FIRST DAY OF SPRING

The Spring season on average is 92.758 days long. The Spring season this year will end June 21st, so this spring season is 92 days, 17 hrs, and 33 minutes long. On the first day of Spring, a person at the North Pole would see the sun skimming across the horizon, beginning six months of uninterrupted daylight. A person at the South Pole would see the sun skimming across the horizon, signaling the start of six months of darkness.


VOCAL






TRENDING


