BFA Summer 2021 Ramp-Up Programs provide an opportunity for students to earn or recover credit in an experiential, engaging, 25-hour, in-person course. Breakfast and Lunch will be provided.

In-Person Ramp Up Sessions, 25 hour, one week course. Students can choose to attend one or all of the sessions: 10:00 AM-3:00 PM

25 hour summer courses for credit

Students must attend all days and demonstrate proficiency to earn credit.

Programs start at 10:00 AM to allow for students who take VHS or Plato courses to receive their morning tutoring from 8:00–10:00 AM.

"Recovery Only"

means that credit will only be earned toward a course that needs to be recovered. For example, the student didn't pass English S2. They can take a recovery only class to earn the lost credit. The "Recovery Only" classes may **not** be taken for new credit.

They can be taken for enrichment if desired.

VHS/Plato online courses

VHS offers a multitude of summer online courses for credit. BFA will provide an in-person tutor to support students 2 hours a day throughout the summer. There is NO COST to the student to take VHS or Plato courses for credit recovery. **Meet with your counselor to see if this option is right for you.

Lake Champlain Basin Studies (Recovery Only)

If you enjoy being outside and learning about the natural world, then this course is for you! We will be learning about the watershed in Franklin County and how it supplies Lake Champlain, and St. Albans Bay in particular. Our focus will



be on the natural processes of streams, rivers, and lakes, as well as how human activities are influencing these processes. In particular, we will be looking at how agriculture, wastewater treatment, and storm water play an important role in the waterways of our region. Mornings will be spent in the classroom learning fundamentals about our watershed, and afternoons will be spent traveling to field sites to see and experience natural processes that we have studied. You can make-up credit in Earth Science, Biology, or Environmental Science or take it as an enrichment course.

2021 NOVUS Summer Program


European Tour
