School Cohorts participate in four sessions to receive coaching and targeted support in addition to cross district sharing of best practices and solving common problems of practice. Each school cohort receives on-site coaching and support. Cross district sharing is virtual.

Moving forward, a successful district must lead an agile and systemic improvement process in order to achieve stability and move towards sustainable improvement. Research points to three, key success factors which will be the focus of this collaborative:

- 1. District focused and site driven strategy for co-learning and co-leading of improvement efforts.
- 2. An external support model that helps to initiate improvement efforts and then transitions to internal capacity building as a culture of continuous improvement emerges.
- 3. Leadership capacity among district leaders, school principals and site teachers for sustaining and adapting improvment efforts to meet the evolving needs of all students.
