High School Juniors

September

A Voice for Animals Contest

Participants must currently be attending middle or high school, or be home-schooled and under 19 years of age on the date the contest opens for entries. The contest is open to all otherwise eligible students worldwide regardless of nationality, citizenship or country of residence.

October

\$1,000 College JumpStart Scholarship

Applicants must be high school sophomores, juniors or seniors or adult students. Applicants may study any major and attend any college in the U.S. Applicants must be legal residents of the United States and complete the online application form including the required personal statement. The award may be used for tuition, room and board, books or any related educational expense.

Dartmouth International Science and Essay Contest

November

Leadership Enterprise for a Diverse America (LEDA) Scholar Program

Each year, LEDA recruits approximately 60 students around the US to become LEDA scholars. Scholars are exceptional students from socioeconomically disadvantaged communities, which are currently under-represented in our nation's top colleges, universities, and leadership sectors. Students apply as juniors and then attend a summer institute between their junior and senior year which is held on the Princeton University campus.

December

Apprentice Ecologist Scholarship

Three (3) scholarships will be awarded annually to the authors of the three best Apprentice Ecologist essays. Applicants should embody the spirit of the Apprentice Ecologist Initiative by demonstrating personal leadership and environmental stewardship in their project. Essays will be judged by a committee of Nicodemus Wilderness Project board members, volunteers, and past Apprentice Ecologist award winners. Winning essays have been 750 to 1,500 words long.

January

ABPA Harrington-Arthur Memorial \$1,000 Scholarship Essay Competition

The ABPA Harrington-Arthur Memorial Scholarship Essay Competition was established to reward students that seek to increase their knowledge and understanding of how Cross-Connection Control and Backflow Prevention help ensure safe drinking water.

Ann Liguori Foundation Sports Media Scholarship This scholarship supports the study of sports media communications or management and is intended for those hoping to pursue a career in sports broadcasting, reporting, programing or production. Applicants must be at least a rising junior.

Baer Reintegration Scholarship

Reintegration is an achievable goal and dreams are possible for those who have been touched by mental illness. The Center for Reintegration together with the Sidney R. Baer Jr. Foundation will continue to offer the Baer Reintegration Scholarship for those active in their recovery. The scholarship applications are generally available from October to January each year, and eligible applicants are invited to apply.

Carson Scholars Fund, Inc.

An interested student must be nominated by an educator at his or her school to be able to compete for a Carson Scholarship. Only one student from each school is able to apply, ensuring that each nominee epitomizes academic excellence. Carson Scholars must have a minimum GPA of 3.75 and display humanitarian qualities through community service. Scholarships are awarded solely on the basis of academic achievement and humanitarian qualities, without regard to financial need, ethnicity, creed or religion.

Profile in Courage Essay Contest

The contest is open to United States high school students in grades nine through twelve attending public, private, parochial, or home schools; US students under the age of twenty enrolled in a high school correspondence/GED program; and US citizens attending schools overseas.

February

1,000 Dreams Scholarship

The 1,000 Dreams Scholarship provides one-time educational assistance for currently enrolled high school-aged women. This can include assistance for needs including but not exclusive to: educational conferences, instructional programs related to creative or artistic pursuits, graduate exam application fees, textbooks or tuition.

AMS Freshman Undergraduate Scholarship

The American Meteorological Society is pleased to announce the AMS Freshman Undergraduate Scholarship program, open to all high school students and designed to encourage study in the atmospheric and related sciences. Serving as a unique example of various sectors of our field joining together to support young, talented minds, the scholarships are being sponsored by partners in industry, as well as through named scholarships either established by an AMS member or in memory of someone.

Captain Kevin Kyle Mosley Private Pilot Scholarship

This annual scholarship awards \$2,500 to one Oregon high school junior or senior (aged 16-18) with a passion for aviation to help him or her obtain a private pilot license (e.g. ground school instruction, dual and solo flight instruction, pre and post flight instruction, the FAA written test and flight examiner's fee for the private pilot check ride). Cyberbullying Prevention for Teens Scholarship

In an effort to preventing cyberbullying, we have created the Cyberbullying Prevention for Teens Scholarship for undergraduate or postgraduate students/high school, college or graduate student or a student planning to enter college to receive \$1,000 award.

Davidson Fellows Scholarship

This is a year-long leadership development program for public high school juniors and educators to put their education into action. It begins with a scholarship to attend the Aspen Ideas Festival and continues through the following school year when Bezos Scholar teams return home to launch sustainable, Local Ideas Festivals that transform their communities and their schools.

March

Advocacy in Action Video Contest

Any student currently in grades 9-12 at a U.S. school is eligible to participate. The basic criteria is to: 1) talk about the risk from hazardous chemical facilities, and 2) propose at least one solution to this issue. You can talk about the facilities included in our interactive map, or about the unknown risks from additional facilities not included in the map.

American Society of Human Genetics Essay Contest

The contest aims to challenge students to examine, question, and reflect on important concepts in genetics. Essays are expected to contain substantive, well-reasoned arguments indicative of a depth of understanding of the concepts related to the essay question. Essays are read and evaluated by several independent judges through three rounds of scoring.

Create Real Impact Contest

April

Abbey Road Green Ticket Scholarship

Gloria Barron Prize

The Barron Prize welcomes applications from public-spirited young people who are, on our April 15 deadline: Between the ages of 8 and 18 (not yet age 19); Permanent residents of and currently residing in the U.S.A. or Canada; Currently working on an inspiring service project or have done so within the past 12 months; Working as an individual to lead their service work. May

American College Foundation Visionary Scholarship Program

June

A&F Business Consultants

The scholarship program is for individuals in the US who: have been diagnosed with ADHD; are accepted to or will be enrolled in an undergraduate program at an accredited college, university, trade school, technical school, or vocational school; under the care of a licensed healthcare professional for ADHD.

National Co-Op Scholarship Program

WACE is the only international professional organization dedicated to developing, expanding, branding and advocating for cooperative & work-integrated education programs within industry and educational institutions. WACE encourages minority and female students as well as students interested in science, mathematics, engineering and technology (SMET) to apply for this merit co-op scholarship.

National FFA Scholarship Program

Scholarships are sponsored by businesses and individuals through the National FFA Foundation and are given for a wide variety of experiences, career goals and higher education plans. The selection process takes into account the whole student - FFA involvement, work experience, Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE), community service, leadership skills and academics. More than 1,500 scholarships are available with just one application to complete for eligibility. Applicants must have been FFA members for 4 years, have completed a SAE Ag experience project, have participated in district or state activities, served in an FFA leadership role, and be studying in an Ag related field.

National Society Daughters of the American Revolution

The NSDAR awards multiple scholarships to students showing dedication to the pursuit of degrees in diverse disciplines including history, law, nursing, and education. All multi-year scholarships, typically renewable up to four years, must be for consecutive years of attendance at an accredited college or university in the United States. The only exception is the American Indian Scholarship that is available for students pursuing vocational training.

Oregon Wheat Scholarship Award Program

A \$1,000 scholarship for graduating seniors is offered to recognize graduates from each of the Oregon Wheat Growers League county associations. To be eligible to apply for this award, the student's family must be a member of the OWGL or an employee of a grower member. The scholarship is also offered to high school seniors who have worked part time for a grower member. All applicants must be planning to enroll in a University or two-year Community College with the intent of completing a bachelor's degree.

Pacific Northwest Regional Council of Carpenters

The Northwest Carpenters' Union values education from grade school to apprenticeship and beyond. We want to offer both our members and their families' access to the high quality college education that working members of the Northwest's Middle class deserve. Applicant's sponsoring family members must have voting rights at their local union and be children, stepchildren or grandchildren of PNWRCC.

Tesoro Youth Leadership Awards

Tesoro Industries is providing college scholarships for outstanding young leaders. This new scholarship has been launched to encourage young scholars who are leading by example in their schools and communities.

Thomas E. "Tom" Pitzer Maintenance Scholarship

This scholarship provides \$1,000 to help a worthy candidate pursue an Associate of Applied Science Degree with FAA & A&P Certification or an alternate degree field related to aviation maintenance. The scholarship is offered to an Oregon public high school senior or high school graduate with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Applicants must be a U.S. citizen and plan to attend an accredited and FAA approved school within Oregon, such as Lane or Portland Community College, and start in the Fall term.

Thornton FFA Scholarship

This scholarship has been established to encourage FFA members in the state of Oregon to pursue higher educational opportunities in agriculture with the ultimate goal of seeking a career in agriculture, not limited to production agriculture, but to include agribusiness and veterinary medicine.

March

ACS Scholars Program

Scholarship is open to African American, Hispanic/Latino, and American Indian students who are graduating high school seniors or college freshmen, sophomores or juniors intending to or already majoring in chemistry, biochemistry, chemical engineering or a chemically-related science.

Advocacy in Action Video Contest

Any student currently in grades 9-12 at a U.S. school is eligible to participate. The basic criteria is to: 1) talk about the risk from hazardous chemical facilities, and 2) propose at least one solution to this issue. You can talk about the facilities included in our interactive map, or about the unknown risks from additional facilities not included in the map.

