed session meetings were presented and approved by consensus of the board.

Vouchers in the amount of \$302,912.65 for the district and \$2,971.08 for activities were presented and approved by consensus of the board.

Ms. Bremer, Elementary Principal, prepared a written report which was included in the board packet. Ms. Bremer reviewed parent/student/teacher conference results. Ms. Bremer asked for feedback from the board on the annual Twins trip, which they would like to offer to both 6th and 7th grade students. Board consensus is to move forward. Ms. Bremer is looking at offering an outside Child Development Day on the playground in May. Board also stated ok to proceed with in person plans for B4 graduation. Summer school planning is coming along as well. Mr. Reed's MS/HS Principal written report was included in the board packet. Mr. Reed wanted to thank Mr. Edwards, Mr. Kilian, Mr. Edwards and Mr. Mezera for all their work with the ACT prep night, and Mrs. Rieck for all her work coordinating the ACT. The Rivermen Club House survey for summer was sent out and 7 families looked like they were interested. Mr. Reed has talked to Emma Brecka to see if she would be interested in coming back to run the summer program. Mr. Reed is also working on another Rivermen Club House survey for fall and will also look into contacting some families by phone. Discussion held on how to help get more kids for Rivermen Club House.

Mr. Stewart presented the proposed 2021-2022 school district calendar. A motion was made by Todd Myren and seconded by Corey Hanson to approve the 2021-2022 school district calendar as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Stewart presented the PSEO agreements with Minnesota State College Southeast Technical and with Chippewa Valley Technical College. Mr. Stewart stated there would be 17 students taking courses from CVTC and 13 students taking courses through Southeast. A motion was made by Todd Myren and seconded by Sarah Danzinger to approve the PSEO agreements. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Stewart presented the written evaluation of the School Safety Drill. A motion was made by Corey Hanson and seconded by Doug Kane to approve the evaluation of the School Safety Drill. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Stewart presented the board with retirement letters from Loren Mueller and Carolyn Grisen. A motion was made by Todd Myren and seconded by Sarah Danzinger to approve both Mr. Mueller and Mrs. Grisen's retirement letters with gratitude for their many years of service. The motion carried unanimously.

The next regular board meeting will be held on Monday, April 26, 2021 at 7:00 p.m.

Under discussion, Mr. Stewart discussed COVID updates with the board. The school has been on a good streak of having zero students or staff out due to COVID. Mr. Stewart reviewed the COVID relief package grants. The first ESSER Grant we will receive is for \$40,000. The second ESSER Grant, we will receive at least \$100,000 and then we are one of the 172 districts that qualify for a portion of the remaining \$65,000,000. The school will find out how much of these remaining funds we will receive this summer. There is also an ESSER III grant that just got passed and is still at the federal level and no definitive numbers have been shared.

Staff that chose to be vaccinated received their first dose on March 4th. The staff will receive their second dose on March 25. Plans for next year would

be to go back to a traditional school year. Mr. Stewart asked the board to think about what they would like to do for the fall in regards to offering just in person learning, live streaming or maybe something with Educere. Discussion held.

Mr. Stewart stated that Prom is moving forward for Saturday, April 24, 2021. Mr. Stewart said there were 68 kids that responded to the survey that they would be coming to prom and that was grades 9-12, so he believes that social distancing can occur. We would possibly limit the number of adults for coming to watch the grand march, but there would also be a live stream option. Discussion held. Mr. Stewart will be meeting with the After Prom committee later this week to discuss their plans and what can and can't be done.

Mr. Stewart will discuss plans with the senior class regarding graduation. Having an outdoors ceremony will also be discussed with the senior class.

Mr. Stewart reviewed the Building, Grounds and Transportation meeting that was held on February 22. The committee discussed gym floors and wanted to add to the quote the stage and some additional lines. The committee would like to move forward with the gym floor. The committee also discussed redoing four classroom floors. Costs came in around \$30,000 with flooring and abatement. Mr. Stewart is confident the classroom flooring can be covered under the ESSER grants. The next section of roofing for \$30,000 that was scheduled was on the list for this summer and the committee would move forward with the roof as well, being the funds were set aside for the project in Fund 41. Mr. Stewart also showed a couple of examples of a new school sign. Mr. Reed and his students are working on plans. The committee agreed to put bus cameras on hold. The crows nest will get repaired this summer as the materials are already here. Mr. Stewart talked with Dan Elsenpeter-electrician, regarding the parking lot lights. Mr. Elsenpeter can get some new LED lights that will work great, but they may take three months to get here. The committee suggested to move forward. The elevator is not working and parts are hard to get. Tom Brakke has been doing some investigating and getting quotes on a new elevator. One quote was \$31,900 for a new elevator. Mr. Brakke will continue to look into repairs for the elevator.

Mr. Stewart discussed with the board student drivers and the schools insurance. Mr. Stewart also presented NEOLA policy regarding transportation. Discussion was held. Mr. Stewart will develop a transportation waiver or check with NEOLA if they have one that goes with the policy.

Staff notifications of employment for the 2021-22 school year will be sent out prior to April 15.

A donation of \$200 was received from the Buffalo County Dairy Promotion Committee to the after school programs to purchase milk.

The Policy Committee has not met since the last board meeting. No new meeting date has been set at this time.

The Buildings/Grounds and Transportation Committee met on February 22, 2021. Meeting was reviewed above. No new meeting date has been set at this time.

The Community Relations Committee has not met since the last board meeting. No new meeting date has been set at this time.

The Personnel Committee has not met since the last board meeting. No new meeting date has been set at this time.

A motion was made by Corey Hanson and seconded by Todd Myren to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 6:47 p.m.


## 2020-2021 RIGHT START THEMES




