SCHOOL BUDGET PUBLIC HEARING GUIDE**

PUBLIC HEARING PART 1: PROPOSED SCHOOL BUDGET FOR FY 2021-2022

The School Board of the District has proposed a school operating budget for fiscal year 2021-2022. Pursuant to Order of the Governor, the budget meeting where these articles are presented has been replaced by a remote public hearing. The budget recommended by the School Board consists of the following Articles 1 through 14. Together, these articles constitute the proposed school operating budget for fiscal year 2021-2022 to be presented to the voters as Article 1 at a budget referendum election scheduled for June 8, 2021.

STATE SUBSIDY AND LOCAL TAX REVENUES FOR THE 2021-2022 SCHOOL BUDGET

ARTICLE 12: The School Board recommends that the District appropriate the amounts set forth below for the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act and raise and assess the amounts set forth below as each municipality's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15688.

State Mandated Explanation: The District's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act is the amount of money determined by state law

to be the minimum amount that the District must raise and assess in order to receive the full amount of state dollars.

ARTICLE 13: The School Board recommends that the District raise and appropriate **\$1,100,408.75** in additional local funds, which exceeds the State’s Essential Programs and Services allocation model by **\$1,040,408.75** as required to fund the budget recommended by the School Board.

The School Board gives the following reasons for exceeding the State’s Essential Programs and Services funding model by \$1,040,408.75: These funds are needed to pay for educational services not recognized by the Essential Programs and Services funding model, including providing smaller class sizes than are recognized by the EPS funding model and paying for transportation costs not recognized by the EPS funding model.

State Mandated Explanation: The additional local funds are those locally raised funds over and above the District’s local contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act and local amounts raised for the annual payment on non-state funded debt service that will help achieve the District budget for educational programs.

SUMMARY OF TOTAL 2021-2022 SCHOOL BUDGET

ARTICLE 14: The School Board recommends that the District authorize the School Board to expend **\$9,629,661.00** for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021 and ending June 30, 2022 from the District’s contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act, non-state-funded school construction projects, additional local funds for school purposes under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15690, unexpended balances, tuition receipts, state subsidy and other receipts for the support of schools.

PUBLIC HEARING PART 2: REFERENDUM ARTICLES

The following school budget and other questions will be submitted to referendum on June 8, 2021:

Article 1: School Budget. Shall Maine School Administrative District No. 37 appropriate the sum of **\$9,629,661.00** and raise the sum of **\$5,209,067.08** for the 2021-2022 school budget?
School Board Recommends a “Yes” Vote.

VOTER INFORMATION FOR ARTICLE 1

The Maine School Administrative District No. 37 school budget submitted in this Article 1 totals **\$9,629,661.00**. It includes locally raised funds in the amount of **\$5,209,067.08**, to be assessed in shares to member municipalities in accordance with the District’s cost sharing formula and state law. The locally raised amount exceeds the State’s Essential Programs and Services funding model by **\$1,040,408.75**. This budget includes these cost centers and amounts:

Article 2: District Adult Ed Program. Shall the District be authorized to appropriate **\$45,000** for adult education and raise **\$20,000** as the local share, with authorization to expend any additional, incidental, or miscellaneous receipts in the interest and for the well-being of the adult education program?

Article 3: Property, Repairs and Maintenance Reserve Fund. Shall the School Board be authorized to transfer up to **\$200,000** from available fund balances to the **Property, Repairs and Maintenance Reserve Fund**?

School Board Recommends a "Yes" Vote.

Article 4: Career and Technical Education Reserve Fund. Shall the School Board be authorized to transfer up to **\$100,000** from available fund balances to the **Career and Technical Education Reserve Fund**?

School Board Recommends a "Yes" Vote.