American Society of Human Genetics Essay Contest

The contest aims to challenge students to examine, question, and reflect on important concepts in genetics. Essays are expected to contain substantive, well-reasoned arguments indicative of a depth of understanding of the concepts related to the essay question.

Create Real Impact Contest

Car crashes are the #1 killer of teens in America, and the majorities are preventable. Create Real Impact motivates young people to promote innovative and effective solutions and strategies to the deadly epidemic of reckless and distracted driving. Entries are accepted in four formats (writing, art, music, and video) with two special categories (Spanish Language and Sports Theme).

Far West Agribusiness Association

This scholarship program has been designed to provide outstanding high school and collegiate undergraduate students with a chance to pursue their educational goals in college. There are two separate selection pools, one for graduating high school seniors and one for current college students. Scholarships are one year in length and will be awarded in various amounts up to (and not exceed) \$1,000 per student.

Ford Family Foundation Ford Scholars Program

The Ford Scholars Program is open to graduating high school seniors as well as continuing community college students who are seeking a bachelor's degree and are ready to transfer to a four-year college.

Guy Davis OSEA Scholarship

This scholarship is for graduating seniors and it awards \$1,250 to each recipient. To be eligible, applicants must have a relative who is an OSEA member and have a minimum high school cumulative GPA of 3.0.

"I Matter" Scholarship

The VILLA "I Matter" Scholarship will provide tuition assistance to graduating seniors enrolling in an accredited undergraduate program in the fall. The recipients of this scholarship are selected based on the applicant's demonstrated academic achievement, community service involvement, verbal communication skills, resume, and reference letter.

McGregor Standing Tall for NW Agriculture

This program has been developed specifically for high school seniors within eastern Washington, north central Idaho and northeastern Oregon, who will be entering college in an agricultural field of study. The company offers up to three individual \$1,000 scholarships upon the completion of enrollment in either academic or vocational college. Scholarship applications and essays will be reviewed by a group of individuals representing our agricultural industry, academics, and FFA programs.

NIADA Foundation Regional Scholarships

The NIADA Foundation proudly sponsors four young men or women each year who have displayed outstanding abilities in education. These students will each receive a \$3,500 scholarship sponsored by Manheim to the college or university of their choice. The awards are presented each June of every year at the National Independent Automobile Dealers Association (NIADA) Convention.

Northwest Farm Credit Services Scholarships

Northwest FCS is committed to higher education and helping customers' and employees' children achieve their educational goals. Scholarships are awarded annually to high school seniors, current college students and those pursuing graduate degrees. All scholarships are \$2,000 each.

OFWC Fine Arts Scholarships

The Oregon Federation of Women's Clubs Fine Arts Scholarship Contest is for ALL graduating high school senior students (regardless of gender) who will be attending college in the Fall and reside in the State of Oregon.

Odenza Marketing Group Scholarship

To be considered eligible for the Odenza Marketing Group Fall Scholarship you must be between the ages of 16 and 25 on March 30th, 2017; Submit answers to the essay questions, which can be found on the application page, prior to the deadline; Have at least one full year of post-secondary studies remaining at the time of the award; Have a GPA of 2.5 or greater; Be a citizen of the United States or Canada.

Oregon Community Foundation Scholarships

With more than 330 scholarship funds that make higher education and training more accessible, OCF has one of the largest scholarship programs of its kind in the country. Every year, we award more than \$6.7 million through 2,400 scholarships.

Oregon Community Quarterback Scholarship

This is a renewable four-year collegiate scholarship program for Oregon high school seniors who are emerging leaders, and plan to attend an Oregon university or trade school. The program is intended to facilitate the growth of promising leaders in the state of Oregon by developing the skills needed to flourish their local communities. By helping to open doors in the business sector, these emerging leaders will remain planted and invested in the state of Oregon. This is a need-based scholarship with criteria focusing on an individual's involvement in his or her community, rather than academic or athletic performance.

Scholarship applicants must be involved in some aspect of seed production, technology or science, without regard to the intended area of study. Two separate awards are available, \$2,500 and \$1,000.

Oregon State University Scholarship for Women and Minorities in Engineering

OSAC Scholarships

One easy application for more than \$15 million in scholarship awards available. Scholarships are available for graduates of specific high schools, students interested in a certain subject, and many other types of students.

OWLS Award from OIT

Opportunity for Working and Learning STEM. Incoming freshman students who have earned 9 or more college credits in a science, technology, engineering or math course, with at least a grade of B or better.

Red & Gena Leonard Scholarship

For students who have a high financial need; average grade; desire to work in a trade; must attend an Oregon college or trade school (unless the training you need is not offered in Oregon).

Scholarships for University of Oregon Students

The SOS program provides scholarships of up to \$10,000 to incoming freshmen and transfer students majoring in chemistry, biochemistry, or physics at the U of O. Twelve to fifteen scholarships are awarded to incoming students each year and are based on both merit and financial need, as determined by the student's FAFSA. Scholarships are renewable for a second year for eligible students.

Sleeklens Scholarship

Three winners will each receive \$2000 to cover their academic expenses for the 2017 academic year. In order to apply for and be considered for the Sleeklens 2017 Academic Scholarship the applicant must write an essay following the instructions provided and send it to scholarships@sleeklens.com, fill out the application, and submit information no later than 11:59 PM EST, March 30, 2017. High School seniors must have a legitimate acceptance letter from an accredited University or College.

The Kim and Harold Louie Family Foundation

This scholarship is for high school seniors and students who will be attending a college, university or vocational school in the US.

TrailBlazer Scholarship

The Trail Blazers and Wesley Matthews are introducing a brand new college scholarship program sponsored by Wells Fargo. High school seniors with a 3.0 GPA in Oregon and Clark County, Washington are eligible to apply for a \$5,000 college scholarship towards a 4-year, 2-year, or trade school education. Six high school seniors will be awarded.

Umatilla Electric Cooperative's Scholarship Program

This program is designed to encourage and recognize the academic achievements of the members of UEC and/or their dependent children. April

Abbey Road Green Ticket Scholarship

Our Green Ticket Community Service Scholarships are designed to reward students who demonstrate an outstanding commitment to the environment and their local communities. Abbey Road offers one full and one partial Green Ticket Scholarship equal to one full and one partial round-trip airfare to any Abbey Road summer program destination.

Associated Oregon Loggers Scholarship

AOL offers scholarships for high school seniors and current college students seeking a degree from a four-year college of forestry accredited by the Society of American Foresters. These scholarships are available to children and grandchildren of AOL members and to others who wish to pursue a career in a forestry-related field such as Forest Management, Forest Engineering, or Wood Science. You do not have to be related to a member of AOL to apply for these scholarships.

Catching the Dream

Catching the Dream, formerly known as the Native American Scholarship Fund, makes grants to Native college students and works to improve Indian schools. Our ultimate goal is to have you being able to go to college with no loans and have your expenses totally covered.

ESA Foundation Scholarship Program

The ESA Foundation established a scholarship program to assist women and minority students who are pursuing degrees leading to careers in Computer & Video Game Arts. The scholarships are offered for full-time undergraduate study at accredited four-year colleges and universities in the USA (high school seniors must already be accepted into a program).

First Community Credit Union

The First Community Founders Scholarship was established to help support students, throughout the communities we serve to afford the cost of higher education. Must be a member of or have an immediate family member who is a member of First Community Credit Union.

Gloria Barron Prize

The Barron Prize welcomes applications from public-spirited young people who are, on our April 15 deadline: Between the ages of 8 and 18 (not yet age 19); Permanent residents of and currently residing in the U.S.A. or Canada; Currently working on an inspiring service project or have done so within the past 12 months; Working as an individual to lead their service work. The Barron Prize does not accept applications from large groups of young people.

Holland & Knight Charitable Foundation, Inc. - Young Native Writers Essay Contest

\$2500 college scholarship and participate in the Washington, DC Scholars' Week. Students are asked to write about one or more of the cultural images, symbols or art forms that have been historically developed by their community (American Indian, Alaska Native, or Native Hawaiian) to communicate a particular message or value or serve a specific purpose. Essays are to be 1,200 words or less and should cover the following: describe the image(s), symbol(s) or art forms selected; explain how it was originally developed or used by the community; reflect on the student's own experience about it, including thoughts and feelings; and suggest why or how it is still relevant today.

Horticulture Scholarship

The Oregon Association of Nurseries is offering a scholarship for seniors planning on majoring in horticulture and related fields.

Jiggs & Maxine Fisk Memorial Scholarship

The Pendleton Foundation Trust offers the annual \$5,000 Fisk Scholarship to a deserving Pendleton Senior student who will graduate with at least a 3.0 GPA. The award honors Jiggs and Maxine who were generous supporters of the Trust. The award is given for scholarship and activities and is not based on financial need.

National Indian Education Association (NIEA)

NIEA has partnered with the National Museum for the American Indian (NMAI) and Holland and Knight Charitable Trust for Young Native Writers Essay Contest (YNWEC). This year's essay prompt asks students to describe how a cultural image, symbol, or art form has been utilized by their community to communicate a specific message of value.

