

### Analysis

- This option moves some students from west of 41 to Rockfield in order to have the Windsong Circle area put into the County Line attendance area
- This results in a clean looking map that is easy for people to understand where they are attending
- There are two main downsides to this map as drawn: Rockfield has little room for growth and County Line has an enormous amount of current 3rd (next year 4th) graders
- Even though most of the developments are in the MacArthur area and Mac has the most room for growth, any significant growth in the Rockfield area would result in reassessing boundaries in the near future
