ELECTIVE DESCRIPTIONS

<u>Visual Art</u>

2D ART EXPLORATION 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Schroeder

Experiment with a wide range of materials and techniques and learn fundamental skills and concepts associated with 2D works of art such as color theory, basic drawing and painting techniques, printmaking, collage, photography, graphic design and much more! This course will explore new materials and styles of art, while reinforcing old concepts and building on prior knowledge and experience.

3D ART EXPLORATION 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Schroeder

Learn the foundational skills for creating sculptural art pieces. In this course, we use a variety of different sculpture materials such as plaster, paper mache, clay, wire, found object, and much more! We will discuss various techniques and styles of 3D works as well as understand the ways in which 3D works function in the art world.

PAINTING 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Schroeder

Explore and strengthen your skills in drawing and painting! We will learn about color theory, abstract, non-objective, figurative, realism, portraiture, and many more styles of painting. We will focus on materials and tool use, composition, observational and exploratory painting styles using fun, challenging painting prompts!

ART STUDIO 1 QTR (Prerequisite Required: 2D Art Exploration, 3D Art Exploration, Drawing or Painting)

Instructor: Mrs. Schroeder

Have an artistic vision you want to explore? In Art Studio, you will have the freedom and challenge of researching, creating and presenting your own original artwork, as a real artist would! Using creative habits of mind, and artist behaviors you will apply your knowledge, skills, art making techniques and processes learned in 2D Art, 3D Art, Drawing and or Painting electives to enhance your experience with art. We will be creating works of art as a class as well as independently led projects.

Family and Consumer Science

CULINARY ARTS 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Koch

Develop life-long culinary skills in Introduction to Culinary Arts. Food science principles and culinary techniques are applied as students prepare a variety of recipes in the lab. There is an emphasis on healthy eating and nutrition. Career exploration in related fields of study will be incorporated.

INTRO TO SEWING 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Koch

This course is designed for the student to explore and understand the various facets of today's fashion industry. Areas included are fashion design and principles of marketing related to the industry. Students will also sew a variety of garments while in class.

PASTRY ARTS 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Koch

Pastry Arts is a hands-on lab course. Students will apply the food science principles learned in the Pastry Arts classroom during their lab experiences. Areas of emphasis are quick breads, yeast breads, cakes, cookies, and pies. Cross-curricular academics include culinary math, literacy comprehension, and food science principles.

WORLD FOODS 1 QTR (Prerequisite Required: Taken Culinary Arts and/or Pastry Arts)

Instructor: Mrs. Koch

This course offers the opportunity to explore the customs and methods of food preparation used in other countries and in regional sections of the United States. Foods and holidays of a variety of ethnic groups will be studied. Geography and its relation to the production of food and ethnic diets will also be explored.

Music: Instrumental and Vocal

ALL THINGS VOCAL 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Kruiswyk

This class is for students who like to sing! Students will study and perform solo, small ensemble, and large ensemble vocal music as well as study many different genres of music including: blues, gospel, jazz, sacred, acapella, pop, and show-tunes. Vocal concepts that will be taught include breathing techniques, principles of tone production, blending vocally with others, pitch, solfege and rhythm reading. Students will record themselves singing solo or in small ensembles.

HANDS ON MUSIC 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Kruiswyk

This class will focus on continuing to learn and perform a variety of musical instruments, including: piano, guitar, ukulele, choirchimes, and world drums. Students will also spend some time creating music with the composing and music mixing programs of Soundtrap and Garageband.

MUSICAL COMPOSITION 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Kruiswyk

Turn on the radio and you are hearing the results of melody, harmony, and rhythm coming together to create a work of art. In this class, students will study the basic principles of reading and writing music. Students will be introduced to the computer composing and mixing programs, Finale Printmusic, Ableton, Soundtrap and Garageband. Students will also learn a few basic songs on the piano.

SYMPHONIC BAND 2 QTRS

Instructor: Mrs. Fiebrandt

Band is a performance-based music class designed to introduce students to a variety of band literature, develop technique on your instrument, and improve notation reading and tone production, while working on proper rehearsal ensemble skills (enthusiasm and teamwork are essential). This class is ideal for any student who already plays a concert wind band instrument. This includes woodwind, brass and percussion. Piano players will be accepted if they are prepared to use their skills on mallets or percussion instruments. There will be many performance opportunities including evening concerts, solo/ensemble festival, and elected performances in ILMEA to name a few. Students must own/rent a band instrument that is in proper playing condition. All students who are interested in learning new and exciting ways to express themselves through music are encouraged to sign up for band!