National Native American Youth Initiative

The National Native American Youth Initiative is an intense enrichment program funded by the Office of Minority Health and the National Institutes of Health, National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities. NNAYI is designed to better prepare American Indian/Alaska Native (AI/AN) high school students ages 16-18 to remain in the academic pipeline and pursue a career in the health professions and//or biomedical research.

Native American Journalist Association Scholarship

Any Native American graduating high school senior or college student pursuing a career in media is eligible. All student applicants must be current NAJA members in good standing. Annual memberships cost \$10 for high school students and \$20 for college students.

Oregon Association of Secondary School Administrators

The OASSA awards two \$1,000 scholarships each year to graduating seniors from Oregon public high schools. The scholarships may be used for a 2 or 4-year college, university, trade, or professional/technical school. These two scholarships are for a son, daughter, or dependent child of an OASSA member.

Oregon School Counselors Association

A \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a high school senior based on their 500 word essay on the following topic: How has a school counselor made a difference in your academic, career, and/or emotional development?

Project Yellow Light Video Project

Create a video featuring the importance of avoiding distracted driving. The video should be exactly 25 seconds in length or exactly 55 seconds and must meet the entry criteria and objectives.

SAIGE Native Youth Track Program

The Youth Track is designed to provide Native American students an opportunity to learn about careers within the Federal Government, to meet American Indian and Alaska Native federal employees, and to gain firsthand experience in understanding the positive role that Native employees can play in enabling their respective agencies to better fulfill the federal trust responsibility and honor the unique federal-tribal relationship.

Shawn Carter Foundation Scholarship

The SCFS provides individual grants, paid directly to the educational institution, to every student who qualifies and reapplys yearly, from admission to graduation. The grant can be used to cover tuition expenses and related supplemental educational expenses such as books, lab fees, travel and select costs of living. All Shawn Carter Scholars are required to “give back” to the community and by serving as mentors to younger, aspiring Shawn Carters Scholars.

Walmart Foundation Scholarship

Applicants must be a dependent of an associate (employee) of any division of Walmart who has been actively employed with Walmart for at least 6 consecutive months.

May

American College Foundation Visionary Scholarship Program

The American College Foundation (ACF) Visionary Scholarship program offers multiple awards ranging from \$1,000-\$5,000. All high school freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors who are U.S. citizens or eligible non-citizens are eligible to apply.

Ann C. Thornton Memorial Fund Scholarship

Four \$1,000 awards will be selected for American Indian/ Alaska Native students who live in Oregon and who are enrolled (or will be enrolled) in a college or university in the fall.

AISES NAVSEA: for current High School Seniors

Open to students who will be college freshmen (in the 2017-2018 school year) attending a minority serving four-year college/university as a full-time student majoring in a STEM field. The college/university must also have an ABET accredited Engineering program. This award consists of a one-time \$10,000 scholarship awarded during the freshman year; and an opportunity to apply for summer employment, which provides technical work experience and continued tuition assistance.

Burlington North Santa Fe (BNSF) Scholarship

Administered by AISES for the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Foundation, this scholarship is made available to American Indian high school seniors who reside in one of the 13 states serviced by the Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Pacific Corporation and its affiliated

companies: Arizona, California, Colorado, Kansas, Minnesota, Montana, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas and Washington. This award is for four years (for a maximum of 8 semesters) or until baccalaureate degree is obtained, whichever occurs first. Those awarded must maintain a 2.5 GPA their freshman and sophomore years and a 3.0 GPA their junior and senior years to receive full award.

Duck Brand Stuck at Prom Scholarship Contest

The Henkal Corporation's Duck Brand Duct Tape "Stuck at Prom" Contest is open to legal residents of the United States and Canada, including the District of Columbia. This contest rewards individuals for creating prom attire made completely out of duct tape.

Frank Roberts Memorial Scholarship

Scholarships available for graduating senior and Head Start Parents and Staff. This scholarship is meant to promote educational opportunities for the Head Start community. All OHSA scholarships are for \$2,000.

LM Scholarship Program

Offered by Leavitt Machinery, a forklift company, the applicant is expected to be enrolled in a degree program (2-years or greater) in the Fall. Must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher, the scholarship value is \$500.

Oregon Sports Hall of Fame

This organization awards up to six \$3,000 scholarships to Oregon high school seniors graduating in the year 2015. Recipients are chosen on the basis of financial need, athletic requirements, academic achievement and community involvement. Minimum academic requirements: GPA of 3.3, SAT of 1350 or ACT of 21. Scholarship funds must be used at an institution of higher education within Oregon.

June

AAIA Undergrad Scholarship

Must be enrolled in your tribe; must be attending an accredited school full time both fall and spring semesters; must be seeking an Associate's or Bachelor's degree. Open to high school seniors who will be entering college in the fall, College Freshman, sophomores, juniors and seniors.

A&F Business Consultants

The A&F Scholarships are available to all high school juniors and seniors as well as all students currently registered in any accredited post-secondary institution. To apply for this scholarship you will need to write an essay describing your educational career and life goals. Explain your plan for achieving these goals. Include your degree-major, why you selected it, and how this will help you achieve your goals.

Careers That Work! Scholarship Program

This scholarship program provides tuition assistance for high school graduates pursuing education at participating private career colleges in Washington, Oregon and Idaho. The high school identifies the student that receives the scholarship. The recipient must be accepted by the college to validate the scholarship.

Chief Manuelito Scholarship for High School Students

Scholarship is open to high achieving high school graduates and undergraduate Navajo students. Students seeking an Associates of Applied Science (AAS) or Certificate are ineligible.

Cobell Scholars

This scholarship was established as a result of the Cobell v. Salazar litigation. The Cobell Scholars Program is intended to provide financial assistance in the form of scholarships to vocational schools and institutions of higher education, including graduate and professional schools. Scholarships in various amounts are awarded to US Federally-recognized American Indian and Alaska Native community members (students) who are vocational certificate-seeking or associate, bachelor, graduate and professional degree-seeking students in full-time, accredited, non-profit institutions in the US; and who are able to demonstrate financial need through the submission of the FAFSA.

ColoHealth "Healthcare in America" Scholarship

A \$500 scholarship essay contest for high school seniors or students enrolled full time in at least a 2-yr institution. Essay submissions must be at least 500 words. Please see the website for submission details. Scholarships will be awarded bi-annually.

Delete Cyberbullying Scholarship

Our project aims to educate parents and teens about the dangers of living in a connected world. Explore our site and then join us in the fight to stop online harassment. In an effort to get students committed to the cause of deleting cyberbullying, we are offering the Delete Cyberbullying Scholarship Award for high school, college and graduate students - a \$1,000 scholarship to help cover educational expenses.

Freedom From Religion Foundation Catherine Fahringer Memorial Award

Four (4) scholarships are awarded to high school youth to assist with their tuition, room and board, books, and other academic resources. A \$1,000 scholarship where applicants are asked to write an essay that outlines how much they expect to spend to finish their schooling, how they intend to pay for a higher education, and what they expect their job to be once they have received their degree.

Nez Perce Homeland Project & Tamkaliks Scholarships

Four \$500 scholarships will be awarded. Three of these go to Native Americans; one is awarded to a Wallowa County student. One of the purposes of the Tamkaliks Celebration is to promote cultural understanding.

Odenza Vacations College Scholarship

One \$500 scholarship offered by a travel marketing company on the basis of an essay of up to 1,000 words on the topic: "Why do you want to go to College/University?"

Washington State University MOU Tribal Scholarship

The MOU Tribal Scholarship was developed through the Provost Office of WSU for members of tribes that are signatory to a Memorandum of Understanding with WSU. The MOU Scholarship is for new incoming freshmen students and transfer students. A student is considered a freshman if they have fewer than 27 transfer college credits.

July

International Air and Hospitality Academy

IAHA offers each high school in the US three \$500 scholarships to our Airline/Travel Specialist Program to be awarded to graduating high school seniors. Scholarships are awarded by your high school counselor. If you would like to be nominated for this scholarship, please contact your Career Counselor.

Varying Deadlines

Alice Madden Barton Cosmetology School Scholarship

At Great Clips, we encourage you to show the world what you're all about. To make it easier, Great Clips provides over \$100,000 in scholarships and professional tools to cosmetology students each year! The scholarship award and professional tools are valued between \$250 - \$1,500.

The Department of Human Services (DHS) Independent Living Program (ILP) has received Chafee Education and Training Voucher (ETV) funding to help current or former foster care youth with postsecondary education and training.

Oregon Promise

Oregon Promise is a state grant program that covers some or all of the tuition at an Oregon community college. Oregon Promise is for recent Oregon high school graduates and GED recipients who enroll in an Oregon community college within six months of graduation.

Yakama Nation Tribal Scholarship G.E.A.R. Up/Running Start Programs

The Yakama Nation Tribal Council and Education Committee approved financial assistance for high school students who participate in college prep programs while still attending high school. These funds are intended to assist the students with costs related to college prep courses designed to give students a head start in their college tracks in pursuit of a college degree.

College Level Students

September

National Center for American Indian Enterprise Development Scholarships

Applicants must be an enrolled member of a federally recognized tribe and majoring in a business field. Students must be a junior, senior or graduate student and enrolled full time at an accredited university.

