## Somerville ISD Dress Code

The District's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, minimize safety hazards, and to maintain a positive learning environment.

Students shall be dressed and groomed in a manner that is clean and neat, and that will not be a health or safety hazard to themselves or others. The District prohibits any clothing or grooming that, in the Principal's judgment, is not appropriate for school. The principal's determination shall be final. This list is the minimum requirement for dress regulations and does not address all possible situations.

If the principal and/or the principal's designee determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the school's dress code, the student will be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school and return to the classroom. If the problem cannot be corrected at school, the principal will work with the student and parent to obtain an acceptable change of clothing for the student in a way that minimizes the loss of instructional time. If the student refuses to comply with the dress code and correct the problem, the student may be placed in ISS for the remainder of the school day.

Repeated or severe offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.
