

PERFORMANCE REPORTING SYSTEM REGULATION – CLASS RANK

The class rank procedure is calculated by adding the weighted grades of every high school level experience, and dividing by the number of equivalent experiences the learner has acquired during their time at an RSU #2 school.

Example: Learner Johnny Appleseed has the following course/experience grades:

<i>Course/Experience</i>	<i>Grade</i>	<i>Weighted Grade</i>
<i>Algebra II</i>	<i>3.53</i>	<i>3.53</i>
<i>Chemistry</i>	<i>3.84</i>	<i>4.32 (Honors core)</i>
<i>AP Government</i>	<i>3.53</i>	<i>4.4125 (AP)</i>
<i>EH 221 Intro to Lit (Thomas College)</i>	<i>3.11</i>	<i>3.8875 (college)</i>
<i>Hiking/Backpacking (half year)</i>	<i>3.92</i>	<i>3.92</i>
<i>Internship (Farming science)</i>	<i>3.25</i>	<i>3.25</i>
<i>Glass Art (half year)</i>	<i>4.00</i>	<i>4.00</i>

Johnny’s GPA would be $(3.53 + 4.32 + 4.4125 + 3.8875 + (3.92/2) + 3.25 + (4.00/2)) / 6$ (number of equivalent experiences) = 3.8933, rounded to 3.89.

Learners will have their class rank established by those experiences, including any dual enrollment/college courses, at an RSU #2 school only, although the courses from any sending schools will be on the transcript.

The learner will be ranked in the cohort in which they graduate. To be eligible for graduating cohort class rank before graduation, the learner must be enrolled at an RSU #2 school for at least three semesters.