Sachar Dental Annual Dental Scholarship

The \$1,000 dental scholarship essay contest is open to anyone in the United States who is pursuing post-secondary education in the dental field. Proof of enrollment is required.

U.S. Bank Scholarship:

Thirty-five \$1,000 scholarships through a random drawing and a \$5,000 scholarship to a student who completes a series of eight financial genius education course modules online. There are eight modules designed to take approximately 12-20 minutes each to complete.

ASRT Foundation Scholarship

Foundation has more than 65 scholarships available for the 2017-2018 academic year. Awards are available for all types of radiologic science students regardless of specific area of interest. In addition to the general scholarships, there is a scholarship open specifically to minority students.

AWWA Holly Cornell Scholarship

The AMS Minority Scholarships will award funding to minority students who have been traditionally underrepresented in the sciences, especially Hispanic, Native American, and Black/African American students. The two-year scholarship is distributed once per year during freshman and sophomore years (second-year funding depends on successful completion of the first academic year).

BlueBird Scholarship

The BlueBird Certified Public Accountants Scholarship for Native American Accounting Students provides three (3) awards of up to \$5,000 each for the academic year. Scholarships shall be granted to eligible applicants on a yearly basis (as long as there are funds available). Michael Yasick ADHD Scholarship

Oregon Student Access & Completion - Early Bird Scholarship

American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian (AI/AN/NH), and other students enrolled in a college or university as a sophomore, junior, senior, or graduate student in good academic standing are eligible to participate in the WINS program. Sophomores must have completed the equivalent of three (3) semesters of full time study to be eligible to participate in the program.

Washington Student Achievement Council: American Indian Endowed Scholarship

This program provides educational scholarships on a competitive basis to outstanding students with close social and cultural ties to an American Indian tribe or community in the state. Recipients are selected on the basis of academic merit and a commitment to serve the American Indian community in the state of Washington.

AAAE Scholarships

Scholarships are open to full-time undergraduate or graduate students who are either studying aviation OR are A.A.E.s, their spouses or their children. Multiple scholarships are available with specific requirements, including scholarships for women and Native American students.

ACHE Albert W. Dent Graduate Student Scholarship

This scholarship is offered to provide financial aid to minority students in healthcare management graduate programs to help offset tuition costs, student loans and expenses. Offered annually, the Albert W. Dent Graduate Student Scholarship is designated for minority students enrolled in their final year of a healthcare management graduate program.

ACS Scholars Program

ACS awards renewable scholarships to underrepresented minority students who want to enter the fields of chemistry or chemistry-related fields. Awards are given to qualified students. African American, Hispanic, or American Indian high school seniors or college freshman, sophomores, or juniors pursuing a college degree in the chemical sciences or chemical technology are eligible to apply.

AISES ExxonMobil Geosciences (Field Work) Scholarship

This scholarship program will enable Native American/Alaskan Native/Native Hawaiian students to gain actual experience in the geosciences field. Selected scholars will receive \$3,000 in funding for geosciences field camps (normally undergraduates) and/or field based research (typically occurs at the MS/PhD levels). Students must be accepted to the field camp or be approved for funding in order to receive this Scholarship.

AISES Leadership Summit Travel Scholarship

These scholarships will provide support to students to enable them to attend this year's Leadership Summit. Awards will range from \$500 to a max of \$1,350. They will help cover the following actual expenses: round-trip airfare, lodging and conference registration.

AISES NAVSEA: for current College Freshman

This award consists of a one-time \$10,000 scholarship awarded during the freshman year; and an opportunity to apply for summer employment, which provides technical work experience and continued tuition assistance.

American Indian Endowed Scholarship

This program provides educational scholarships on a competitive basis to high-achieving, low-income resident students who have close social and cultural ties to an American Indian tribe or community within the state. Recipients demonstrate academic merit and a commitment to serve the American Indian communities in Washington. Students can use the scholarships at public colleges and universities and many accredited independent colleges and universities in Washington.

ALA - LITA/LSSI Scholarship

The scholarship is designed to encourage the entry of qualified persons into the library and automation field who plan to follow a career in that field; who demonstrate potential in, and a strong commitment to the use of automated systems in libraries; and who are qualified members of a principal minority group (American Indian or Alaskan native, Asian or Pacific Islander, African-American, or Hispanic). This scholarship is for study in an ALA Accredited Master of Library Science (MLS) program.

CANFIT Nutrition, Physical Education and Culinary Arts Scholarships

Undergraduate and graduate scholarships are available for California African-American, American Indian, Alaska Native, Asian American, Pacific Islander or Latino/Hispanic students expressing financial need to study nutrition, physical education or culinary arts in the state of California.

Eastman Chemical Company Scholarship

The Eastman Chemical Company Scholarship supports AISES students studying chemical, mechanical, or electrical engineering. Students must be in their sophomore, junior, or senior year during the 2017-2018 academic year. Scholarship Amount: \$5,000 for the academic year.

Far West Agribusiness Association

This scholarship program has been designed to provide outstanding high school and collegiate undergraduate students with a chance to pursue their educational goals in college. There are two separate selection pools, one for graduating high school seniors and one for current college students. Scholarships are one year in length and will be awarded in various amounts up to (and not exceed) \$1,000 per student.

Fontana Transport Inc Scholars Program

The Fontana Transport Inc. Scholars Program is open to underrepresented, low-income and first-generation college-bound students. Howard Vollum American Indian Scholarship

For Native American residents of Clackamas, Multnomah or Washington counties in Oregon or Clark County in Washington, who are seeking a post-secondary degree in science, computer science, engineering, and math.

Idaho Opportunity Scholarship

The demand for a well-educated workforce was just one of the driving forces behind the creation of Governor C.L. "Butch" Otter's Opportunity Scholarship. Students who received the Idaho Opportunity Scholarship prior to the upcoming school year must complete a renewal application every year. For further details and to apply, please visit the scholarship provider's website.

Indian Health Services Health Professionals Scholarship Program

The Indian Health Service (IHS) offers three scholarships for American Indian and Alaska Native students in order to educate and train health professionals to staff Indian health programs. Students need to be enrolled in a federally recognized tribe, preparatory scholarship can be 1st or 2nd degree descendant of a tribal member, 2.0 GPA or higher, pursuing a degree in a health related profession, OR a junior or senior in college planning to get a masters in social work or physical therapy; Service obligation upon completion.

International Order of the King's Daughters and Sons North Indian Scholarship Program

The IOKDS offers \$500 to \$700 scholarships to North American Indians. There is no restriction as to tribal affiliation or Indian blood quantity. However, the student must provide a tribal registration number and fulfill other requirements. The scholarships are given for technical, vocational or college studies, but not granted for schooling beyond a bachelor's degree.

Leonard M. Perryman Scholarship

Scholarship is open to racial ethnic minorities students who are United Methodist undergraduates intending to pursue a career in religion journalism.

LITA/OCLC Minority Scholarship in Library and Information Technology

The LITA/OCLC Minority Scholarship is designed to encourage the entry of qualified persons into the library and automation field who plan to follow a career in that field; who demonstrate potential in and have a strong commitment to the use of automated systems in libraries; and who are qualified members of a principal minority group (American Indian or Alaskan native, Asian or Pacific Islander, African-American, or Hispanic).

Morris K. Udall Foundation Scholarship

The Udall Foundation awards scholarships to American Indian and Alaska Native college sophomores and juniors for leadership, public service, and commitment to issues related to American Indian nations or to the environment.

Native American Political Leadership Program

The Native American Political Leadership Program at George Washington University is a full scholarship for Native American, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian undergraduate and graduate students who want to take part in Semester in Washington Politics.

Northwest Farm Credit Services Scholarships

Northwest FCS is committed to higher education and helping customers' and employees' children achieve their educational goals. Scholarships are awarded annually to high school seniors, current college students and those pursuing graduate degrees. All scholarships are \$2,000 each.

OCF Deborah Fehnel Bosworth

Students are eligible for this scholarship opportunity if they: Are in recovery from alcohol abuse or an eating disorder OR intend to focus their career on prevention and detection of these disorders; Are a female student; Are enrolled in a degree-granting program.

Odenza Marketing Group Scholarship

To be considered eligible for the Odenza Marketing Group Fall Scholarship you must be between the ages of 16 and 25 on March 30th, 2017; Submit answers to the essay questions, which can be found on the application page, prior to the deadline; Have at least one full year of post-secondary studies remaining at the time of the award; Have a GPA of 2.5 or greater; Be a citizen of the United States or Canada

OWFC Fine Arts Scholarships

The Oregon Federation of Women's Clubs Fine Arts Scholarship Contest is for ALL graduating high school senior students (regardless of gender) who will be attending college in the Fall and reside in the State of Oregon.

Oregon Community Foundation Scholarships

With more than 330 scholarship funds that make higher education and training more accessible, OCF has one of the largest scholarship programs of its kind in the country. Every year, we award more than \$6.7 million through 2,400 scholarships.

Oregon Farm Bureau Scholarships

Oregon Ford ReStart Program Scholarship

The Ford ReStart Program is need-based and was created to encourage adults, age 25 or older, to begin or return to full-time post-secondary education to earn a degree at an eligible college. This program is available to residents of Oregon and Siskiyou County, California.

