## **MOBILE COVID-19 VACCINATION CLINIC COMING TO Hobart, Lake County**

Hobart — The Indiana Department of Health is hosting a free mobile vaccination clinic as part of its ongoing efforts to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

**WHEN:** May 11<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup> from 9am to 6pm  
Please enter Door 13

**WHERE:** Hobart High School – 2211 East 10<sup>th</sup> Street, Hobart, IN 46342

**HOW:** Register online by visiting [ourshot.in.gov](https://ourshot.in.gov) or call 211 (866-211-9966) from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. CDT daily and a representative will schedule an appointment for you. Appointments are encouraged, but walk-ins are accepted while vaccine supplies last.

“This mobile vaccination site is one more way we are working to give all Hoosiers convenient access to COVID-19 vaccine in their communities,” said State Health Commissioner Kris Box, MD, FACOG. “I encourage everyone who hasn’t been vaccinated yet to take advantage of this safe, effective vaccine, which is the best protection we have against this virus.”

Here are some additional facts:

- The vaccine is available at no cost, but insurance information is requested, because an administration fee may be charged.
- This site offers the one-dose Johnson and Johnson vaccine (authorized for those 18 years of age and older).
- Proof of age will be required at the appointment. Proof of residency is not required.
- After receiving the vaccine, recipients should sign up for V-safe, the after-vaccination health checker, on any smartphone, at [vsafe.cdc.gov](https://vsafe.cdc.gov).

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, if you’ve been fully vaccinated (two weeks after receiving your final vaccine dose):

- You can gather indoors with fully vaccinated people without wearing a mask or staying 6 feet apart.
- You can gather indoors with unvaccinated people of any age from one other household (for example, visiting with relatives who all live together) without masks or staying 6 feet apart, unless any of those people or anyone they live with has an increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19.

- If you've been around someone who has COVID-19, you do not need to stay away from others or get tested unless you have symptoms.

Once you're fully vaccinated, you should still:

- Wear a mask and socially distance when in public or visiting an unvaccinated person at increased risk of severe illness or death from COVID-19
- Avoid medium- or large-sized gatherings
- Protect yourself while traveling
- Get tested and stay home if symptoms develop
