#### Calendar Update:

As we approach spring and some nicer weather, hopefully the need for delays and cancellations are behind us for the 20-21 school year. Sale of the Old Admin Building/High School Update:

Mr. Jack Hatch and his associates have decided to exercise their option to purchase the old admin/ high school building located at 110 West Washington street. In preparation for the transferring of this property to Mr. Hatch we need to remove and/ or sell many of the items that have been stored in that building for quite some time. The district lacks the storage space to keep most of what has accumulated in the building moving forward. Included in this issue of the BEACON is a flyer outlining the upcoming 1-day garage sale on April 17th from 8-2:00 PM. We will also open the building up on Thursday, April 15th from 3-7:00 PM for anyone interested in coming to see what is for sale prior to the actual sale date. Anyone who is

interested in purchasing any of the items will need to do so on April 17th. You will need to remove the items you purchase on that day.

#### **Budget Update:**

School districts are reguired to certify their budgets for the upcoming school year by April 15th of the preceding year. The board will hold a public comment session at our regularly scheduled board meeting on April 12th prior to certifying next year's budget. The district's tax rate is going to be \$17.22, which is the same as this year. At the proposed tax rate the district is able to prepay on its current bond debt, which the district has been able to do for the past several years. In prepaying on our current bond debt the district is projected to save the district's taxpayers \$1,102,300 in future interest.

As we approach the end of the 20-21 school year the district will continue to work to provide our students with opportunities to excel within the classroom and all of their extra-curricular activities. As we transition back to outdoor activities we are able to open up attendance at all of our outdoor events. I encourage you to get out and support our students, coaches, and sponsors.

Winterset graduates should be aware that our school is privileged to have two well-funded

loan programs.

The Lillard-Miller and Eva Rogan Funds were established to help students finance post high school education. The funds are financed through private contributions. Each academic year, a student can only be awarded ONE scholarship loan for \$1,000 and a maximum of \$3,000 per student. No interest is charged, but the loans must be paid back. Applications are available on the guidance webpage and in the guidance office or the administrative office and may be completed anytime now through August.

Abner & Eliza Black Scholarship- Money is set aside for students with a disability. You must be under 21 years of age when first applying. Deadline is April 1st.



Excessive screen time is the most frequently identified health concern for parents, according to a recent survey. Contemporary studies by Common Sense Media and the Kaiser Foundation indicate that kids spend an average of 9 hours per day using digital media. Here's a look at what screen time means for kids growing up in the digital age:

- Watching TV and listening to music are the 2 most popular screen-based activities
- 51% of screen time is interactive/communicative
- Tweens and teens spend about 1 hour 20 minutes per day playing video games
- 5 hours per day is spent on screen-based entertainment
- 75% of kids use texting, music, and other media while doing homework

We've long held the belief that it's important for kids to have a healthy and balanced "Play Diet" -- similar to the American Academy of Pediatrics' new "Media Diet" recommendation -- that includes physical, social, creative, and unstructured play as well as digital play. Rather than set strict limits on screen time in general, our team at LearningWorks for Kids advises parents to focus on setting limits on video games, app usage, and television viewing.

# **Setting Limits on Digital Play**

Age	Time	Considerations
0-24 months	limited	Screen time should always be with an adult and is still secondary to traditional sensory, motor, and interpersonal experiences.
2-5 years	1 hr/day	Adults should still choose & supervise technology. Physical/social activities remain priorities, but technology can help kids learn academic skills!
6-9 years	90 mins/ day	Adults should still choose technology, watching for violence and other inappropriate content. Limits are very important, although technology has become an important social activity.
10-13 years	90-120 mins/day	Parents should closely monitor chosen technology content and model good technology use, fostering a conversation of how to use it appropriately.
14+ years	120 mins/day	Continue to discuss and observe behavior, guiding content choices but allowing more screen time freedom as it is earned. Technology is now very important socially and academically!

Screen time limits will vary from family to family. The above guidelines should be adjusted based on your child's individual needs and abilities. It's also important to understand that there is no real harm in relaxing limits for any number of reasons, including holidays, sick/snow days, and long trips and waits.

#### How to Give Kids Effective Instructions

The first step to harmony is teaching your child to listen and follow directions

One of the most important keys to minimizing problem behavior is making sure that kids are getting the message you're trying to send. When it comes to parenting, sometimes the *way* instructions are given can be just as important as what you're trying to communicate.

Here are ways to present information to your children to make it more likely that they'll hear you, and comply:

- Be direct. Make statements rather than asking questions: "Please sit down," as opposed to "Are you ready to get out your homework?"
- Be close. Give instructions when you are near the child, rather than calling out from across the room.
- Use clear and specific commands. Instead of "Go ahead," say, "Please go start your reading assignment."
- Give age-appropriate instructions. Speak to your child at a level he will
  understand. If your child is younger, keep things simple and use words you know
  he knows: "Please pick up the ball." With older children, who are so often keenly
  aware of not being "babies anymore" it's important to be clear without being
  patronizing.
- Give instructions one at a time. Especially for kids who have attention challenges, try to avoid giving a series of instructions: "Please put on your sneakers, get your lunch off the kitchen counter, and meet me in the front hall."
- Keep explanations simple. Giving a rationale can increase the likelihood children
  will listen to a command, but not if the commands gets lost in it. For instance:
  "Go get your coat on because it's raining and I don't want you to catch a cold."
  Instead, try: "It's raining and I don't want you to catch a cold. Go get your coat
  on."
- Give kids time to process. After you give an instruction, wait a few seconds,
  without repeating what you said. Children then learn to listen to calm
  instructions given once rather than learning that they don't need to listen because
  the instructions will be repeated. Watching and waiting also helps keep adults
  from doing what we've requested of our kids for them.