Oregon Seed Council

Scholarship applicants must be involved in some aspect of seed production, technology or science, without regard to the intended area of study. Two separate awards are available, \$2,500 and \$1,000.

OSAC Scholarships

One easy application for more than \$15 million in scholarship awards available.

Sleeklens Scholarship

In order to apply for and be considered for the Sleeklens 2017 Academic Scholarship the applicant must write an essay following the instructions provided and send it to scholarships@sleeklens.com.

Umatilla Electric Cooperative's Scholarship Program

This program is designed to encourage and recognize the academic achievements of the members of UEC and/or their dependent children. To apply online, you must complete the state's OSAC scholarship application. The applicant is responsible for submitting all necessary information to apply for a scholarship.

Verl and Dorothy Miller Native American Vocational Scholarship

For Native American residents of Oregon who are seeking vocational training or certification.

April

American Indian Education Foundation Scholarships

Undergraduates students must be of American Indian or Alaska Native descent (student or one parent must be enrolled and have documentation) and be enrolled full-time in an accredited 2 or 4 year college/university or technical/vocational school. Graduate students must be of American Indian or Alaska Native descent and attending an accredited graduate school (online college is not applicable).

American Indian Services Scholarships

Enrolled in a university, college, junior college or technical school (1/4) Northern-Native American Indian Blood. Undergraduate student with no more than 150 semester credits or 210 quarter credits. Full-time or part-time status - excluding non-credit courses. Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25.

American Institute of Certified Public Accountants

An underrepresented minority in the accounting profession (including but not limited to: Black or African American; Hispanic or Latino; Native American; Pacific Islander; or Asian American); Enrolled as a full-time undergraduate or a full-time graduate level student pursuing a degree in an “accounting-related” major. Amount: \$1000-\$5000.

API Study Abroad and Intern Abroad Scholarships

Scholarships are open to API program participants. There are multiple scholarships with specific requirements – see website for details. In addition to general scholarships, there are scholarships specifically open to community college students, military veterans, non-traditional students, students with disabilities, minority students, LGBTQ students, STEM majors, and student athletes.

Associated Oregon Loggers Scholarship

AOL offers scholarships for high school seniors and current college students seeking a degree from a four-year college of forestry accredited by the Society of American Foresters. These scholarships are available to children and grandchildren of AOL members and to others who wish to pursue a career in a forestry-related field such as Forest Management, Forest Engineering, or Wood Science. You do not have to be related to a member of AOL to apply for these scholarships.

Brown and Caldwell Minority Scholarship Program

Be a full-time student enrolled in Junior/Senior year or graduate program at an accredited college/university. Have a declared major in civil, chemical or environmental engineering or one of the environmental sciences (e.g. biology, geology, hydro-geology, ecology). Have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent on a 5.0 scale)

Catching the Dream

Catching the Dream, formerly known as the Native American Scholarship Fund, makes grants to Native college students and works to improve Indian schools.

ESA Foundation Scholarship Program

The ESA Foundation established a scholarship program to assist women and minority students who are pursuing degrees leading to careers in Computer & Video Game Arts. The scholarships are offered for full-time undergraduate study at accredited four-year colleges and universities in the USA (high school seniors must already be accepted into a program).

First Community Credit Union Scholarship

The First Community Founders Scholarship was established to help support students, throughout the communities we serve to afford the cost of higher education. Must be a member of or have an immediate family member who is a member of First Community Credit Union.

Horticulture Scholarship

The Oregon Association of Nurseries is offering a scholarship for seniors planning on majoring in horticulture and related fields.

Law School Diversity Scholarship Program

Scholarship is open to students who have shown academic achievement as reflected by a minimum 3.0 GPA and have completed at least one semester of classes at an accredited law school. Applicants must be a member of an ethnic or racial minority or any individual who demonstrates a defined commitment to issues of diversity within their academic career.

Medical Diversity Scholarship Program

Scholarship is open to students who have shown academic achievement as reflected by a minimum 3.0 GPA and have completed at least one semester of classes at an accredited medical school. Applicants must be a member of an ethnic, racial, or other minority or any individual who demonstrates a defined commitment to issues of diversity within their community.

Native American Journalist Association Scholarship

Any Native American graduating high school senior or college student pursuing a career in media is eligible. All student applicants must be current NAJA members in good standing. Annual memberships cost \$10 for high school students and \$20 for college students.

NIEA Official Website

The National Indian Education Association wants to make sure that every Native student knows about other funding opportunities to help them succeed in their academic career. This is a list of other organizations who offer scholarships and internships.

Novo Nordisk Donnelly Awards

Two one-time national awards of \$5,000 each given annually to two young people aged 14-21 who have diabetes and play tennis competitively in tournaments or on their school team. The awards are to be used for education, tennis development, and/or medical care.

Oregon Cattlemen's Stewardship Fund (OCSF) Scholarship

The OCSF Scholarships are open to current members and their family. Applicants must be at college sophomore, junior, senior, or graduate level and be enrolled full-time at a community college or university. All majors may apply; however, some relevance to the livestock industry must be demonstrated.

Oregon Pointe Pest Control Scholarship

This scholarship is a one-time scholarship worth \$750. Applications for scholarship can be submitted by any high school senior or college freshman from the state of Oregon. This scholarship is judged primarily on a need basis, but does not exclude achievement standards. Applicants must have a minimum 3.0 GPA.

Project Yellow Light Video Project

Create a video featuring the importance of avoiding distracted driving. The video should be exactly 25 seconds in length or exactly 55 seconds and must meet the entry criteria and objectives.

SAIGE Native Youth Track Program

The Youth Track is designed to provide Native American students an opportunity to learn about careers within the Federal Government, to meet American Indian and Alaska Native federal employees, and to gain firsthand experience in understanding the positive role that Native employees can play in enabling their respective agencies to better fulfill the federal trust responsibility and honor the unique federal-tribal relationship.

Shawn Carter Foundation Scholarship

The SCFS provides individual grants, paid directly to the educational institution, to every student who qualifies and reapplys yearly, from admission to graduation. The grant can be used to cover tuition expenses and related supplemental educational expenses such as books, lab fees, travel and select costs of living. All Shawn Carter Scholars are required to “give back” to the community and by serving as mentors to younger, aspiring Shawn Carters Scholars.

United South and Eastern Tribes, Inc. Scholarships

Scholarship monies are awarded to USET area Indian undergraduate and graduate students who are enrolled members of one of the twenty-six USET member Tribes. Students must be in satisfactory standing and demonstrate a need for financial assistance.

Walmart Foundation Scholarship

Applicants must be the dependent of an associate (employee) of any division of Walmart who has been actively employed with Walmart for at least 6 consecutive months.

May

Actuarial Diversity Scholarship

The Actuarial Diversity Scholarship promotes diversity within the profession through an annual scholarship program for Black/African American, Hispanic, Native North American and Pacific Islander students.

AISES A. T. Anderson Memorial Scholarship

\$1,000 for undergraduates or \$2,000 for graduate students. Open to students pursuing degrees in Mathematics, Medical Sciences, Physical Science, Technology, Science, Engineering, or Natural Resources. This scholarship does not renew automatically, a student must complete a new application each year funding is sought.

American Indian College Fund Scholarships

American Indian College Fund provides scholarship support to each tribal college and university and administers several scholarship programs to American Indian and Alaska Native undergraduate and graduate students attending tribal colleges and state and private universities.

American Indian Services Scholarship

Applicants must be one-quarter (1/4) Northern-Native American Indian and enrolled in undergraduate studies at university, junior college, or technical school. Applicants must have at least a 2.25 GPA. Deadline is May 1st for a term starting in Jul/Aug/Sep.

Ann C. Thornton Memorial Fund Scholarship

Four \$1,000 awards will be selected for American Indian/ Alaska Native students who live in Oregon and who are enrolled (or will be enrolled) in a college or university in the fall. Criteria for selection will include: the student's GPA, financial need, extracurricular activities in school and in the community, and motivation.

Chevron Corporation Scholarship

\$5,000 for the academic year for undergraduate or graduate students. Must be pursuing a degree that is beneficial to Chevron business. This may include STEM degrees as well as business related studies.

C.T.U.I.R Higher Education & Adult Vocational Training Scholarship

Attached is the application for higher education or adult vocational training for CTUIR Members. The Priority Deadline for the school year is May 1st. Summer term application deadline is the first Friday in May. Summer term funding is based on degree coursework/completion (graduating) during the summer term or the only time a specific class is being offered and is a degree requirement. Official documentation is needed to support your request for funding.

C.T.U.I.R Tribal Health Commission Scholarship

If you are interested in continuing your education in a health related field, and are a CTUIR Member, we welcome you to fill out the attached application for scholarship. Summer term application deadline is the first Friday in May.

Ford Motor Company Tribal College Scholarship

Applicants must be a be a freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior in college, with a minimum 3.0 GPA, and majoring in Accounting, Computer Science, Engineering, Finance, Marketing, or Operations Management.