SYMPHONIC ORCHESTRA 2 QTRS

Instructor: Ms. Turner

Orchestra is a performance-based music class designed to introduce students to a variety of orchestra literature, develop technique, and improve notation reading and tone production, while working on proper rehearsal ensemble skills and having fun! This class is ideal for any string instrumentalist (violin, viola, cello, bass) already playing in Concert Orchestra. There will be many performance opportunities including evening concerts, solo/ensemble festival, and elected performance in ILMEA! Students must own/rent an orchestra instrument that is in proper playing condition. All students who are interested in learning new and exciting ways to express themselves through music are encouraged to sign up for orchestra!

<u>Other</u>

SHARK TANK 2 QTRS

Instructor: Mrs. Douglas

Are you innovative? Are you a problem solver? Do you like to make money? Well it's time to put it all together and create a product or service that you will pitch to the Shark Tank! Get approved and take it to market! During this semester, students will learn how to solve a problem by creating a new and innovative solution. Students will then pitch their product or service to the Shark Tank. Once the idea is approved, students will begin production and marketing to sell their product or service on a marketplace. Throughout the semester, students will work with mentors who will bring their real world expertise to the class.

BE THE CHANGE 1 QTR

Instructors: Mrs. McGrath and Mr. Sturm

This elective course allows McClure students to learn about social issues that exist, both within McClure and in the larger community, so they can look at the world with an empathetic lens. You will explore topics related to identity, stereotypes, bias, racism, poverty, and LGTBQ+ rights, and you will begin to recognize the agency individuals have in promoting equity and change. This class will challenge you to look at yourself, reflect on contributing factors to social issues and become the change we need. This class will deal with mature topics, tailored for 7th and 8th graders.

BRIDGE TO HIGH SCHOOL GEOMETRY 1 QTR

Instructor: Mr. Harris

(Must be enrolled in 8th grade advanced math)

Not sure what to expect of "High School Math"? This one-quarter class will preview High School Geometry for 8th graders and help ease the transition from the more Algebra-centered focus of the current Middle School Common Core curriculum. This elective will provide students' exposure to geometry concepts beyond those covered in their current math classes, including an introduction to the art of writing proofs as an area of emphasis.

Chicago: City of Stories 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Rees

Our goal is to understand and create new ways to share the rich and diverse stories of human experiences in our Windy City. If you love to ask questions and find your own answers, this is the elective for you! Join us to ask and answer insightful questions about the unique stories of the people, places, landmarks, businesses, and events that came together to make Western Springs such an amazing place to live and learn.

Curious City: Western Springs Edition 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Rees

If you love to ask questions and find your own answers, this is the elective for you! Join us to ask and answer insightful questions about the unique stories of the people, places, landmarks, businesses, and events that came together to make Western Springs such an amazing place to live and learn.

When Am I Ever Going to Use This Stuff? 1 QTR

Instructor: Dr. Barnhart

Weekly themes will range from finance and investing to personality and learning inventories to life basics such as how to change a car tire or how to make a great first impression to timely and important current events. Weekly themes will be supported by a "question of the day" that will be the basis for each class period's discussion and work. Life is a participation sport and so is this elective, so plan to come ready to dive in, discuss, debate, learn, and apply that learning in your daily living.

<u>Spanish</u>

7th GRADE SPANISH (Semester 1 High School Course) ALL YEAR - 4 QTRS

Instructor: Mrs. Douglas

This year-long Spanish class is aligned with Semester 1 of LT's Spanish I program. Students who take Spanish in both 7th and 8th grade at McClure generally enter Spanish II as a freshman (or a comparable native speaker course).

Students electing to take Spanish at McClure should expect it to add an academic course to their workload. Class activities incorporate Spanish conversation, grammar, geography and culture. Nightly practice of learning is essential for success.

8th GRADE SPANISH (Semester 2 High School Course) ALL YEAR - 4 QTRS (7th grade Spanish Required)

Instructor: Mr. Bauer

This year-long Spanish class is aligned with Semester 2 of LT's Spanish I program. Students who take Spanish in both 7th and 8th grade at McClure generally enter Spanish II as a freshman (or a comparable native speaker course).

