SUMMER PAID INTERNSHIP PROGRAM: HIGH SCHOOL

PEÑASCO HIGH SCHOOL AWARDED COMMUNITY SCHOOLS PLANNING GRANT

PISD has been awarded a \$50,000 Community Schools Planning Grant for the 21-22 school year. This grant's focus is on career and vocational education and will fund a part-time Community Schools. It will also allow Peñasco High School to apply for a \$150,000 Implementation Grant for the 22-23 school year.

MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

When I started the district had a low cash balance and experienced budget cuts to state operational funds. I made it a priority to seek and receive additional grant funds to improve education and student support services.

I placed an on emphasis on the needs of the whole child. Social and Emotional Curriculum professional development was provided to educators. Additional student support services are now available to PISD students through the expansion of existing partners such as El Centro Family Health and the Nurturing Center and by forging relationships with new partners such as Taos Behavioral Health. Parental Involvement and shared leadership has also increased. The Community Schools Planning grant made this possible.

Collaboration and planning opportunities with the Picuris Pueblo Education Committee has increased from 2-3 meetings annually to monthly meetings. Grant funds have also increased. As a result we have added positions that support Indian Education, Student and Family Engagement, and in SY 21-22, the Tiwa Language Program.

I worked hard to improve the district and I have succeeded. I hope these improvements will serve the basis for better things to come now and in the future!

INCREASED CASH BALANCE TO 11 MILLION

When I started the cash balance was about \$330,000.

I made it a priority to improve the cash balance of the district to improve education and to have reserves in case of emergencies.

Two years later I am leaving the district with a cash balance of over 1.1 million dollars.





OVER \$480.000 IN GRANT FUNDS

PISD has been awarded additional funds through competitive grants to provide the Community Schools program, afterschool, tutoring, integrated student support services, computer science programming, college and career readiness, attendance incentives, and community based leadership opportunities.

CHROMEBOOKS FOR ALL STUDENTS