Frank Roberts Memorial Scholarship

Scholarships available for graduating senior and Head Start Parents and Staff. This scholarship is meant to promote educational opportunities for the Head Start community. The scholarship process is a wonderful opportunity to acknowledge just a few of the many committed members of our Head Start family. All OHSA scholarships are for \$2,000.

Hyatt Hotels Fund for Minority Lodging Management Students

In 1988, Hyatt established this fund to provide financial aid to minority students pursuing a degree in hotel management. Since 1988, approximately 351 minority students have received \$702,000 through this scholarship.

Intel Growing the Legacy Scholarship Program

The Intel Growing the Legacy Scholarship Program will support 20 graduate and 20 undergraduate students every year for four years. This Program includes financial support, mentorship, paid internship opportunities, and, upon successful graduation, employment opportunities with Intel. Scholarship Amounts: \$5,000 for undergraduates for the academic year (non-renewing, awardees are encouraged to re-apply each year) and \$10,000 for graduate students for the academic year (non-renewing, awardees are encouraged to re-apply each year)

LM Scholarship Program

Offered by Leavitt Machinery, a forklift company, the applicant is expected to be enrolled in a degree program (2-years or greater) in the Fall. Must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher, the scholarship value is \$500.

Native Vision Johns Hopkins School of Public Health Scholarship

Native Vision gives scholarships to outstanding American Indian students with a commitment to education, athletics and leadership. Eligibility Candidates must: 1. Be an enrolled member of a federally recognized tribe; 2. Demonstrate a sustained involvement in the community and an applied concern for American Indian issues and initiatives; 3. Maintain a grade point average (GPA) of at least 3.0 at the time of application; 4. Demonstrate involvement in extracurricular and/or athletic activities; 5. Be admitted to an accredited community college or four year undergraduate.

Ofield Dukes Multicultural Student Award

Scholarship is open to students entering their junior year this fall who are enrolled in journalism, public relations studies or courses preparing for a career in public relations. Applicants must also be of African-American/Black, Hispanic/Latino, Asian, Native American, Alaskan Native or Pacific Islander ancestry.

Oregon Student Child Care Grant

The Oregon Student Child Care Grant Program was established to assist parents enrolled in postsecondary education obtain safe, dependable care that supports their children's development while allowing completion of the parent's academic programs.

PRSA Diversity Multicultural Scholarship

Scholarships are open to talented communications undergraduate students who are of African-American/Black, Hispanic/Latino, Asian, Native American, Alaskan Native or Pacific Islander ancestry.

REDW Native American Scholarship in Accounting

This scholarship is funded by REDW, a national certified public accounting and business consulting firm that boasts many American Indian and Alaska Native tribes and enterprises among their clients. REDW recognizes not only the need for scholarship support for Native people to enter the field of accounting but also the need for students to gain valuable experience and mentorship in the field. REDW will support 2 students, studying Accounting, each year.

Saidie Orr Dunbar Nursing Scholarship

The Saidie Orr Dunbar Nursing Education Fund Trust was established by the Oregon Federation of Women's Clubs and the American Lung Association of Oregon in 1956 in recognition of Saidie Orr Dunbar who was a leader in the development of public health services in Oregon. The average award is \$1,000 to \$3,000. Applicants must have been accepted to a nursing degree program in an institution of higher learning and must practice in Oregon upon graduation. Particular emphasis is given to preparation in public health nursing.

Richard C. Alexander Scholarship

For Early Head Start Parents, this scholarship will be awarded annually to an Early Head Start Parent enrolling in a program of higher education.

Wells Fargo American Indian Scholarship

To be considered for the Wells Fargo scholarship, an applicant must: Be an enrolled member of a United States federally recognized American Indian tribe or Alaska Native group, as verified through submission of the AIGC Tribal Eligibility Certificate (TEC); Be pursuing a career and degree in fields relating to banking, resort management, gaming operations, management and administration, including accounting, finance, information technology and human resources; Be a college junior or senior at a U.S. accredited college or university as full time and degree seeking student maintaining an average GPA of a 3.00 on a 4.00 scale at the time of application; Demonstrate financial need through submission of the AIGC Financial Need Form (FNF).

Wells Fargo Scholarship for Undergraduates

The Wells Fargo Scholarships for Undergraduate American Indian and Alaska Native Students will fund full-time and degree-seeking college freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors who hold a current GPA of 2.7 or higher with up to \$5,000 for one year of study in any chosen major at any accredited institution in the United States.

Wilson-Hooper Veterinary Medicine Assistance Program

The Wilson-Hooper Veterinary Medicine Assistance Program provides scholarships to students pursuing veterinary medicine and veterinary technician degrees. If you love animals and possess the desire to pursue a degree at an accredited college or university, you may be qualified for funding from the Wilson-Hooper Vet Med Assistance Program.

June

AAIA Allogan Slagle Memorial Scholarship

AAIA provides undergraduate and graduate scholarships (including PhD, Law, and Medicine) to Native American/Alaska Native students from tribes that are not on the list of tribes recognized by the federal government in the amount of \$1,500 per year.

AAIA Sequoyah Graduate Scholarship

The Association on American Indian Affairs offers Sequoyah Graduate Scholarships to students in any curriculum. This scholarship does not automatically renew. Students are eligible to apply on a yearly basis.

AAIA Undergrad Scholarship

Must be enrolled in your tribe; must be attending an accredited school full time both fall and spring semesters; must be seeking an Associate's or Bachelor's degree. Open to high school seniors who will be entering college in the fall, College Freshman, sophomores, juniors and seniors.

A&F Business Consultants

The A&F Scholarships are available to all high school juniors and seniors as well as all students currently registered in any accredited post-secondary institution. To apply for this scholarship you will need to write an essay on the topic below. The essay should be between 500 and 1,000 words. Describe your educational career and life goals. Explain your plan for achieving these goals. Include your degree-major, why you selected it, and how this will help you achieve your goals.

Accenture American Indian Scholarship Fund

Students seeking a degree and career in fields of study including: various engineering, computer science, operations management, management, finance, marketing and other business oriented fields; Entering a U.S. accredited college or university full-time, degree seeking college undergraduate freshmen. Demonstrate character, personal merit and commitment to the American Indian Community locally and/or nationally.

American Indian Nurse Scholarship Program

Scholarship is open to American Indian college students enrolled in a nursing or health education program.

Association on American Indian Affairs, Inc. Scholarship Program

All scholarships are for graduate and undergraduate students from federally recognized tribes except for the Allogan Slagle Memorial Scholarship and David Risling Emergency Aid. Some of these scholarships are curriculum specific.

AWG Minority Scholarship

Scholarship is open to minority female students who are enrolled full-time in a geoscience program.

Big Sun Scholarship for Student Athletes

The BigSun Organization is proud to be able to help young athletes succeed in their academic pursuits. In order to do our part we are offering an annual scholarship to a deserving student. All student athletes are eligible for this award, regardless of which sport they are participating in.

Cherokee Nation College Resource Scholarship

The Cherokee Nation's Higher Education Office awards scholarships to selected Cherokee Nation Tribal Citizens pursuing degrees at a college or university accredited with Carnegie units.

C.T.U.I.R Higher Education & Adult Vocational Training Scholarship

Attached is the application for higher education or adult vocational training for CTUIR Members. Fall term/semester application deadline is the first Friday in June.

Cobell Scholars

This scholarship was established as a result of the Cobell v. Salazar litigation. The Cobell Scholars Program is intended to provide financial assistance in the form of scholarships to vocational schools and institutions of higher education, including graduate and professional schools. Scholarships in various amounts are awarded to US Federally-recognized American Indian and Alaska Native community members (students) who are vocational certificate-seeking or associate, bachelor, graduate and professional degree-seeking students in full-time, accredited, non-profit institutions in the US; and who are able to demonstrate financial need through the submission of the FAFSA.

ColoHealth "Healthcare in America" Scholarship

A \$500 scholarship essay contest for high school seniors or students enrolled full time in at least a 2-yr institution. Essay submissions must be at least 500 words. Please see the website for submission details. Scholarships will be awarded bi-annually.

Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars Scholarships

Open to Native American, certified tribal members with plans to work on a reservation. Must be an undergraduate junior or senior accepted to or already attending an accredited college/university, be carrying at least eight semester hours, and have a minimum 3.0 GPA. Must be US citizen and demonstrate financial need.

FLINTCO Scholarship

This is an undergraduate level scholarship for which applicants must possess a minimum 2.5 GPA; enrolled in a U.S. Federally Recognized tribe or Alaska Native group; be a full time incoming college sophomore, junior or senior seeking a degree and career in fields of study including: construction management; construction science; various engineering, and; safety or related fields.

Injury Law Diversity Scholarship Award

Scholarship is open to students who have been accepted to, or attending a four-year college program with the intention of pursuing a legal degree. Applicants must also be a member of an ethnic/racial minority or an individual who has made a demonstrative commitment to diversity issues within his or her school and/or community.

Loan for Service

AIGC administers a Bureau of Indian Education contract to provide financial assistance in the form of loans to eligible American Indian and Alaska Natives seeking graduate and professional degrees. The goal is to promote opportunities for careers with tribal governments, Bureau of Indian Affairs and Bureau of Indian Affairs—funded organizations on and off reservations. Loans are paid back at the rate of one year of service for one year of funding.