Students electing to take Spanish at McClure should expect it to add an academic course to their workload. Class activities incorporate Spanish conversation, grammar, geography, and culture. Nightly practice of learning is essential for success.

Note: Credit for the 2 year MC course at LT follows successful (C or higher) grade in the next course in the sequence. This general credit (not a foreign language credit) appears on student transcripts after successful completion at LT.

Study Skills

QUARTER STUDY SKILLS 1 QTR

OR

ANNUAL STUDY SKILLS ALL YEAR - 4 QTRS

Study Skills courses provide time for students to practice and develop good student habits. Time management, prioritization, focus, and organization are all skills practiced under the supervision of a teacher. Students will also have time to complete classroom assignments and homework during this course.

<u>STEM</u>

BULLDOG PODCAST 1 QTR (May be taken twice)

Instructor: Mrs. Federman

Join the Bulldog Podcast to be part of a weekly news team about all things McClure. In this class we will learn how to record, edit, produce and compile a weekly podcast. Topics ranging from student/teacher interviews, updates on school events such as sports, clubs, fundraising events, etc.

CREATIVE TECHNOLOGIES 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Kruiswyk

In this class, students will use the computer as a tool for creative expression with a focus on art and music. Aspects of the class will focus on stop motion projects, green screen applications, sound effects and movie score creation, and 3D exploration and imagery.

DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Federman

This course will help students become well rounded in the fundamentals of digital photography. Four areas of instruction will be emphasized: how cameras work, photo composition principles, lighting, and the use of photo-editing software.

ELITE SQUAD 1 QTR

Instructor: Mr. Ryan

Computer Repair Introduction program is designed to prepare students for entry into the Information Technology (IT) Industry. Students will have the opportunity to work on actual and virtual computer equipment to expand their experiences. This course focuses on the general setup and repair of laptop/desktop computer and although it includes general ways to resolve any general type of issue, it focuses primarily on Chromebooks and the Chrome OS with an overview of Apple and Mac OS based machines.

FUSE 1 QTR

Instructor: Mrs. Federman

This class is designed around interests in music, design, and pop culture and are embedded with STEAM practices. There is no math, science or tech knowledge necessary. In FUSE, students choose challenges and create and learn at their own rate. You can create a roller coaster track, 3d design a cookie cutter, design selfie stickers and more!

FUSE 2 1 QTR (Prerequisite: FUSE)

Instructor: Mrs. Federman

FUSE 2 is for 8th graders who've completed FUSE 1. You've experienced the beginning and now you can explore further into all challenges. You can create a controller for a video game, train a robot, design and 3d print a car, and more!.

GAME PROGRAMING USING UNITY 2D/3D 1 QTR

Instructor: Mr. Ryan

From Infinite Runners to Flappy Bird Clones or even MMORPGs, utilizing the Unity 2D/3D engine, students will write their own video games. Students will learn to storyboard their game, create characters, manage camera angles and create visually stunning lighting effects. Completed projects may even be ported to Android for download from the D101 Google Play Store or leveraging C++ programming, made into Microsoft Windows[™] based games.New this year!

Introduction to Automotive Repair 1 QTR (Prerequisite: Elite Squad)

Instructor: Mr. Ryan

New this year! If you love vehicles and learning by doing, then this is a class for you. Through the use of digital simulations students will be introduced to automotive systems and how to repair them. Learn how all the systems in a modern car work together!

Coding & Robotics 1 QTR

Instructor: Ms. Kelly

In this hands-on course students will learn to code Edison robots using Python programming. There are a series of tasks & challenges to compete that will sharpen your coding skills. If you have experience with drag & drop block coding, this will build upon your previous knowledge & enhance your coding abilities. In this class, students will begin to develop the necessary skills needed for success in Musical Theatre, including singing, acting and performance skills. Students will study vocal styles, acting styles, theatre history, audition skills, backstage production terminology, choreography, rehearsal techniques, and performance techniques. Within the class, students will be singing songs, and acting scenes from some of their favorite shows such as *Wicked*, *Hairspray*, *Grease*, *The Sound of Music*, *Guys and Dolls*, and many more.

THEATRE 1 QTR (May be taken twice)

Instructor: Mrs. Federman

This class is for students interested in studying and performing theatre. We will focus on movement, vocal control and characterization skills. Students will participate in pantomime, scene study, monologues and improvisation. Through these activities, students will develop knowledge of theatre arts and physical and vocal presentation skills. Evaluation will be based primarily on in-class performance.
