- Remote learning with live teaching was discussed. We are adding time for our Unified Arts classes to participate with each of their unique requirements. We discussed the need for more time between classes (according to our students - for bathroom breaks and completing work). We discussed the positive parent feedback we have received and the (time) limits that our remote students can stay focused and engaged.

- **Math for Life Goals:**
  - Goal One:** We continue to receive input from staff and parents on speakers that have a successful life because of they embraced mathematical concepts that they use daily. We will reach out to the suggested people for visits and class presentations as soon as that is permitted.
  - Goal Two:** The math department met and worked in conjunction with the Unified Arts Dept. to establish a math peer tutoring program. We are looking at holding this during homeroom - but in the gym - three times a week . Teachers would survey which students are interested in helping others and a Unified Arts teacher would provide supervision at the sessions.
- Susan Stein is willing to be a virtual speaker through the Classrooms Without Borders program. She can address issues pertaining to prejudice, racism, and the Holocaust. This would tie into the focus on Black History Month during February.
- Construction: The beams for the second floor of our new addition are now visible. ADA updates to all restrooms in the main building are complete. The construction teams are making use of the days that students are virtual to complete HVAC and electrical updates.