Lift Parts Express

A \$1,000 scholarship where applicants are asked to write an essay that outlines how much they expect to spend to finish their schooling, how they intend to pay for a higher education, and what they expect their job to be once they have received their degree.

Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarship Award

The scholarship is awarded to minority nominees who have demonstrated a need and a willingness to continue an educational mission toward a college education or graduate training related to a career in the criminal justice field. An ACA member must recommend nominations to the ACA Committee on Correctional Awards.

Nez Perce Homeland Project & Tamkaliks Scholarships

Four \$500 scholarships will be awarded. Three of these go to Native Americans; one is awarded to a Wallowa County student. One of the purposes of the Tamkaliks Celebration is to promote cultural understanding.

Odenza Vacations

One \$500 scholarship offered by a travel marketing company on the basis of an essay of up to 1,000 words on the topic: "Why do you want to go to College/University?"

Paumanauke Native American Indian Scholarship

Scholarship is open to tribally enrolled Native American Indians attending colleges, universities, and accredited post-secondary educational institutions on a full-time basis.

Washington State University MOU Tribal Scholarship

The MOU Tribal Scholarship was developed through the Provost Office of WSU for members of tribes that are signatory to a Memorandum of Understanding with WSU. The MOU Scholarship is for new incoming freshmen students and transfer students. A student is considered a freshman if they have fewer than 27 transfer college credits.

Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Scholarship

Tribal Scholarship is for CTWS tribal members, they must have a HS diploma/official transcripts or GED on file, apply for FAFSA, complete your BELOW 100 level classes, and when eligible, maintain a tribal scholarship requirement of 15 credits with a 2.50 GPA. Please refer to this site for additional information.

Flow Metrics, Inc. Annual General Science and Engineering Scholarship

Flowmetrics is pleased to announce our annual \$1,000 general science and engineering scholarship. If you are a currently enrolled student at an accredited college you are eligible and encouraged to apply.

Hard Money Lender Scholarship

SACNAS is a society of scientists dedicated to fostering the success of Chicano/Hispanic and Native American scientists – from college students to professionals – to attain advanced degrees, careers, and positions of leadership in science.

Yakama Nation College Students Rental Assistance

Beginning March 17, 2016 the Yakama Nation Higher Education will be taking applications for the YNHA Rental Assistance Program for eligible Yakama Tribal Members who are full time students and attending Higher Education Programs in the United States.

Yakama Nation Credit Enterprise Scholarship

Yakama Nation Credit Enterprise and Yakama Nation Higher Education have joined together to bring students a scholarship. Students who are majoring in Business, Accounting, Banking, Real Estate or closely related fields are eligible to apply. Must be a full-time student, enrolled Yakama Tribal Member, submit grade transcripts after each term.

Yakama Nation Environmental Excellence Scholarship

Students must be an enrolled Yakama member, and be enrolled in an accredited 2 or 4 year college or University in a field relating to, or in pursuit of, a degree applicable to Environmental Restoration Waste Management. Students must be enrolled full-time to qualify.

Yakama Nation Wak-Wei Scholarship

A generous donation has been made to the Yakama Nation by an anonymous donor in honor of a past Elder and leader of the Tribe and has selected the name “Wak-Wei Scholarship”. The scholarship will be administered through the Yakama Nation Higher Education Programs. The award is for \$500.00 for freshman and sophomores, (4 awards) and \$1,000.00 for junior/senior/graduate, (3 awards). The scholarship is for one academic year however award winners may re-apply each year.

August

American Indian Services Scholarship

Applicants must be one-quarter (1/4) Northern-Native American Indian and enrolled in undergraduate studies at university, junior college, or technical school. Applicants must have at least a 2.25 GPA. Deadline is August 1st for a term starting in Oct/Nov/Dec.

BIE STEM Loan for Service

AIGC administers a Bureau of Indian Education contract to provide financial assistance in the form of loans to eligible American Indian and Alaska Natives seeking graduate and professional degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM). The goal is to promote opportunities for careers with tribal governments, Bureau of Indian Affairs and Bureau of Indian Affairs—funded organizations on and off reservations. Loans are paid back at the rate of one year of service for one year of funding.

Varying Deadlines

AAAS Minority Science Writers Internship

The Diversity Scholarship focuses on broadening the number of traditionally underrepresented groups in the management and operation ranks of the transportation, travel, and tourism industry.

American Indian Nurse Scholarship Awards

The National Society of The Colonial Dames of America has provided a small number of scholarship awards to assist students of American Indian heritage who are pursuing degrees in nursing or in the field of health care and health education. Eligible students receive per semester and the money is to be used strictly for tuition, books or fees applicable to the student's approved program.

Catching The Dream Program

Catching the Dream seeks to address this deficiency. Our high-priority areas of study are math, engineering, science, business, education, and computers. These fields of study are critical to the future of Indian people and the nation, and Native Americans are very underrepresented in these fields.

Chafee Education and Training Grant

The Department of Human Services (DHS) Independent Living Program (ILP) has received Chafee Education and Training Voucher (ETV) funding to help current or former foster care youth with postsecondary education and training.

Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde Scholarships

The Higher Education Programs provide a comprehensive offering of Educational services to Tribal members. These services include funding for GED testing, full or part time college level courses, vocational training and personal enrichment opportunities. Please refer to the site of additional information.

Confederated Tribes of Siletz Scholarships

A variety of scholarships are available to enrolled members. Please refer to the website for due dates and additional information.

Coquille Indian Tribe Scholarships

Several scholarships are available for enrolled members. Please refer to the site for additional information and due dates.

Council of Energy Resource Tribes (CERT) Scholarships

The CERT Scholarship Program was created to meet the unforeseen need of today's American Indian college students. CERT Scholarships may be used for books, living expenses, clothing, or other similar needs to assist students in defraying the high costs of education. The award is a gift from the Council of Energy Resource Tribes and should not be counted toward any financial aid the student is currently receiving. A CERT Scholarship is not based on financial need.

Fathom Fountains Scholarship Award

Accepts applicants year round. Students from all walks of life are encouraged to apply for the FathomFountains.com scholarship opportunity. Students who plan to attend college or a university or those who are already enrolled and will be attending an additional year of education can apply for the scholarship. There is no age requirement for college scholarships offered by us.

George A. Strait Minority Scholarships

George A. Strait Minority Scholarships are awarded annually to college graduates with meaningful law library experience who are members of a minority group as defined by current U.S. government guidelines, are degree candidates in an accredited library or law school, and who intend to have a career in law librarianship. Applicants must show evidence of financial need. To apply for the George A. Strait Minority Scholarship, you must also qualify for one of the AALL Educational Scholarships.

IIE UPS Scholarship for Minority Students

IIE's scholarship and fellowship program is in place to recognize graduate and undergraduate industrial engineering students for academic excellence and campus leadership. The UPS Scholarship for Minority Students is available to undergraduate students enrolled in any school in the United States and its territories, Canada, and Mexico, where the school's industrial engineering program or equivalent is accredited by an agency or organization recognized by IIE and the student is pursuing a course of study in industrial engineering.

Zonta International: Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship

Women of any age, pursuing an accredited business or business-related program who demonstrate outstanding potential in the field, are eligible and encouraged to apply. For a full list of the eligibility and application requirements, please refer to the application.

Internships/Fellowships

AAAS Minority Science Writers Internship

This program places minority students interested in journalism as a career and who want to learn about science writing at Science Magazine for 10 weeks over the summer. Interns experience what it's like to cover the scientific and technological issues that shape our global community.

AICPA Fellowships for Minority Doctoral Students

The AICPA Fellowship for Minority Doctoral Students ensures that CPAs of diverse backgrounds are visible in college and university classrooms. The AICPA Foundation awards annual fellowships to full-time minority accounting scholars who demonstrate significant potential to become accounting educators.

AIGC Fellowship

Graduate fellowships are monetary awards made to American Indian and Alaska Native graduate or professional full-time, degree-seeking students, who meet all eligibility criteria. The fellowship amount is typically between \$1000 and \$5000 per academic year (not including summer), and varies from year to year, depending on the number of qualified applicants, the availability of funds and unmet financial need.

APSA Minority Fellowship Program

Minority Fellows Program is a fellowship competition for individuals from under-represented backgrounds applying to doctoral programs in political science. The MFP was established in 1969 (originally as the Black Graduate Fellowship) to increase the number of minority scholars in the discipline.

ASA Minority Fellowship Program

Minority Fellowship Program applicants can be new or continuing graduate students. However, the MFP is primarily designed for minority students entering a doctoral program in sociology for the first time or for those who are in the early stages of their graduate programs. MFP applicants must be applying to or enrolled in sociology departments which have strong mental health research programs and/or faculty who are currently engaged in research focusing on mental health issues.

ASM Undergraduate Research Fellowship (ASM-URF)

The ASM Undergraduate Research Fellowship (URF) is aimed at highly competitive students who wish to pursue graduate careers (Ph.D. or M.D./Ph.D.) in microbiology. Students will have the opportunity to conduct full time research at their home institutions with an ASM member and present research results at ASM Microbe the following year.

