It is with profound sadness that I write this letter to our USD 407 Russell County community. At 10:22 AM, we lost one of our high school students, Andrew Boettcher, to injuries sustained approximately two weeks earlier.

Our sincere condolences and thoughts go out to his family and friends.

A student death is a difficult and challenging situation that can generate a high level of anxiety and distress in some students. During this time, as the school community processes the tragic news and copes with grief, we will offer counseling services to all of our high school students and staff. A team of counselors will provide support to any students or staff members in need throughout the upcoming days.

Your child may be affected by this tragedy even if he or she did not know the student. I encourage you to talk with your child about what has happened. Discussing thoughts and feelings about this situation is important in helping your child work through his or her grief. Below are two resources to help:
