The students will be responsible for studying their vocabulary words from the novel studies and targeted skills found in their notebook. Students should read every night in their library books.

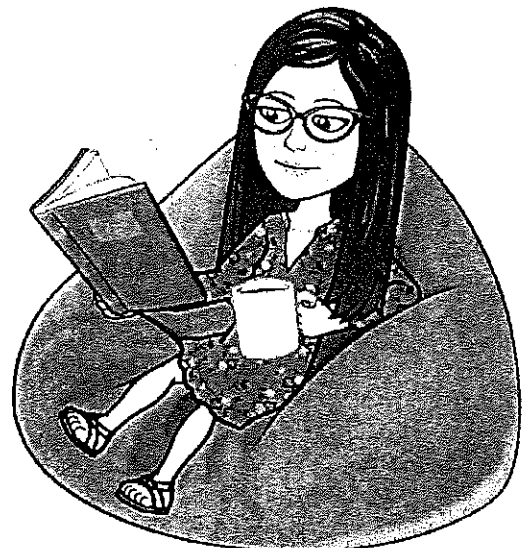
Academic Dishonesty

Class Expectations:

Classroom Procedures:

Expectations: Students will come to class prepared to work every day. Students will have necessary supplies for completing work assignments. All homework assignments are to be done at home before coming to school the following day. If students are absent when a homework assignment is due, the homework should be turned in to the teacher upon return to class. Students are responsible for completing any missed work if an absence occurs. Missing assignments are graded as zeros. *Students are expected to participate and listen closely in class.

Cell phone and Device Usage: In complying with the Student Handbook, students will **not** need to bring a cell phone to my classroom because we work bell to bell and will not have any non-instructional time. 6th graders will use their laptops to complete assignments. Since we are a 1:1 class, any other devices are not needed and are only a distraction. All devices should remain in their lockers or homeroom. 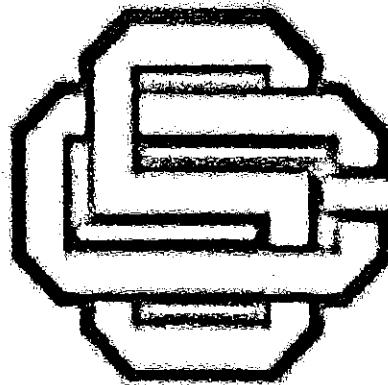

Grading:

Expectations:

Students are expected to come to class prepared and with the correct items for daily work while also participating and listening closely during the conduction of class. We will also be respectful toward everyone, both adults and peers. Organization is critical! Students will be expected to maintain all gear in a neat and orderly fashion. All homework assignments should be completed before coming to class the following day.

If a student misses any assignments, it is the student's responsibility to work out a time with the teacher to make up the assignment. Missing assignments are recorded as a Zero until the assignment is completed. All missing assignments should be completed in a timely manner, but no later than three business days after the missed assignment upon the student's return.

Frequently Asked Questions about Joining Band

Should my child already know how to read music or be able to play an instrument?

No. We start with the very basics of music. The first couple of weeks of school will be spent learning to read notes and rhythms.

Is band a regular class?

Yes. Band classes meet every day during school and students receive a grade just as they would in a math class.

Are there after school practices for beginning band?

No. The only required band activities that happen outside of the school day are concerts in December and May. There are many students who play sports and participate in band.

How much nightly practice is required?

All band students are asked to practice at least 15 minutes per night (100 minutes a week). This is essential for reinforcing concepts that are taught in the classroom.

What instruments are available to play?

Students will have a choice of the following instruments: flute, clarinet, alto saxophone, French horn, trumpet, trombone, euphonium, tuba & percussion. An instrument will be assigned based on how students are evaluated on their fitting and on "proper instrumentation." There isn't a band in this world that sounds good with 45 flutes, 3 clarinets, 1 trumpet, and 2 trombones.

How does my child choose an instrument to play?

Instrument try outs will happen in band class in August. Students will get to choose either their first, second, and third choice.

Should I get an instrument now?

NO! Students should only sign-up for band at this time. The assigning and renting of instruments will happen in August.

Will Schley County Middle School provide my child with an instrument?

Unfortunately, no. Most students will rent or purchase an instrument through a local music store. Schley County Middle does own a limited number of instruments that can be used if there is a financial need. Rental information from music stores will be provided when instrument auditions happen in August. If there is ever a financial need, please let Mrs. Gilpin know.