Chips Quinn Scholars Program

The program, operated by the Newseum Institute and funded by the Freedom Forum, matches qualified candidates with participating news organizations from across the country for 10- to 12-week paid internships. Selected scholars participate in an intense, one-week orientation/multimedia training workshop at the John Seigenthaler Center in Nashville, Tenn., in preparation for their internships. The training in Nashville is paid for by the Newseum Institute.

CRITFC TRAIL Project - Summer Field Experience

Deepen your understanding through a TRAIL summer internship. The Teaching Rising American Indian Leaders—Internship Project offers practical experience and mentoring for students pursuing Science, Technology, Engineering & Math (STEM) degrees by providing research experience, mentoring, and an opportunity to explore career options in natural resources.

CRITFC TRAIL Project - Research Internship

Deepen your understanding through a TRAIL internship during the academic year. The Teaching Rising American Indian Leaders—Internship Project offers practical experience and mentoring for students studying for degrees and preparing for careers in Science, Technology, Engineering & Math (STEM). Applications are due one month prior to the start of the project.

CWGCS Fellowship on Women & Public Policy

The fellowship is an intensive leadership development program designed to maximize the skills and contributions of women to achieve excellence in public service. The fellowship program is open to graduate students and working professionals who have successfully completed a minimum of 12 graduate credits in any academic discipline and have a minimum of 3-5 years work experience.

EPA Environmental Research and Business Support (ERBS) Program

The purpose of the EPA Environmental Research and Business Support Program is to address EPA's need to increase the supply of promising scientists, engineers, and administrative personnel in disciplines related to the EPA mission. This program provides opportunities for exceptional undergraduate and graduate students and recent bachelor's, master's, and postdoctoral graduates to work in the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Office of Research and Development (ORD) research and administrative projects at multiple EPA laboratories and research centers.

Fish & Wildlife Service Internships

Employment with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is an effective way for students to gain work experience, earn money, and establish a career in conservation and natural resources. There are employment opportunities for students in high school through graduate school ranging from summer work to year-round internships that could lead to permanent positions.

Friends of Tryon Creek - Outreach & Membership Intern (Unpaid)

The intern will fill 2-3 shifts per week at the front desk of the Tryon Creek Nature Center, promoting Membership with FOTC, and providing visitors with information about the park, our programs and events. The intern will also spend one additional shift at a table outside on the trails focused on Membership promotion and volunteer recruitment. The intern will also assist staff in the development of a social media plan to grow FOTC's engagement and followers online.

Indian Land Tenure Foundation Internship Program

The College Internship Program is designed to work with colleges and universities in offering a college internship opportunity for students to become directly involved in land tenure issues for college credit. This program places students at a tribal office working directly on land tenure issues under the supervision of appropriate tribal office staff and college faculty.

ITEP Environmental Education Outreach Program Internship

Since 1994, the Institute for Tribal Environmental Professionals (ITEP) has offered student summer internships for Native American and other college students with funding from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA). This program provides the opportunity for students to gain hands-on skills with EPA or other governmental and tribal environmental offices.

Mosaics in Science (MIS) Diversity Internship Program

The Mosaics in Science (MIS) Diversity Internship Program provides college students and recent graduates 18-35 years old that are under-represented in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) career fields with on-the-ground, natural resource science-based, work experience in the National Park System. Each internship is comprised of working eleven weeks in a park followed by a four-day career workshop held in Washington, D.C.

NAPIRE (Native American and Pacific Islander Research Experience) in Costa Rica

Undergraduates will be selected through a competitive application process for a nine-week research program at La Selva Research Station or Las Cruces Research Station in Costa Rica. Students will live immersed in a rich academic community of researchers conducting novel tropical research and will attend workshops on field skills, current research in tropical biology, international research ethics, statistics, and scientific written and oral communication.

National Science Foundation Research Experiences for Undergraduates

NSF funds a large number of research opportunities for undergraduate students through its REU Sites program. An REU Site consists of a group of ten or so undergraduates who work in the research programs of the host institution. Each student is associated with a specific research project, where he/she works closely with the faculty and other researchers. Students are granted stipends and, in many cases, assistance with housing and travel.

Native American Political Leadership Program

The Native American Political Leadership Program (NAPLP) is a full scholarship for Native American, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian students who want to take part in Semester in Washington Politics. It is open to undergraduate and graduate students, including those who have completed their undergraduate degree but have not yet enrolled in a graduate program.

NCAI Native Graduate Health Fellowship

Applicants should be members of an American Indian or Alaska Native tribal nation and must be new or continuing full-time students in the Fall of 2016 pursuing graduate or professional degrees in any health-related area, including Doctor of Medicine (MD), Master of Nursing (MSN), Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP), Master of Public Health (MPH), Master of Pharmacy (MPharm), etc.

NCAI: Wilma Mankiller Fellowship

An internship with NCAI offers a unique opportunity for young leaders from throughout Indian Country—as well as for other young leaders with an interest in Native affairs, to be on the front lines of legislative action and policy development from within the oldest, largest, and most representative American Indian and Alaska Native organization.

NOAA Climate & Global Change Postdoctoral Fellowships

Applicants must have a PhD degree in an area related to climate change research and have completed defense of the degree before starting the fellowship. Preference is given to new graduates who are seeking their first fellowship and who have held a PhD for no more than three years. We encourage applications from women and minorities and U.S. citizenship is not a requirement.

OMSI Internships

Our program is competitive, but we're eager to hear from you. Internships are unpaid and are typically a twelve-week commitment.

Predoctoral Fellowship

Fellowship is open to all citizens, and permanent residents of the United States, as well as individuals granted deferred action status under the DACA program. Applicants must be enrolled or planning to enroll in an eligible research-based program leading to a Ph.D. or Sc.D. degree at a non-proprietary U.S. institution of higher education. Applicants must be committed to a career in teaching and research at the college or university level.

Presidential Management Fellowship

The Presidential Management Fellows (PMF) Program is administered by the U.S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM). Each year, candidates apply to the program in efforts to be selected as Finalists. Finalists are then eligible for appointment as Presidential Management Fellows (Fellows; PMFs).

Science to Action Fellowship Program

The program is open to Master's and Doctoral students in MSU's Department of Fisheries and Wildlife or at any Climate Science Center consortium institution. Students must be enrolled at the institution for the entire fellowship year.

Klamath Tribes Scholarships

This is an assistance program that serves as a secondary resource to supplement training institutions' financial aid package which is applied for by a Klamath Tribes member. Awards vary and depend on an individual's financial need and availability of funding.

Udall Native American Congressional Internship

The Native American Congressional Internship Program provides American Indian and Alaska Native students with the opportunity to gain practical experience with the federal legislative process in order to understand first-hand the government-to-government relationship between Tribes and the federal government.

Washington Internship for Native Students

American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian (AI/AN/NH), and other students enrolled in a college or university as a sophomore, junior, senior, or graduate student in good academic standing are eligible to participate in the WINS program. Sophomores must have completed the equivalent of three (3) semesters of full time study to be eligible to participate in the program.

WSU Undergraduate Research Opportunity: Data-intensive research in the environmental sciences

Participants must be currently registered at a two or four year college, and may not have received their Bachelor's degree prior. Women, members of demographic groups traditionally underrepresented in environmental fields, and students from community colleges or institutions that do not offer research opportunities for undergraduates are particularly encouraged to apply. You must be a U.S. Citizen or permanent resident in order to receive NSF funding.

Oregon Community Colleges

Blue Mountain Community College Foundation Scholarships

The BMCC Foundation and Financial Aid office attempt to post all local and national scholarship opportunities. Most scholarship applications are due March through May for funding fall term. Mid-year scholarships are sometimes made available. Please check back often for updated information. Most scholarships require you to submit an essay.

Central Oregon Community College Foundation Scholarships

Each year the COCC Foundation offers nearly 350 awards totaling \$1.5 million for local students. A scholarship is easy to apply for and can be renewed for two additional years.

Chemeketa Community College Foundation Scholarships

The application is available online beginning February 1st and ending March 31st. Scholarships are awarded each year beginning at the end of May. The Foundation will continue awarding first-round scholarships through July. Students are encouraged to continue checking their My Chemeketa email account weekly for a scholarship notification through the beginning of fall term as scholarships will continue to be reoffered.

Clackamas Community College Scholarships

CCC awards more than \$700,000 in scholarships each year to local students like you. More than 275 scholarships are available and you don't have to have a perfect GPA to qualify. Applications are due Oct. 31 at midnight. It's worth the time to apply.

Clatsop Community College Scholarships

CCC foundation manages approximately \$2.9 Million in privately donated funds which provide scholarships for CCC students and funding for CCC programs.

Columbia Gorge Community College Foundation Scholarships

Columbia Gorge Community College Foundation is pleased to offer its students tuition scholarships provided by the Foundation Board and their generous donors. Scholarships are available to any student who is not funded by an outside agency.

Southwestern Oregon Community College Foundation Scholarships

In addition to direct Foundation scholarships, the College also provides approximately \$800,000 annually in direct assistance and tuition waivers to students attending Southwestern. Application cycle is open annually from January 1st -March 1st for SOCC students.

Tillamook Bay Community College Scholarships
