
AGENDA ITEM: VII. A. Elementary Boundary Changes – Busing Impact

Background:

A request was received from Mr. & Mrs. Rogowski to provide transportation for their child(ren) to St. Mary's school in Menomonee Falls. Their request is attached.

They live in the St. Boniface attendance area. The board is under no obligation to transport them, but may.

Subsequent to the request, I contacted officials from the Catholic Archdiocese, which is the governing body for determining Catholic School attendance areas; St. Mary's school; Riteway Bus Company; and Mrs. Rogowski. I had general conversations with all.

Keep in mind that the Archdiocese doctrine requires parish officials to make the determination on attendance boundaries.

The attached information from the Rogowski's has incorrect map contained in it – labeled as Attachment A. I confirmed with both the Archdiocese & St. Mary's officials that the map contained in my files is correct & current, and both organizations agreed. The map is attached.

In 2012 the school board analyzed the St. Bonifice and St. Mary's bussing. It concluded that it would continue to transport student from the St. Mary attendance area defined as south of Donges Bay and east of Pilgrim roads to St. Bonifice. While the board is not legal required to do so, it may.

Currently about 33 students are transported from the St. Mary attendance area to St. Boniface.

Dear Germantown Wisconsin School Board,

This letter serves as a request for your consideration in providing equal access to bus transportation to all taxpaying members of the Germantown community to their school of choice. Our request is joined by fifteen (15) members of the Germantown School District community and is substantiated by two (2) principles.

1st We desire equal access to transportation from our Germantown residence to our school of choice and

2nd We deem the additional cost of transportation to be immaterial to the total cost of transportation in the Germantown school district.

First, we desire equal access to public transportation to our school of choice. Our request is supported by the following Wisconsin Statutes.

Per Wisconsin Statute 121.51(2)(c) "Transportation may be provided for all or some of the pupils who reside in the school district to and from the public school they are entitled to attend or the private school, within or outside the school district, within whose attendance area they reside."

The attendance area is defined in section 121.51(1) as "...the geographic area designated by the governing body of a private school...the attendance areas of private schools affiliated with the same religious denomination shall not overlap...". The catholic schools of St. Mary and St. Boniface are governed by the Archdioceses of Milwaukee which has outlined the attendance areas as highlighted in attachment A.

Further, section 121.54(2)(c) continues "...the school board of a unified school district may elect to provide transportation for pupils who are not required to be transported under this section...if transportation is provided, there shall be reasonable uniformity in the minimum distance that pupils attending public and private schools will be transported."

At the June 25th, 2012 Germantown School District meeting, the Board voted in favor of providing complimentary access to public transportation to St. Boniface students outside the St. Boniface attendance area. While the decision to offer complimentary access to transportation when not required is within the authority of the school board, it violates the statues above by first providing an overlapping attendance area and second the access is not uniformly distributed to all members

of the Germantown community. Therefore, it is our request that the Germantown School Board considers uniformity and expands access to public transportation to all Germantown citizens to and from St. Mary private school.


Second, we would like to address the possible concern that the cost of transportation would be a strain on the school transportation budget. We do not believe the cost to be prohibitive considering a number of economical options available to the Germantown School District. It is our understanding that Germantown pupils attending Grace Lutheren School on Kenwood Boulevard in Menomonee Falls receive access to transportation. Not only is Grace Lutheran less than two blocks away from St. Mary School on Cleveland Avenue, but the majority of the Germantown students requesting transportation are within a few blocks of current Grace Lutheren students. Therefore, it is our proposal to incorporate the students seeking transportation into exisiting bus routes for the Grace Lutheren School which has abundent excess capacity. Finally, it should be noted that the transportation cost-per-student would be comparable if not less than the cost of transporting the St. Boniface pupils outside their attendance area due to minimal overlapping bus routes. Please see map provided in attachment B which defines the distance from Grace Lutheren to St. Mary School.

In summary, we appreciate the Germantown School Board's careful consideration of its tax payers' petition for uniform access to economic transportation to all Germantown citizens to and from St. Mary private school. As mentioned, our request is joined and supported by fifteen (15) additional Germantown School Disctrict members in attachment C who are currently denied access to transportatation. We look forward to an opportunity to discuss this matter at an upcoming board meeting.


East (North to South)
